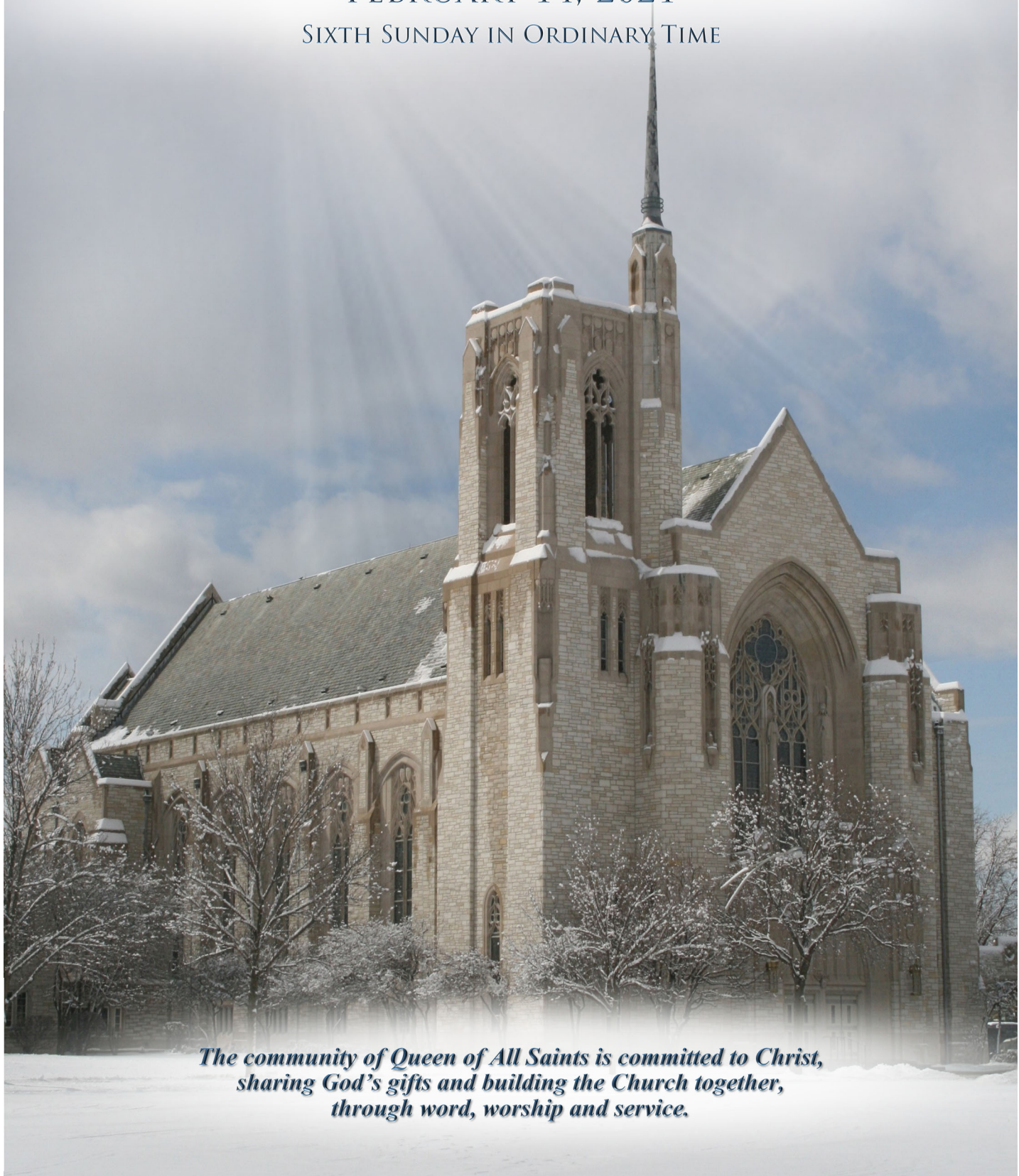

FROM FATHER SIMON



Quarantine is a word that has found extensive use in our vocabulary over the past year. Most of us think of quarantine to be a confinement to a space and as the name for the room or the building in which such a confinement takes place. For me it was my room in the early days of October 2020. For those of you who have a long history in the neighborhood, you will remember the Municipal Tuberculosis Sanatorium, for others of a later generation it is now the North Park Village Nature Center. This was a place where people were quarantined for extended periods of time to battle the rage of tuberculosis in the early part of the last century.

