## FROM FATHER SIMON



'A December to Remember' is a catchphrase in a commercial for a brand of cars. However, for us, November is 'A Month to Remember.'

November is special for us as Catholics. It is a month for us to remember who we are as a people and who we are as a church. On November 1, we come together to celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints – (*a holy day of obligation*), a day which honors the more obscure saints and the saints each of us has known. On November 2, we observe All Souls' Day – a day to remember all those who have gone before us. The church has always encouraged praying for the dead. We believe it is an act of Christian charity to pray for a loved one to erase any distance between us, even the chasm that death imposes. When we pray, we place ourselves in God's presence in the company of those we love, even if those persons have gone before us in death.

On the second Monday in November, we celebrate Veterans' Day. We remember and give thanks to and for those who defend our freedom. We pray for the veterans whose lives are scarred by the wounds of battle, those haunted by the experiences of combat, and those who need our help more than our praise and thanks.

We bring the month of November to a close with our celebration of Thanksgiving Day. We gather as a family, as a church, and as a nation. We remember and give thanks to a good and gracious God for all of the blessings that are ours. The Liturgy of Thanksgiving Day gives voice to the spirit of this time, a spirit we are called to make our own.

*"God our Father, from your hand, we have received generous gifts so that we might learn to share your blessings in gratitude. Accept the gifts we bring and let the perfect sacrifice of Jesus Christ draw us closer to all our brothers and sisters in the human family so that we may share with them all the gifts of time and eternity."*

It was on October 29, 1960, that our current worship space was consecrated. This weekend let us gratefully remember all those who worked hard to make this beautiful basilica a place worthy of our admiration, where we can gather in joyful praise to the Lord. It is appropriate that this weekend, we will also unveil the plaque, installed on the north wall of the vestibule by the porte-cochère door, to gratefully acknowledge and remember those who generously contributed to the Capital Campaign 'From Generation to Generation.' Through their contributions and the hard work of many, we completed the Benedict Center's comprehensive renovation and improvements to the Lemont and Keene buildings. We now have meeting rooms, a parish center, a new music room, a science lab, a staff lounge, a library, and other places to benefit our students and faculty.

From the perspective of a pastor and steward, please remember Queen of All Saints parish as you prepare to make your required minimum distribution from your IRA this year.

Celebrate, and remember that each of us is a unique person fashioned by a loving Creator who is but part of a larger communion of persons stretching back (and forth) in time. Please plan to participate in our special parish liturgies of remembrance and be a part of these celebrations at Queen of All Saints, during November, "A Month to Remember."

Asylum seekers - men, women and children - are arriving in Chicago. Will you welcome the stranger? We are the Body of Christ alive in this world. The stranger is hungry and thirsting - Christ is presenting himself to us in their need. We are called to respond with faith and love.



Thousands of people are fleeing violence, political oppression, and overwhelming poverty in Central and South American countries. Since early September, parishes, priests, religious sisters and brothers, church ministries, and Catholic Charities have shown an outpouring of concern for these travelers.

These brothers and sisters in need have revealed to us the fragility, strength, and sacredness of our shared humanity. In turn, they are experiencing the love of Christ through the compassion of volunteers and employees.

Over 3,000 asylum seekers arrived in Chicago by mid-October, and a coordinated Catholic response is underway so we can maximize our collective impact. We are providing pastoral care and considering options such as transitional shelter and parish-family sponsorship opportunities.

## MEET OUR NEW NEIGHBORS (PART VI)



A big thank you to Queen of All Saints for the generous donation to Building Peaceful Bridges. This donation will go directly to the families that live in our parish boundaries for rent assistance, which is a critical issue for refugee families.

Our new neighbors are extremely grateful for all the good wishes and donations that QAS parishioners have provided. They are still learning about life in the United States, in particular, Chicago, after less than a year in Chicago. The lives of refugees are unsettling, with concerns for those left behind in their former country, and concerns about their future living here. BPB representatives spoke to Senator Durbin's and Senator Duckworth's offices in support of the Afghan Adjustment Act, which would allow the newcomers to begin the citizenship process and relieve some of the uncertainty of their status. This Act would put the Afghan refugees on the same path as the newly arrived Ukrainian refugees.

For those who are interested, one of the educational programs that BPB sponsors is a refugee book club. Recently, Professor Wendy Pearlman of Northwestern University addressed our online participants about her book, *We Crossed a Bridge and it Trembled*. The recording of this informative discussion of stories from Syria is available on our website ([www.buildingpeacefulbridges.org](http://www.buildingpeacefulbridges.org)). BPB has also organized a junior refugee book club for young adults. The upcoming book is *The Night Diary*, written by Veera Iranandani. This book is available in e-format at the Chicago Public Library. For those who would like to assist the young refugees in their understanding and learn about the refugee experience, email [moira@buildingpeacefulbridges.org](mailto:moira@buildingpeacefulbridges.org).

Finally, a big ask is for a used car for the family. Basharmal passed his driving test and has his license, but the family does not have a car to allow them to go to the grocery store in the winter, or to go to doctor appointments. They have relied on public transportation but as we know, it is much more difficult in the winter to get around. Any donation of a used car would be fully tax deductible. ## QAS SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY



## *Women's Spiritual Spa Day* **Thursday, November 10th** **Spirituality of Aging** **By: Peggy Flynn**

Peggy will present some information and insights about what spirituality might be when we find ourselves in the *evening of life*. Opportunities? Challenges? She has stories to tell. Each of us has a story to tell. This is above all the time in our lives when God is calling us each by name.

Peggy Flynn works now as a spiritual director and geriatric care consultant. Her field of study has been focused on personality development in the second half of life. Originally from Chicago, she lived in California (1975-2014) before relocating to Milwaukee. Once back in the Midwest she studied at the Chicago Jung Institute and Loyola while learning again how to cope with winter.



She is the author of *The Caregiving Zone, A Unique Guide to the Realities of Illness, Aging, Dying and Death* (2006). The book was an outgrowth of the 15 years she worked in the HIV epidemic in San Francisco (1990-2005) along with the years of caring for her father. She has also published: *Death and Mourning, Logistics and Mystery* (book chapter, 2005); *Thinking About Dreams In the Second Half of Life* (paper, 2015); *Forgiving, Being Forgiven, Accountability* (paper, 2016); and *Transparent to Transcendence, a Spiritual Autobiography Workbook* (2021).


