Please note the following for Holy Week services:

1. Doors open 20 minutes before services and will be closed 10 minutes after the scheduled service begins. Reservations will be held only until 5 minutes after the service begins.
2. Please make reservations only for your immediate household. If your plans change after you have made a reservation, please cancel your reservation to allow others who are waiting to be added to the list.

If you do not have access to a computer, please call the rectory to make your Mass reservation or to receive more information.

MASS SIGN-UP

SIGNING UP FOR MASS QUEEN OF ALL SAINTS

1. **PARISH WEBSITE** Go onto the parish website and click “Mass Reservation.” Then click on signup labeled “here.” Sign ups for the weekend are available every Wednesday.
2. **ACCESS CODE/PASSWORD** To sign up for a weekend Mass you will need to use an access code. The access code will be emailed each Wednesday before the weekend Masses.
3. **CHOOSING A MASS TIME** Look through the Mass times and check “sign up” under the Mass time you wish to attend, then select “submit and sign up” at the bottom of the page.
4. **MAKING A RESERVATION** To attend the Mass, enter the total number of people in your household that are attending in the “Quantity” box. You can put any special instructions or needs in the long white box. Please do not include people living outside of your household in your reservation. Add your first name, last name and email in the designated boxes and then click the “sign up now.” (see example below)
5. **CONGRATULATIONS** You have officially signed up to attend Mass. You will receive a reminder email two days before the date of your reservation.
6. **PLEASE NOTE** Weekday Masses no longer require a reservation. Your name and phone number will be taken at the door.

PARISH NEWS

LENTEN SCHEDULE

Stations of the Cross: Prayed on Fridays of Lent at 4pm. We also have a recording of the stations on the parish website - qasparish.org, for you to watch, listen and pray whenever you are able.

Confessions: Heard every Saturday after the 8am Mass. Confessions will also be heard on Monday, March 22 from 4 to 5pm and Monday, March 29 from 7 to 8pm.

Lenten Regulations: All adults up to their 60th year are required to fast. According to Canon 97, #1, a person who has completed the 18th year is an adult. The day of fast during Lent is Ash Wednesday and during the Triduum, Good Friday, April 2.

All persons 14 years of age or older are required to abstain from meat products on Fridays during Lent, as well as on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Meat and products including meat are not to be eaten these days.

RESERVATIONS FOR MASS

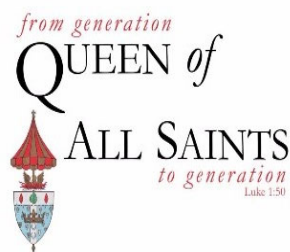
Our Mass attendance has been increasing. We encourage everyone to make a reservation so that you are guaranteed a seat. Those without reservations may have to wait to be seated or may be turned away if we are at capacity. Please note, reserved pews will held only until 5 minutes after Mass begins. After that time, those who are waiting will be seated. Doors close 10 minutes after Mass begins. If your plans change, please cancel your Mass reservation.

As required by the Illinois Department of Public Health and for contact tracing purposes, please notify the rectory if you test positive for COVID-19 within two weeks of attending a liturgical service in the basilica. Any and all personal information will be kept strictly confidential.

FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION - WE BEGIN OUR LAST PHASE

In 2016 our parish began the Capital Campaign *From Generation to Generation*. Thanks to your generosity we received over \$5.2 million in pledges. Many of those pledges are now complete. NOVENA TO SAN PEDRO CALUNGSOD, MAR 19-27

We will be having the Novena to San Pedro Calungsod virtually on Facebook live from March 19th through the 27th at 6pm.



Saint Pedro Calungsod is a young Roman Catholic Filipino, a migrant, sacristan and missionary catechist, who along with the Spanish Jesuit missionary Diego Luis de San Vitores, suffered religious persecution and martyrdom in Guam for their missionary work in 1672.

While in Guam, Calungsod preached Christianity to the Chamorro people through catechism, while baptizing infants, children and adults at the risk and expense of being persecuted and eventually murdered. Through Calungsod and San Vitores' missionary efforts, many native Chamorros converted to Roman Catholicism.

Calungsod was formally beatified on March 5, 2000 by Pope John Paul II. Calungsod was officially canonized by Pope Benedict XVI at Saint Peter's Basilica in Vatican City on October 21, 2012.

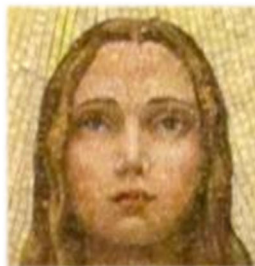

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS AS WE NEAR EASTER

We know that our Easter collection is one of our two largest special collections of the year, and is a necessary part of our ability to support the many ministries, liturgies and outreach that touch us throughout the year, even at a time like now when our normal parish life has been interrupted. The dedication of the people of Queen of All Saints to maintain our faith community in time of extreme challenge has always been a hallmark of our parish.

We know this has been one of the most difficult times in the lives of many of our parishioners, in their health, the health and lives of their loved ones and for their own financial security. We also know that the burdens of the pandemic have been unevenly felt, with some faring better than others.

As you look around the basilica this Easter we hope you appreciate the sacrifice made by those who came before us, who sat in the same pews we sit in today, to help build our parish and to set aside a cushion to help with emergencies, as we experienced in the last few years when faced with the urgent needs to replace our basilica ceiling and repair our bell tower.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Next weekend, many churches provide palms to be carried in the opening moments of the liturgy, as we gratefully recall Jesus' entry into the holy city of Jerusalem. The children who greeted him on that day used what was both handy and traditional, since palms were carried to inaugurate the joyful harvest feast of Succoth. To this day, faithful Jews are directed to take a beautiful palm branch, green and straight as possible, called a lulav, and bind it with three myrtle branches fifteen inches long, and two longer willow branches. At the end of the temple service, everyone carries the lulav, circling the sanctuary in a dance called the Hoshanot, singing hymns of joy.

In other climates, Jews and Christians alike have had to make accommodations over the years. In Italy, everyone carries olive branches today, often brought from their own garden. In England, forsythia branches are preferred, a relative of the olive, sign of peace. Germans prefer pussywillows, and others look for flowering spring branches. In our part of the world, what do you think would be the best choice to express joy and welcome, and to remind us of the joy of Christ's victory even as we prepare to commemorate his passion?

Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. 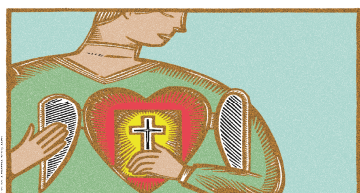

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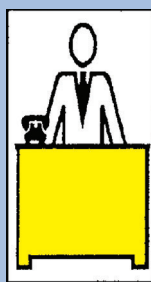
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
