FROM FATHER SIMON



We are the grateful beneficiaries of the generosity of those who came before us. In particular, we have a parish campus built to the highest forward-thinking standards when built during 1940 – 1960. But over time all buildings need refreshing and ours were no exception.

In 2014 Monsignor Pollard began to convene meetings among our parish councils and our major ministries to see what could be done for the Benedict Center, our former parish convent, a building which was both underused and deteriorating. Those discussions led to a growing consensus around a major capital project to completely renovate the Benedict Center into a modern early childhood education center, plus new space for our growing adult ministries. That led in turn to plans to reconfigure space in our Lemont and Keene buildings to renovate and make more efficient use of those buildings, again for the benefit of our school and adult ministries.

These plans were developed from within our parish, based on input from our parishioners and teachers who used those spaces and knew what we needed, and were then turned into practical and cost-effective solutions by architects and contractors with deep experience in retrofitting buildings such as ours.

Most of all, our plans depended on you – our faithful parishioners who gave us a strong vote of confidence in the future of our parish through their pledges of money to fund this ambitious goal. Our original pledge goal was \$5 million, designed to fund the majority of the anticipated cost, with the remainder to come from future parish revenue. We exceeded that target, with over \$5.2 million in pledges. Our parishioners have faithfully paid their pledges, whether one-time or over time, and we will continue to seek new pledges to cover all the costs of this wonderful project. Despite COVID we have made extensive use of our newly renovated spaces, to the delight of parishioners of all ages.

We now come to the end of Phase III of our project, the renovation of the former Rose Room in the basement of the Lemont Building and its full restoration to a Parish Center.

Let us celebrate the vision fully realized. I invite you to join your fellow parishioners on Sunday October 17 after the 9am Mass for a blessing and opening of the Parish Center. We will have the Parish Center open on that day following the blessing after Mass until 1:00 pm. This will allow those coming to the later Masses to come in either before or after Mass to enjoy this new space that will serve the many needs of our parish and school.

I look forward to your presence on this joyful day to thank God for his blessings and to thank one another for making this possible.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER SIMON

I am saddened to report on a vandalism incident in our school buildings last Saturday evening, September 25.

Around 9pm, three males and two females were observed on our security video after making a forced entry into the Keene Avenue building. Camera footage shows them taking down fire-extinguishers from the walls in the lower level of the building and discharging them in the hallways. They were then seen proceeding to the gym where they discharged another fire extinguisher. They then exited the building.

We immediately contacted the Chicago Police and filed the necessary report. Later, we provided the police with our security videos and other evidence that came into our possession. The police also recovered the fire extinguishers that had been used and tossed aside outside our parish campus. As is the case with any apparent intentional damage to parish property, I am obliged to notify the Legal Department of the Archdiocese of Chicago, and will be guided by their counsel and direction.

Principal Carlson and I received nothing but overwhelming support and assistance to clean up the mess and safely reopen our school, including about forty men from our parish who showed up that night with buckets and mops to be a part of the cleanup. It is a true witness of our love for our community and what it means to each one of us. We all take pride in everything we do and we will do all in our ability to protect our school and parish.

Finally, as the investigation and determination of consequences proceeds, we are reminded that accountability is a virtue that we teach our children from a young age. It is important not only for individuals to accept responsibility for their own actions, but also that all our young people know that actions have consequences and that doing the right thing is a lesson which is constantly being learned and relearned.

Thank you for your support in this difficult time. We will keep you advised of future developments.



Mosaic of Our Blessed Lady

Rising to the rear of the altar is a Venetian mosaic of our Blessed Lady as the Queen of All Saints. It is composed of more than thirty-three thousand pieces of glass and was executed at the Vatican galleries, according to an original drawing by Professor Lelio de Ranieri. Portrayed ascending out of a bank of clouds, she wears a cerulean blue cloak adorned with fleurs-de-lis. The title of the masterpiece is on a "scroll" of golden ribbon held by two life-size angels who stand beneath the mosaic - "Hail, Holy Queen."

The Sacrament of Baptism

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the sacrament of baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism, or visit our website for our baptism dates and the baptism registration form. The sacrament of baptism for infants is celebrated on Sundays. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. Please contact the rectory with any questions or for further details. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the anointing of the sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
