Why Is There Evil?

t some point in one's faith journey, every believer asks: If God is good and loving, why is there evil in the world? Why is there war? Why do children die prematurely? Why do pandemics rage? The biblical story of Job seeks to speak to that question, though it never really answers it.


God and the satan (the name he is called in the Book of Job) are discussing Job and what a fine man he is. The satan suggests Job is a good man only because everything is going well for him. God then tells the satan that he may do whatever he wishes to test Job but may not harm him. By a series of catastrophes, then, Job loses his flocks, his camels, and even his sons and daughters. It is at this point that we hear today's first Scripture reading—Job's lament of misery and hopelessness.

Though Job's friends suspect that the cause of all

that has befallen him must be due to some grave sin on his part, Job denies this accusation and continues believing in the goodness of God, never wavering in his faith. Though frustrated by what life has brought, Job never blames God or asks God to fix his life. God is God, concludes Job, whether we understand the ways of life or not. To seek any more is to seek to be God. He continues to trust in God and admits that the ways of God are incapable of being understood. This becomes Job's only answer to the question about the "why" of evil. **

Kneel after the Lamb of God

At Mass each diocese has the option for the assembly to either remain standing after the Lamb of God prayer (Agnus Dei) or to kneel. Many years ago, Bp. Cummins decided that his diocese would remain standing at that time. Bp. Barber now has decided that it would be more appropriate for the assemble to kneel after the Lamb of God. During that time the priest raises the newly consecrated bread and wine to show the people and says "Behold the Lamb of God ...". It seems particularly appropriate in this time of Eucharistic revival to kneel then in reverence to the Eucharist.



Beginning on Ash Wednesday, all should kneel after the completion of the Lamb of God. All should remain kneeling until it is their time to process forward to receive communion.

Important Information for the laity from Bishop Michael Barber based from the Priests Study Day last October:

- 1. Confirmation for youth is a 2-year program.
- 2. Adult confirmation may be shorter and adapted to each candidate at the pastor's discretion.
- 3. Baptism and Confirmation sponsors should be practicing Catholics in good standing with the Church. Sponsors coming from outside of the parish must have their pastor attest thru a signed letter that they are practicing Catholics and in good standing
- 4. The Bishop is the ordinary minister of Confirmation.
- 5. Pastors may confirm candidates who are converting to the Catholic Faith at Easter Vigil.
- 6. Baptized adults who have taken part in RCIA class should join a Confirmation ceremony administered by the Bishop at their parish or at the Cathedral Adult Confirmation service.
- 7. There will be no communion service in our diocese
- 8. It is recommended that daily Mass is available in all our parishes.
- 9. Notify the laity of Mass schedule at nearby parishes.
- 10. Priests are encouraged to exchange mass schedules to assist the laity.
- 11. Preaching by the lay faithful may not take place within the Celebration of the Eucharist.
- 12. No one may be invited to speak in our churches who are in opposition to the Catholic teaching or promote partisan policies.
- 13. Qualified lay persons, non-ordained religious or seminarians may be invited to lead the service and give reflections at Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer, or other devotions outside of the Mass.
- 14. A qualified lay person, non-ordained religious, seminarians may be invited to speak following the Prayer After Communion at the end of Mass, or at the beginning of Mass after the Greeting. To offer testimony or give witness in support of the teachings of the Church.
- 15. Holy Communion may be received while standing, kneeling, on the hand, or on the tongue. It is the communicant's choice not the priest or minister.
- 16. It is required to kneel after the Sanctus (Holy, Holy) until after the Amen of the Eucharistic Prayer. An exception is when a person is prevented to kneel due to ill-health, space, or other reasonable cause. It is also required to kneel after the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) to prepare ourselves reverently for reception of Holy Communion
- 17. Following reception of Holy Communion, you may stand, sit, or kneel until the priest asks everyone to stand for the Prayer After Communion.
- 18. Priests may not paraphrase the Eucharistic Prayer or replace the Opening Prayer or other prescribed prayer.
- 19. Priests are required to follow the sacramental formulae when administering Baptism, Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, and other Sacraments.
- 20. No priest should ever turn someone away from reception of the sacraments due to the inability of a person to make the suggested offering.
- 21. Pastors are free to waive requested donations or suggest a smaller offering.
- 22. No pastor may request a higher offering without permission from the Bishop or Vicar General.


