

### **Third Sunday of Easter**

April 23.2023
REMAIN WITH US LORD



At the heart of this third Sunday in the Easter Season is our reflection on the story of the bewildered disciples on the road to Emmaus. As they make they way, "conversing and debating" about all that had happened, the Lord comes to walk with them, "but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him."

Then the Lord (they still don't know it is he) interprets how his Passion, Death and Resurrection are the fulfillment of the Scriptures. He acts as if he is going on, but they insist that he stay with them: "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over," they tell him. So he goes inside and sits at table with them.

It is at this point that the story takes a very particular turn, as the Lord "took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them." Recall how these are the same words used by Saint Paul and the synoptic evangelists to describe the actions of the Lord at the Last Supper. In effect, it is the Eucharist which is being celebrated, at which "their eyes were opened and they recognized him."

The story of the Road to Emmaus, then, demonstrates the faith of the early Church in Christ's real presence under the form of bread and wine, consecrated by his own hands through the action of the priest at every Mass. While human eyes perceive only bread, the eyes of faith are opened and recognize the Lord in the Breaking of the Bread.

It is that faith which is so beautifully expressed in a famous hymn of Saint Thomas Aquinas: "On the night of that Last Supper, seated with His chosen band, he the Pascal victim eating, first fulfills the Law's command; then as Food to His Apostles gives Himself with His own hand."5
