

A VERY MERRY CHRISTMAS TO ALL

As we bring this Advent to a close, if I should speak in those terms, for in reality, our whole lives are living an Advent so far, as we are preparing to meet the Lord at the end of our lives. Therefore, this Advent is kind of a miniature of the advent, which is our lives, that continues until we meet God face to face.

God. Who is this God that we are preparing to meet? He is defined by the Solemnity that we will celebrate in a few hours. He is a God who was not content to remain in the heavens distant from us. Yes, he comes as an innocent, dependent baby yet in that innocence we know there is the power to transform hearts and give all people the opportunity to be so much more than they thought they could be. He can transform hearts. His love is so great that when we embrace it our hearts are filled with his love, we are able to turn away from sin and evil and flourish in his life which is a life of holiness. In that holiness fulfill God's wish for all of us to be Holy as He is Holy.
