



Last week I took a few days off to visit Texas with a priest friend. We returned to many of my favorite places in East Texas and thoroughly enjoyed our first real vacation since the pandemic began.



Of course, each day you were in my thoughts and prayers, especially as we prepare to renew and restore our beautiful Church. If, however, Saint Cecilia's is one of New England's largest churches, we spent a day visiting some of Texas' smallest churches in search of inspiration for the painting of Saint Cecilia's interior.

Many of the "painted churches of Texas" were built by German and

Czech immigrants around the same time that our Acadian progenitors were building their masterpiece on French Hill. Like our ancestors, they chose a Gothic Revival style.

The interiors of these churches, however, is what makes they so remarkable. As soon as you walk in you are met with an explosion of colors, from painted landscapes, geometric designs and often stars in the vault above your head. These paintings were done by farmers and their families at night, after working long days clearing the remote prairies between Houston and San Antonio, under the direction of skilled craftsmen from the "old country." There is a simplicity and an honesty to the work that is deeply moving.



Outside of each of these churches there is always a cemetery. For the life of these hardworking pioneers revolved around the Church, just as they would rest right outside the front door, awaiting their rewards when the Lord returns in glory.

In so many ways, these Texan Catholics are so different from you and I. But in so many ways they are distinctly the same. Seeking to build God's Kingdom here on earth, as a reflection of what we hope to enjoy forever in Heaven.

A MASS FOR HEALING AT SAINT CECILIA'S CHURCH


ON SATURDAY, MAY 20th, the 9:00am Mass will be celebrated for the intentions of everyone who is sick. After the Mass, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be given to those who are elderly or who have a serious illness.

What is the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick?

When the priest anoints the sick person with the Oil of the Sick blessed by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass, he prays that "through this holy anointing, may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord, who frees you from your sins, save you and raise you up." The Sacrament unites us to Christ's Passion, strengthens us to endure suffering, forgives our sins, restores our health if it's conducive for our salvation, and prepares us to enter eternal life.

Who can be anointed?

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is for any Baptized Catholic who is suffering from a grave illness which could, even remotely, end in death. It is not intended for those with a cold or a mild illness. Those who are elderly, by definition, may always be anointed.

THE PASCHAL MYSTERY AT WORK IN US



God chooses us and gathers us to the Cross of his Son at every Mass. Us! Of all the people in the world: the ones so much brighter than us, so much better looking than us, so much more powerful than us...He chose **us** "before the world began, ... to be holy and blameless in his sight." It was not we who chose him, but he who chose us.

The Mass is for us poor little ones who have been baptized into his paschal death and rising. For we have washed our robes in the Blood of the Lamb and have become whiter than snow.² Thus we have, in Baptism, been consecrated as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people claimed by God as his own."³ to join the sacrifices of our lives to the one perfect Sacrifice of Christ upon the Cross.

By the Holy Eucharist, this priestly people are joined to Christ's Holy and Living Sacrifice and gain eternal life. Thus those who are "imbued with heavenly mysteries...pass from former ways to newness of life." The saving passion, death and resurrection of Christ are thus accomplished in us, and lead us to eternal life. This is why the priest invites us to receive Holy Communion with the words "blessed are those who are called to the Supper of the Lamb," for the destiny of all who eat his Body and drink his Blood is the Paschal Banquet of which the Book of Revelation speaks:

A voice coming from the throne said: "Praise our God, all you his servants, [and] you who revere him, small and great." Then I heard something like the sound of a great multitude or the sound of rushing water or mighty peals of thunder, as they said: "Alleluia! The Lord has established his reign, [our] God, the almighty. Let us rejoice and be glad and give him glory. For the wedding day of the Lamb has come, his bride has made herself ready. She was allowed to wear a bright, clean linen garment." (The linen represents the righteous deeds of the holy ones.)

Then the angel said to me, "Write this: Blessed are those who have been called to the wedding feast of the Lamb." And he said to me, "These words are true; they come from God." I fell at his feet to worship him. But he said to me, "Don't! I am a fellow servant of yours and of your brothers who bear witness to Jesus. Worship God. Witness to Jesus is the spirit of prophecy."