Yet, *quarantine* refers to a duration, a number of days. It comes from the Italian expression *quaranta giorni*—that is, a period of forty days during which any ship sailing to Venice had to remain moored away from the city's port as a precaution against the plague. In fact, the *quaranta giorni* spent in Venice borrows its name from the forty days of Lent.

Our *forty days of Lent* is rooted in certain biblical narratives that were a time of preparation for an encounter with the divine. Moses spent forty days and forty nights fasting as he wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant – the ten commandments. Elijah traveled forty days and forty nights until he reached the mountain of God and Jesus fasted and prayed in the desert for forty days and forty nights before he began his public ministry.

During this Lenten season – our quarantine, we are invited to embrace the disciplines of fasting, almsgiving and prayer. Let us detach from habits that distract and indulge in activities that help us cultivate and grow in our faith. May we also learn to extend ourselves generously to others not only with the material resources with which we are blessed but also through the gifts of understanding, mercy and compassion. Finally, as we detach ourselves from 'worldly' distractions, let us unite ourselves to God through prayer. The Parish Pastoral Council has put together a calendar that can help us quarantine with various activities to prepare us to celebrate the joy of Easter.

Last week we launched our United Parish Program, scheduled for May 14, with the sale of our raffle tickets. In a few weeks you will receive an invitation to the event. Due to the reality of the pandemic and its effects, it is highly unlikely that we will be able to gather under a majestic white tent on a sprawling green field to...

- celebrate the spirit of community that binds us as one,
- to give thanks to God for bringing us together as family,
- to remember and thank God for all the generous benefactors who have sustained this great parish in the past and who continue to support it in the present, and finally
- to raise funds to support the many ministries and activities of the parish that are essential to our vitality, now, and into the future.

The good news is that our UPP Chairpersons Juan Cabrales, Barbara Graham, Cariane Keane and Louise Locke, joined by the co-chairs Carolyn Carini and Christina Purtell, are working on

ways we can achieve our goals - building community and raising funds. As they work on putting the final touches on their plans which will be revealed at the end of this month, I want to remind you that the UPP is our *one and only* fundraiser. It aims to bring together the many and varied organizations in the parish to work as one toward a common goal, that is to build up the Body of Christ and care for and support the sacramental, educational and ministerial needs of the parish community. To reach these goals it is vital that every parishioner participates in this united endeavor.

I appeal to every family in the parish – and we have close to 3000 families – to participate in and support the UPP. In addition to buying a ticket, there are many other ways to do this. For example, you can be a sponsor, take out an advertisement in the event booklet, offer an item for auction, buy some raffle tickets or help one of the many committees preparing for the event. Our goal is to raise \$275,000 in order to be able to continue to support our parish activities. That's a lot of money, but we can do it with the help and support of every single family in the parish. More than any other year, this year is especially important that you participate. To make it even easier, you can donate online.

I encourage you to be a part of the happenings at QAS.

Ash Wednesday: Masses - **6:30am, 8:30am*** and **2pm***
Prayer Service - **7:30pm**

Ashes will be distributed during the Masses and prayer service. In addition to these services, we will also have “Drive-Thru” ashes and “Ashes To Go.”

“Drive-Thru” Ashes: You can drive-up to receive ashes from 11:30am - 12:30 pm and from 4:30 - 5:30pm. Please line up on Sauganash Avenue facing west - towards the parking lot. Make a left onto Keene Avenue and approach the porte cochere from the south. Ashes will be sprinkled on the head under the porte cochere and then you may exit onto Sauganash Avenue. **Please do not go into the parking lot.**

“Ashes To Go”: We will also have packets of blessed ashes to bring home with you to those who are home-bound or unable to venture out.

