

Advent a Season of Hope. The Beauty of the Sacrament of Reconciliation,

When we were baptism God gifted us with the three theological virtues of Faith, Hope and Charity. Hope is the virtue for the season of Advent. Hope is the gift to have the ability to continue to trust that God will be faithful to His promises, especially the promise of sending us a Messiah. The Messiah who is His only begotten Son. He will come and free us from sin and helps us enter His kingdom. He will give us the grace we need to overcome sin and live in the peace of Christ.

The Lord Jesus wants nothing more for us than the development of our full potential as a human being. In our faith to reach our fullest potential is to be transformed into another Christ. In effect that means becoming a saint. St. John Paul II wrote some 45 years ago in his first Encyclical, "The Redeemer of Man" that 'Christ reveals man to himself." In the person of Jesus Christ, we find who we are created to be and who we must strive to be to reach our fullest potential and ultimately attain salvation. St. John Paul II says that humans cannot live without love. In Christ we have the one who is love personified. He is love in the flesh. St. Thomas Aguinas defines live as always doing the best for the other as other. In love we do what will benefit the other person simply because they are a human being deserving of the utmost respect -even reverence.

To live in that manner, we must continually strive to rid our lives of any lingering selfishness. As I have preached on numerous occasions are lives can be lived in the "Ego drama" or the "God drama". The ego-drama is a life centered totally on self. A live closed in on self. In that kind of life there is only one thing that counts and that is me; I, me and myself, is my reference point for living and finding happiness. Unfortunately, this may only spiral one down a rabbit hole. It can easily lead to depression and frustration. When we strive to live in the God drama, we will live a life beyond ourselves. In the God-drama we are always reaching out and searching something beyond ourselves. It is living as Jesus asks us, "Give what has been given to you." It is living a life of love and reaching out. In this view of life and living our focus is on the other, first God and then our neighbor. A life lived in love is a life filled with trust in God and hope that God will always carry us through.

Surely one of the greatest gifts that God has given to us to rid our lives of selfishness is the continual use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). In that Sacrament we are given an encounter with the merciful God who will fill us with His life and strengthen us to live a life patterned after His Son who is the definition of love. Yes, confession may be a bit annoying and irksome, but the reward to our Spiritual life is beyond question. We leave the confessional with renewed hope and joy that bespeaks the love of God.

Praised be Jesus Christ now and forever.
