

Epiphany-manifestation

This is one of the greatest feasts in the life of the Church. I hope all of us have kept our Christmas Decorations up until after this Feast. We need to enter fully into this time of great celebration of God the sending His beloved Son to earth for our salvation. This is the day we add the three kings to the Crib. More and more of our Catholic people are leaving their manger scene and Christmas decorations up longer – even recalling the old tradition of leaving the tree and manger scene up until February 2- the feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the temple, traditionally called Candle **Mass Dav**

Today Jesus is manifested to all the nations as the Lord and savior for all people. He is the one who God has chosen to bring all people to him. This God/man is he who bears within himself the Kingdom of God. We enter that kingdom when we reach out like the magi and accept his invitation to be His Disciple. Here we see so clearly that salvation is centered on the person of Jesus. It is by following a God who comes to meet us that we find that true authentic life He has created us to know here on earth and its fullness in heaven. In the account of the magi, when they enter before the Lord, they adore and open their hearts to this babe in the straw who calls us to strive for a life of perfection sacrificing ourselves for the good of all.
