Dear brothers and sisters,

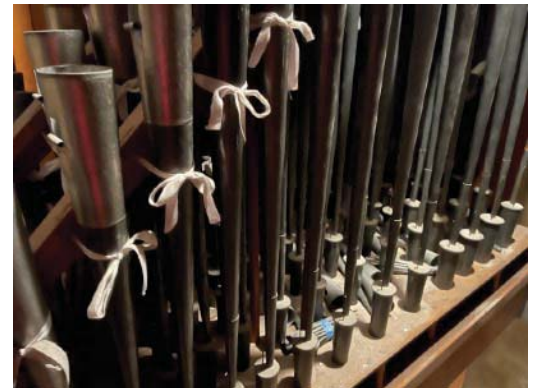
Last weekend, we were all sad to bid farewell to the Connor family, and particularly to Deacon Bob Connor. He will be with us at Masses this weekend for the last time.

Many of you have asked whether we will be getting a new Deacon in the near future. As I am sure you appreciate, the pastoral staff of each parish is one of the most important decisions the Bishop makes. For this reason, I will be consulting closely with Bishop McManus in the coming weeks and months and will eventually share his decision with you.

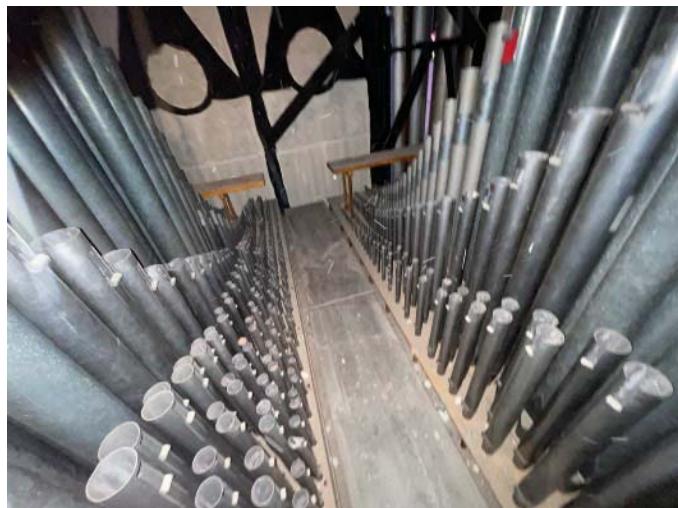
In the meantime, join me in praying that we get a new deacon(s) half as good as the one we have been blessed with up to now!

A couple weeks ago, we were grateful for a visit from the good folks at Casavant Organ Builders in Saint Hyacinthe, Quebec. As you know, Casavant Organ Builders, founded in 1860, completed our organ (opus 1477) in 1933. Its' 4,412 pipes proclaim the glory of God in such a wonderful way, especially at the command of our own resident maestro, David Lasky!

This is the first time in recent memory that Casavant Organ, in the person of expert craftsmen Dany Wiseman and Alain Couture, have done a thorough study of the condition of our instrument.



While they were here, they shared with me a note from their archives in which was recorded a visit by Father Chicoine on 9 June 1932 to their factory in Saint Hyacinthe. The pastor of Saint Cecilia's reported that "the construction of his new church is progressing quite well, and that he believes that next September will be a good time to send someone to take measurements, in order to submit a proposal to him for an organ."



In the coming weeks, I will share with you more of what we have discovered from those early archives as we await a report on ways to continue to preserve this great instrument, which this year celebrates its ninetieth birthday!

Finally a brief note on receiving Holy Communion at Mass. When Christ calls us together to celebrate the Eucharist, we do so not just as individuals, but as his holy people, a royal priesthood by virtue of our Baptism.

In order to express and foster the unity of our gathered liturgical assembly, we worship with common rites, prayer and even postures, which express and foster “the unity of the members of the Christian community gathered for the sacred Liturgy” (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, no. 42). For this reason, the law of the Church assigns to the Bishops’ Conference of each country the determination of when we are to sit, stand or kneel.

The Bishops of the United States have determined that the norm for the posture for receiving Holy Communion is standing, “unless an individual member of the faithful wishes to receive Communion while kneeling” (GIRM, no. 160).

Similarly, the choice to receive Holy Communion in the hand or on the tongue is up to each individual communicant.

In order to assist those who wish to receive Holy Communion kneeling, we have moved two sections of the short railings closer to the center aisle, where Holy Communion is regularly distributed. While the norm for receiving Holy Communion remains a standing posture, anyone wishing to receive Holy Communion kneeling may either kneel in the aisle or use one these railings.

I pray you will enjoy the changing leaves and beautiful Fall weather this week. I am reminded of an old favorite poem. *Autumn*, by Emily Dickenson:

The morns are meeker than they were,	The maple wears a gayer scarf,
The nuts are getting brown;	The field a scarlet gown.
The berry's cheek is plumper,	Lest I should be old-fashioned,
The rose is out of town.	I'll put a trinket on.

