WITH THE HELP OF SAINT CECILIA PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

Dear brothers and sisters,

The origins of the text are obscure at best, but from the late Middle Ages it is a favorite of composers, perhaps because of its deep spiritual meaning:

Thou shalt know him when he comes, not by any din of drums, nor his manners, nor his airs, nor by anything he wears.

Thou shalt know him when he comes, not by his crown or by his gown. But his coming known shall be, by the holy harmony which his coming makes in thee.

Appropriately, in this Advent Season, it speaks of the coming of the Lord Jesus in glory. Many Medieval texts reflect on how to recognize the Lord when he comes to judge the living and the dead. All Jesus tells us is that he will be coming on a cloud from the East. So how will we know what he looks like? How will we know that it is him?

It is the question which gave rise to the practice of painting an image of Jesus on the inside lid of your coffin so that when you awake for the last judgement you will have a last minute reminder of what your judge looks like! It is the question we ask every day, as reflected by the Psalmist: "Who is the King of Glory?" (Psalm 24:8).

Jesus answers that question and invites us to encounter him in the Sacraments. In the Sacrament of Penance we can hear the judge forgive our sins. All we need to do is be sorry and go to confession. In the Holy Eucharist we can receive the Body and Blood of the one who will come at the end of time, resting assured that he who eats the flesh of the Son of Man and drinks his blood will have life eternal and the Lord will raise him up on the last day (cf. John 6:54).

Jesus answers the question again by telling us that we can meet him in the hungry, the naked, the ill and the poor and that whatever we do for them we do for him. (Cf. Matthew 25: 31-46).

When we find him in the Sacraments or in those who need us we will recognize him as the Good Shepherd who comes to save lost sheep, calls the weary and burdened to rest in his gentle and humble heart. (Cf. Matthew 11: 28-30). For, as the ancient poem portends: "his presence known shall be by the holy harmony which his coming makes in thee."



WHAT'S UP WITH ALL THOSE LIFTS OUT THERE?



With the help of MJE Engineering and Cole Construction, the gutters of Saint Cecilia's Church are being entirely replaced.

Masonry is being repaired, new drains with screens are being installed and state of the art materials are being used to line the entire gutter system.

Next spring, all secondary roofs will be entirely replaced and the East Tower (the tallest one) will be restored, with special attention to roofing, concrete, masonry and window integrity.

This is the first of several phases envisioned for the complete restoration of the exterior of Saint Cecilia's Church.

Once this first phase is completed in the first half of 2024, the building will be water-tight, and restoration of the interior of the Church will begin





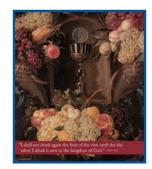
