WITH THE HELP OF SAINT CECILIA PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

Dear brothers and sisters,

At the conclusion of my pilgrimage to the Archdiocese of Moncton for the solemnity of the Assumption, patronal feast of Acadia, I am filled with gratitude for this deeply spiritual and rewarding time. The cover of this week's bulletin shows the shrine of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary at the Moncton Cathedral.

On Friday, after praying for your intentions in more than twenty parishes, I gathered with parishioners and friends of Saint Cecilia's for a Mass at the Cathedral. This week's column is the homily I preached at that Mass.

I came to Acadia this past week as a pilgrim, praying for the forebears of the flock I have been sent to shepherd on French Hill in Leominster. And I made this pilgrimage because we are, you and I, people of the exile. Exiles not just from forests primeval, scattered like dust and leaves at the whim of powerful men, but exiles from Eden, wandering through all the valleys of tears which the earth has to offer.

I think of the orphaned teenager Alfred Bessette, who took the train to New England 160 years ago, and for the next three years wandered from state to state in search of work. We are told that he would spend days alone in his room in prayer, longing for God to show him the way home. Years later, he became the little old doorkeeper who worked miracles, and I suspect he must have remembered those lonely nights in New England, thanking the God who had led him home to Mount Saint Joseph, where he was supposed to be.


I think of so many people who fled the shores of Acadia a hundred years and more ago, sometimes with nothing but the tattered clothes on their back. Those same people who built one of the largest churches in New England in the depths of the depression and whose faith thrives in their children and their grandchildren. Their love of this land perdures, as does their gratitude to God that he has led them out of exile to where he wanted them to be.

And I think of your patron, our Lady of the Assumption, fleeing into Egypt with a newborn child and an elderly husband, afraid that the powers that be might take it all away. This most blessed among women knew well the aching heart of the exile. But she knew too that the Son she had carried in her womb would lead us all home, to a place that no one could ever take from us again.

For we are each a people of the exile, children of those who wept in the land of Canaan, the sands of Egypt and the waters of Babylon. And sometimes we too feel tears streaming from our hearts, when the uncertainties of life cut so deeply or our sins blanket us with despair, that our minds just can't make any sense of it anymore...We know what it's like to feel like exiles from God.

But always remember the secret of the exile: God's mercies are never spent and his faithfulness endures forever. If we cling to the "affection that hopes, endures, and is patient," then some day we will return to God's paradise in heaven, a city set on a hill where there is no more pain or suffering or crying out, but a place of refreshment, light and peace, where we will sing with the angels before the beauteous radiance of God's glory.

And I imagine that on that day, we'll probably think we're dreaming, for the one whose mercy endures forever, will have come to take us home, we sons and daughters of Acadie, we unemployed orphans, and sinners with quivering hearts. But be glad and rejoice, my brothers and sisters, "for the Kingdom of heaven belongs to just such as these."



THE HOLY SPIRIT IN THE BIBLE



Christian belief in the Holy Spirit as the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity was not officially defined by the Church until the fourth century. But centuries earlier, the Hebrew Scriptures and the New Testament were already describing the action and presence of God's Spirit. In this study we will explore the activity of the Spirit at creation, within Israel, and the ministry of Jesus and the early Church.
