# WITH THE HELP OF SAINT CECILIA PASTORAL REFLECTIONS

Dear brothers and sisters,

Good news! We have a new Patron Saint to look over us! Sister Marie-Léonie Paradis has been approved for canonization by Pope Francis!

Saint Marie was born outside Montreal in 1840 and joined the convent as a teenager. At the age of 24 she was assigned to Saint Joseph's College in Memramcook, where she founded the Little Sisters of the Holy Family, whose ministry was in support of the College and of priests throughout Canada.




When Pope Saint John Paul II beatified Saint Marie during his pastoral visit to Canada in 1984, he recalled how she joined so many other Canadian saints as our patrons, from the North American Martyrs, Saints Marguerite Bourgeoys, Kateri Tekakwitha, Mother Marguerite d'Youville, André Grasset, Mother Marie-Rose Durocher and our beloved Brother André Bessette. On that day he said of her:

This woman from your home, humble among the humble, is taking rank today among those whom God has raised to glory, and I am happy that such beatification is taking place for the first time in Canada, which was her country.

Born of simple, poor and virtuous parents, she very quickly grasped the beauty of religious life and committed herself to it with her wishes, among the Marianist Sisters of Sainte-Croix. She has never questioned this gift to God, even in the midst of the trials of community life in New York and Indiana. And when she was appointed to serve in Saint Joseph College in Memramcook, Acadia, her life as a nun was so radiant that she spontaneously grouped around her young girls who also wanted to devote their lives to God. With them, and thanks to the understanding of Monsignor Laroque, Bishop of Sherbrooke, she founded the congregation of the Little Sisters of the Holy Family, always flourishing and so appreciated.



Without ever doubting her call, she often asked: "Lord, show me your ways", to know the concrete form of her service in the Church. She found and offered her spiritual daughters a special commitment: the service of education houses, the seminary service, priests' houses. She was not afraid of the various forms of manual work that is the lot of so many people today, which has been honored in the Holy Family, in the very life of Jesus in Nazareth. This is where she saw God's will on her life. It was by completing these tasks that she found God. With the sacrifices inherent in this work, but offered out of love, she experienced deep joy and peace there. She knew that she joined the land-right attitude of Christ, "come not to be served but to serve". She was all penetrated by the greatness of the Eucharist, and the greatness of the priesthood in the service of the Eucharist: this is one of the secrets of her spiritual motivations.

Yes, God laid his eyes on the holiness of his humble servant, Marie-Léonie, who was inspired by Mary's availability. And from now on her Congregation and the Church will say it, from age to age, blessed (Luke. 1, 84). Saint and Sister Marie-Léonie Paradis, pray for us!







We have worked up a new hymn for Lent, which we invite you to sing over the next five weeks. We will also be singing the old favorite, *Quietly, Peacefully*.