Please note that following the protocols in place for the imposition of ashes during the pandemic, we will follow the preferred option recommended by the Archdiocese of Chicago - we will **sprinkle ashes on the head only.**

Parish Lenten Mission: Our Parish Lenten Mission ‘*Wandering Forward: A Lenten Mission after a Difficult Year*’ will be preached by Fr. Michael Rossmann, SJ on **February 22, 23 and 24 in the evenings at 7:30pm***. In addition, he will preach at all the Masses on the weekend of February 20 & 21.

Lenten Series: Our Adult Faith Formation office, along with the Parish Pastoral Council is offering a weekly reflection during this Lenten season. In keeping with the “wandering” theme of the mission, we will focus our talks on the Exodus persons and events. We suggest you watch the movie *The Ten Commandments* to familiarize yourself with the Exodus story.

Stations of the Cross will be prayed on Fridays of Lent at 4pm. We also have an audio recording of the stations on the parish website - qasparish.org, for you to listen and pray whenever you are able.

Confessions are heard every Saturday after the 8am Mass. Confessions will also be heard on **Monday, March 22 from 4 to 5pm and Monday, March 29 from 7 to 8pm.**

Lenten Regulations: All adults up to their 60th year are required to fast. According to Canon 97, #1, a person who has completed the 18th year is an adult. The day of fast during Lent is Ash Wednesday, February 17 and during the Triduum, Good Friday, April 2.

All persons 14 years of age or older are required to abstain from meat products on Fridays during Lent, as well as on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Meat and products including meat are not to be eaten.

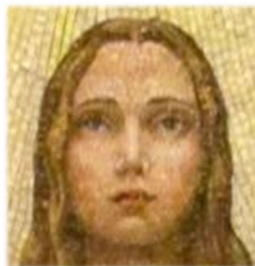

LENT

Let's start off this Lent not as a time to "give something up" but rather to "give something back" - **the gift of time to look inward to ourselves.**

Saint Ignatius of Loyola offered us these words of wisdom, which seem particularly relevant as we enter the season of Lent: **"He who goes about to reform the world must begin with himself, or he loses his labor."**

A Christian steward is by nature a reformer. **We attempt to live our lives in a way that makes the world a better place.** We vote. We contribute to charities that we believe in. We build up our parish so that we might shine the light of truth into our weary world.

We work to alleviate poverty and injustice. We await the New Jerusalem. Many of us work in areas or for organizations where we bring a passion for reforming our world. Christian stewards who work in other environments endeavor to bring our values into the workplace and the marketplace.

Lent doesn't ask us to stop any of these efforts. But, as we hear "the voice of one who cries in the desert" proclaiming the beginning of Lent, we know that the Church in her wisdom has given us a beautiful season to look inward, to seek quiet time in our own desert. Saint Ignatius, Saint John the Baptist and **the season of Lent reminds us that trying to change the world will not work, if we don't first of all change ourselves.**

TODAY'S READINGS

"Brothers and sisters, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God."
- I Corinthians 10:31

Do a quick check of your priorities. Where does God rank in that list? If he's not first, you have some work to do. Putting God first in everything helps us from putting other "gods," like our pride, ego, money and possessions, before God. Before making a decision, ask yourself, "Am I doing this for the glory of God or for the glory of me?"

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the sacrament of baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism. If it is not possible for you to come to the rectory, please call the rectory to make arrangements. The sacrament of baptism for infants is celebrated on Saturdays. Please call the rectory for the exact schedule. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. Please contact the rectory for further details. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the anointing of the sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.

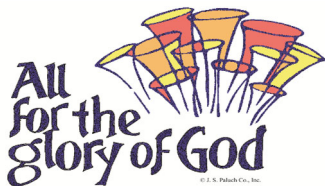

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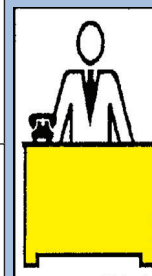
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
