

A Message from Fr. Jonathan

As I mentioned last week, we make time throughout our day to eat and nourish our bodies, we also need to take time out of our day to nourish our soul through prayer. This is how we "sanctify our day,"

which means to keep our focus on God. Ancient Israelites who practiced their faith would pray seven times a day, mainly reciting psalms. The early Church picked this up and Christianized it into "the Liturgy of the Hours" (Islam also stole this to form their "salat", or 5 daily prayers to Allah). The Hours were originally said by ALL Christians, but as we progressed into the Middle Ages books became harder to get a hold of and not everyone could read, so the church developed a set of easy to memorize prayers based on the scripture. The Our Father came straight from Jesus out of the Gospels. The Hail Mary is a combination of what the Archangel Gabriel and St. Elizabeth said to Mary in the Gospels, with a prayer request that she intercede on our behalf to God (Contrary to Protestant belief, we CAN ask our friends in Heaven to pray for us, just as much as we can ask our friends here on Earth to pray for us). Finally, the Glory Be isn't directly from the Bible, but it reflects a common theme from the scriptures to give glory to God in all times and things. It had also been a long held tradition in the East to use beads to keep track of prayers. Because the people couldn't do the liturgy of the hours, the clergy asked them to continue to sanctify their day by praying these prayers and meditating on mysteries from the life of Jesus. It took several different forms over the centuries, but this slowly evolved into the Rosary we have today.

Being a devoted Jew, Jesus would have prayed seven times a day, everyday. All Catholic clergy are required, under pain of sin, to pray the Hours every day. It is STILL the official "Prayer of the Church" and ALL Catholics are requested to pray the Hours daily, but as it is usually like pulling teeth to get people to actually do the required things (like attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days), most priests have given up on promoting the Hours to the lay faithful. However, they are the third and final LITURGY of the Church (following the Liturgies of the Eucharist and Word), making them even more powerful prayer than the Rosary! With modern technology, it has gotten even easier to say than ever before. I will speak more about how to begin praying the Liturgy of the Hours next week.

The Deacon's Corner

There are times and situations in our lives that we feel great despair, sorrow or loss. I think everyone has felt the sting of death of a family member or some other deep-wounded tragedy at some point in our lives. Perhaps you are currently dealing with a situation you find yourself thinking that you are out of control or are unsure what you can or should do to resolve the issue. Maybe you are experiencing feelings of sadness, depression, anxiety, or even hopelessness. You might be angry at God. You might question your faith or ask God, "Why is this happening?" Such feelings are probably normal given the circumstances surrounding loss of life or any unexpected tragedy. Many life changing events we face and perhaps continue to encounter will test our faith. However, blaming God is so easy and may quickly appear in our mind. We even use expressions similar to "It's God's will" and we may even admit to being angry with God. Rarely, however, do we admit to being unsure of our trust in God. It may be obvious that we cannot fully understand the mind of God, yet isn't this what we demand, an explanation from God. This sin is rooted in original sin and our desire to know like God. We reject our finite humanity. We turn from God and try to muddle through life alone. We forget our universal call to holiness, rooted in our humanity and Christian baptism, Keeping God the Center of our lives.

Take a moment and reflect on how well you are allowing God to be the center of your life.

If you are having trouble focusing and praying because your feelings and emotions are overwhelming at times, that's ok. Try again, and again if necessary. Take a few moments and relax. Breath. Take a walk and when you are ready place yourself in the loving arms of Jesus and simply state and repeat, "I Trust in You."






