

### A Message From Fr. Mateus

The prince of the Apostles asked Jesus how many times we should forgive those who offend us. Peter himself suggests an answer, already quite generous in itself: "Seven times?" But Christ, who does not allow himself to be overcome in generosity, goes much further than this: "I do not tell you seven times, but seventy times seven", and, to explain it, Jesus tells a parable about the Father's Kingdom: God is like a compassionate king who forgives even the

most extravagant debts of his servants. Unfortunately, we, who are the servants of that Kingdom, although we are willing to ask for forgiveness for the huge amount we owe, on the other hand, we are not willing to forgive what our neighbors owe us. And it is because of this that the forgiveness we ask for is not sincere at heart.

Is it possible to be truly repentant, if we ask forgiveness for only *some* sins? In fact, we pray to God to be forgiving of our lies, to understand the weakness of our betrayals, to reiterate our falls, to forgive us for our excessiveness; however, if we do not forgive those who offend us, it is because we are not sorry for our pride, which is the root of all these other sins. Now, if we do not reject the root, it is because the tree and the fruits still please us. And if before God we pose the humble, but before others we are implacable; if we want to live in forgiveness, but we refuse to forgive others, what kind of fruit do we hope to reap, if not what we reserve for our neighbors?

Let us remember that with the same measure with which we measure, we will be measured (cf. Lk 6:38), and that if we do not forgive others, neither our heavenly Father will forgive us (cf. Mt 6:15). Let us not dare to appear before him with the appearance of a penitent, but with a hidden divided heart, hoping that in Christ's most just judgment two weights and two measures will apply: for me, mercy and forgiveness; for others, sentence and punishment. Once again, let us seek with contrite heart the sacrament of Penance, where divine forgiveness is given to us without fail, which the Lord does not deny to the willing; and, in order to be able to avail ourselves of this gift of mercy, let us already forgive in our hearts those who offend us, not seven, but seventy times seven, and as many times as necessary.