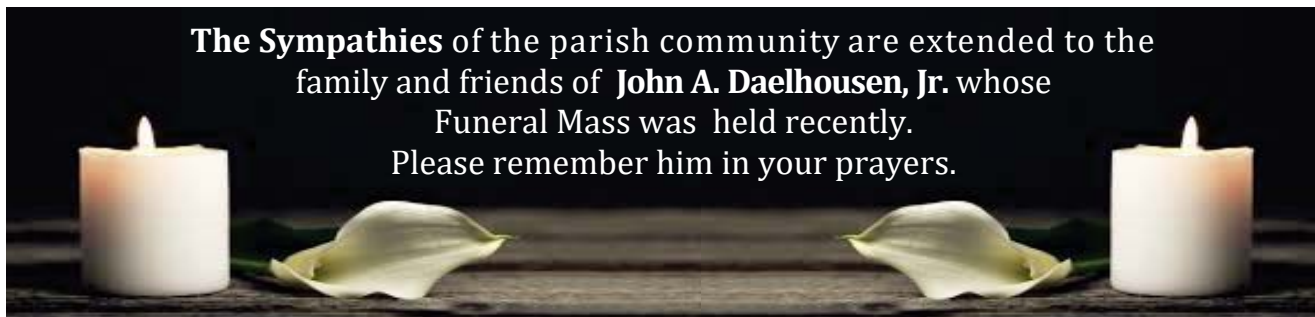

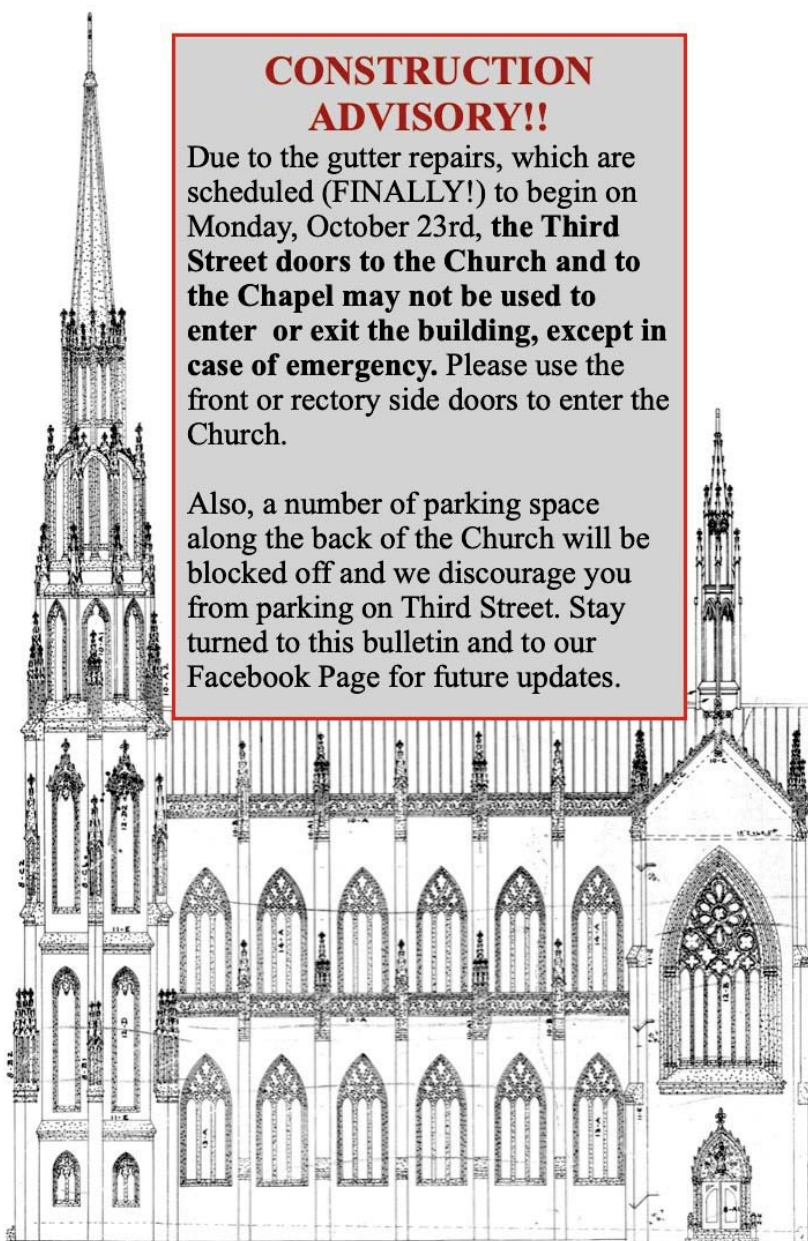

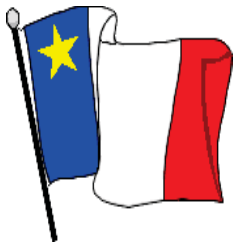
Tags from The Guild of St. Agnes for pre-school children as well as tags for the Diocesan seminarians will also be on our parish tree.

Pharisees and Phylacteries

The "Picture to Finish" depicts Jesus showing a coin to the Pharisees.

The Pharisees have little boxes strapped to their foreheads. These little boxes were worn by devout Jewish men on their foreheads, and also on their left arms, at certain times. The boxes were called "phylacteries" and also "tefillin." They were made of leather, and contained strips of parchment with verses from the Bible written upon them.

The verses were: verses 4-9 of Deuteronomy, Chapter 6; verses 13-21 of Deuteronomy, Chapter 11; and verses 1-16 of Exodus, Chapter 13.
