

### FROM FATHER SIMON



Last weekend, drawing inspiration from the Gospel, I highlighted the activities of our parish Outreach Commission. This weekend we hear the prophet Habakkuk lament to God: "Why do you let me see ruin; why must I look at misery? Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife and clamorous discord." A lot of people in the world today could make the same cry. Closer to home, the situation is not so drastic. Perhaps, in some ways, some have never had it so good.

Yet, as individuals, from time to time, the wrestle with God continues. "Why? Why me? And after all the effort I have made to be good!" The puzzled questioning often arises spontaneously in the minds of people diagnosed with a terminal illness and those who love them. The insistence of the questioning passes with time, but only because other agendas take center stage. For many, the question remains unanswered.

I think it is essential that we respect the deep questions of those confronted with suffering and death — whether it's their own or those in their care. In my limited experience of people dying, most people I have known have passed peacefully. Sometimes their peace may have been due to their loss of energy. Others see the grace of God at work. In my observation, one important factor is the presence around them of those who love them. The experience of being loved, respected, and treated as important is mysteriously comforting, reassuring, and a natural source of acceptance and peace.

Of the gifts of prayer and other assistance we may provide to the sick and the homebound, there is no greater and better gift than the gift of Christ himself. Our Ministers of Care bring the Eucharist to the sick and the homebound twice a month. If you are drawn to this ministry, please don't hesitate to contact Erika Tate, our Director of Faith Formation, to learn more about this ministry and the solace you will bring to those you serve.

**On a personal note:** Every five years, priests in the Archdiocese of Chicago go through a review process to help us become better priests and pastoral ministers. For more information about this process, please see the letter from Bishop Bartosic on the next page. My last review was in 2016, when I was an associate. The results from that survey helped me grow as a person and minister. Since then, my role has changed, and my responsibilities have expanded.

Your pastor, Fr. Braganza, will soon be participating in the Catholic Leadership 360 Review process. This review process is part of the ordinary structure required by Archdiocesan Policy of every diocesan priest approximately every five years. It is an opportunity for Fr. Braganza to recognize his talents and to grow to become a better priest and pastoral minister. Selected members of the parish staff and parish leadership, your Dean, and myself will be asked to be reviewers using this instrument.

According to Archdiocesan policies lay leadership and parishioners are to be given the opportunity to recognize Fr. Braganza's gifts and to share their sentiments about his ministry. So, we are providing a parishwide survey as part of his review process. The survey can be easily accessed by going to the Archdiocese's web page (<a href="https://www.archchicago.org/">https://www.archchicago.org/</a>) and clicking on Offices and Ministries on the top panel. This will bring you to an alphabetical listing of offices. Under 'M', select Ministerial Resources for Parishes. You will then be directed to the Ministerial Resources for Parishes webpage. In the middle of the page, you will find "Parishwide survey review for priests". The survey is available in English, Spanish, and Polish. Please click on the word 'Link' next to your appropriate language to access the survey.





#### What is RCIA?

R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is a process whereby those interested in learning about the Catholic faith come together on a weekly basis to learn about the scriptures and the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church, and at the same time, to discover where God is present in their lives. A team of people from Queen of All Saints guides the entire RCIA journey. Each member has a sponsor that accompanies them. A sponsor can be provided if desired. The whole community prays for and with those who are preparing for initiation.

#### Is RCIA right for you?

- Are you thinking about becoming Catholic? Are you curious about Jesus Christ?
- Do you want to complete your Sacraments of Initiation (First Communion and/or confirmation)?
- Have you been away from the church for a while and are now thinking about returning?
- Were you baptized in another Christian denomination?
- Have you never been baptized?
- Do you want to join your children, spouse, partner, friends, and family members when they recieve communion?

RCIA is open to anyone interested and desiring to grow in a relationship with Jesus Christ. Whether you are baptized or not, Catholic or not, religious or not, all are invited to these sessions to learn more about Jesus and the Church.

Our parish is our family in faith, and like any good family we are called to be present for each other.

We support each other in our shared worship, in our shared prayers, and in our shared experiences.

Queen of All Saints rejoices in the incorporation of new members into the Body of Christ through the sacrament of baptism. If you are a registered parishioner, please come to the rectory during business hours to schedule your child's baptism, or visit our website for our baptism dates and the baptism registration form. The sacrament of baptism for infants is celebrated on Sundays. A baptismal preparation class for the parents is required. Please contact the rectory with any questions or for further details. If an adult or a school age child seeks baptism, special arrangements should be made with one of the priests.

### The Sacrament of Matrimony

Queen of All Saints helps couples prepare not only for their wedding day, but also for the lifelong commitment of living a Christian marriage. Parishioners of Queen of All Saints Basilica who are baptized and free to marry in the Catholic Church may celebrate their marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica. Couples from Queen of All Saints seeking marriage in Queen of All Saints Basilica should contact one of the parish priests at least six months prior to their intended date of marriage. The couple must meet with one of the priests before the date for the marriage can be confirmed.

### Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

The sacrament of the anointing of the sick is not just a sacrament for those who are at the point of death. As soon as one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him or her to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. Therefore, any member of the faithful who is seriously ill because of sickness or advanced age may properly receive this sacrament.
