A recent family video shows my 4 y.o. grand-niece waiting at Darwin Airport for the arrival of her Nana and Pa (my brother and his wife). The little girl is standing apart from her parents, totally

focussed on the 'Arrivals' door. She is so excited, her little feet are pumping and she's uttering squeaks of joy. When they finally appear, she launches herself into their arms. What a welcome! That child's emotion was absolute love. What will it be like when Christ comes again?

We have no idea, and it's probably not featuring as an imminent reality in our 21st C. But it was certainly considered imminent in the early years of Christianity. The second coming of Christ was anticipated to happen soon after the Ascension. Then came persecutions, and with Jerusalem and the Temple totally destroyed in 70 AD., believers began to shift focus from passively waiting for the Second Coming, to living as prudent servants, ready to greet the Master when he comes - be it sooner or later. Jesus' advice: "Be ready when the Master comes" was woven into their way of life - not in a scared, panicky attitude, but in their long term loving relationships with God and community.

Do you think when Jesus actually comes, he'll get such an ecstatic response from Christians as the little girl gave her grandparents? Yes, for sure, if we learn to live in his Love!



# **DID YOU KNOW...?**

Steven Anthony "Steve" Ballmer (born March 24, 1956) has been the <u>chief executive</u> <u>officer</u> of the <u>Microsoft Corporation</u> since <u>January 2000</u>. In today's Gospel, Jesus warns his followers to be ever prepared by doing the will of God always in their lives, as the time of their death is uncertain. **First reading, Wisdom 18, 6-9:** The book of Wisdom was written about a century before the coming of Jesus, by a faithful, learned Jew living in cosmopolitan Alexandria in Egypt. One of his purposes was to bolster the Faith of fellow Jews living in a world indifferent, and sometimes hostile, to their beliefs. A favorite theme of the writer is how the **providence of God** has protected the Chosen People throughout their history, especially during the time of their enslavement in Egypt and during their Exodus to freedom and the Promised Land under Moses. The author goes over these events in great detail. Our verses today interpret Exodus chapters 11 and 12 where, while the angel of the Lord was striking down the first-born of Pharaoh and other Egyptians, the vigilant Hebrew slaves were both obediently offering grateful sacrifice to the Lord and eating the meat of the lamb to fortify themselves for their coming escape. That night was the first Passover. Like those Jewish slaves in Egypt, we, too, have been called to cling to the Hope of a future that may seem too good to be true, and we, too, are expected to be steadfast in our Faith, even when we see no signs of the fulfillment of God's promises.

Second Reading, Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19: This passage is taken from the end of the Letter to the Hebrews. It contains the only explicit definition of religious Faith in the Bible: "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen" (Heb 11:1). Like our first reading, the Letter to the Hebrews was intended to bolster the Faith of the Jewish Christians (Hebrews), by appealing to the example of their ancestors who had believed in promises yet to be fulfilled. The chief example of strong Faith is found in their patriarch Abraham, a wealthy but childless pagan in Ur of the Chaldees (modern Iraq). Abraham heard the voice of God summoning him to a different land, where God promised to grant him many descendants. By Faith Abraham left his homeland, accepted God's promise that his descendants would form a great nation, and was willing to sacrifice his son Isaac at God's command. Despite obstacles and setbacks, Abraham stayed obedient, "for he thought that the One Who had made the promise was trustworthy" (Heb 11:11). The first century Jewish \ Christians were ostracized from Temple worship (sacrifices, priesthood, rituals), of mainline Judaism. To bolster their Faith, the author provided a complex treatise showing that, in their new life in Christ, they were more than compensated for what they had lost. They were given the assurance that Christ's promises for his believers exceeded the promises given to their Jewish ancestors.

#### SECOND READING Heb 11:1-2, 8-19

#### A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

#### We will look for the city designed and built by God.

Only faith can guarantee the blessings that we hope for, or prove the existence of the realities that at present remain unseen. It was for faith that our ancestors were commended. It was by faith that Abraham obeyed the call to set out for a country that was the inheritance given to him and his descendants, and that he set out without knowing where he was going. By faith he arrived, as a foreigner, in the Promised Land, and lived there as if in a strange country, with Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. They lived there in tents while he looked forward to a city founded, designed and built by God.

It was equally by faith that Sarah, in spite of being past the age, was made able to conceive, because she believed that he who had made the promise would be faithful to it. Because of this, there came from one man, and one who was already as good as dead himself, more descendants than could be counted, as many as the stars of heaven or the grains of sand on the seashore. All these died in faith, before receiving any of the things that had been promised, but they saw them in the far distance and welcomed them, recognising that they were only strangers and nomads on earth. People who use such terms about themselves make it quite plain that they are in search of their real homeland. They can hardly have meant the country they came from, since they had the opportunity to go back to it; but in fact they were longing for a better homeland, their heavenly homeland. That is why God is not ashamed to be called their God, since he has founded the city for them. It was by faith that Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac. He offered to sacrifice his only son even though the promises had been made to him and he had been told: It is through Isaac that your name will be carried on. He was confident that God had the power even to raise the dead, and so, figuratively speaking, he was given back Isaac from the dead.

# A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke See that you are prepared.
