

## **Empty Praise**

## ow could anyone think that the joyous cry "Hosanna!" would be viewed as empty praise?

Though the word has come down to us in the Greek Gospels, it probably has Hebrew roots as a form of the verb "to save" (see Psalm 118:25). Thus, it is more than an exuberant cry; it is a plea for salvation. How could this possibly be empty praise?

The answer to that question is found in human fickleness. So often we—not simply the people of Jerusalem, but we human beings—wholeheartedly offer someone our support, only to turn our backs on that person when the going gets tough. We know from experience how this works.

This is precisely what today's readings describe. The passage for the procession with palms describes an enthusiastic group of people showing Jesus great respect and crying out: "Hosanna!" Later, in the Gospel we hear, "Crucify him!" Were these the same people? Does it matter? Presumably these were people who were in Jerusalem to celebrate Passover, the feast of their deliverance from Egyptian bondage. Now they are caught in another oppressive political system—Roman occupation. Are these heartless people? Or are they like us: often afraid to take an unpopular stand lest we lose face or, even worse, suffer serious consequences? And so, Jesus stands alone before those who have planned to silence him. Might he have considered the earlier "Hosanna" empty praise? Probably not. Jesus does not hold our fickleness against us.



Dear Friends,

I hope this finds you all well. As we move towards the celebration of Easter, I wanted to reach out once again and thank all of you for all you are and do. We can see the light at the end of the tunnel, the light of the celebration of the Morning Star Jesus, and of an end to the pandemic. I am reminded daily of the gift of all of you to your communities – know you are loved, appreciated and celebrated.

Virtusonline.org has now provided a home page for anyone who has trained in the system. When you login, your home page will appear. It will also show to you if you are due to retrain.

Re. live scan the box marked in red indicates when a background check is missing. The link goes directly to our diocese safe environment website for a volunteer or employee's live scan form. Volunteers or workers need a live scan when their ministry interacts with vulnerable adults or minors. Once live scan is completed and cleared thru the box will read updated.

A report will also show volunteers and workers that are not fingerprinted. It is time for updates of volunteers and workers, including inactivate members who are no longer with the parish or school and any who have registered but never finished their training. Let us know if you have not completed your retraining. If you need help let us know or call. Volunteers or workers that indicate *Awaiting Approval* have not completed training. Completed trainings are updated daily. All volunteers or workers require background screening (live scan or Megan's Law) and trained on virtusonline.org within the last three years. **More news on children's training to come, we will be using only Virtus Children's Empowerment training moving forward, or the approved religion series that include SE material.** May these waning days of Lent bring you closer to the heart of Jesus.
