The following is a continuation of a written document of the USCCB regarding the Mass and Communion 2006



Receiving Jesus in Holy Communion is then the foremost source and expression of our communion with the Blessed Trinity and with one another. Holy Communion is truly a foretaste of heaven—where together all of the Father's children will become fully one with his Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in the love of the Spirit. While the celebration of the Eucharist gives us a foretaste of that perfect unity for which we hope, this foretaste should itself inspire us to work for a deeper realization of communion among all men and women here on this earth. Since entering into the communion of the Eucharist brings us into closer conformity to Christ, we should be filled with a truly Christ-like love for our neighbor that takes us beyond a narrow concern for ourselves and moves us to promote the common good and to uphold the human dignity of every human person. Pope John Paul II described this attitude to the human family as one of "solidarity," which he defined as "*a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good; that is to say to the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all*" (Pope John Paul II, *Sollicitudo Rei Socialis*)

C. Sharing in Jesus' Resurrection and Divinity

In Holy Communion, we receive the risen and glorified Jesus, who once died upon the cross for us. Thus, we are nourished, here and now, on Jesus' own risen life and so become a new creation in Him (see 2 Cor 5:17). Holy Communion, then, anticipates and is a pledge of our own bodily resurrection, when we will share fully in the heavenly banquet of everlasting life. As Jesus stated: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. . . . [For] whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in Him" (Jn 6:54, 56). Similarly, we "come to share in the divine nature" (2 Pt 1:4), for Jesus, in Holy Communion, joins us to the Father by conforming us to his own divine likeness through the power of the Holy Spirit. Because the reception of Holy Communion is able to have such a profound effect upon those who receive it worthily, the Catholic Church encourages all of the faithful to partake of it frequently. "It is clear that the frequent or daily reception of the Blessed Eucharist increases union with Christ, nourishes the spiritual life more abundantly, strengthens the soul in virtue, and gives the communicant a stronger pledge of eternal happiness." Sacred Congregation of Rites, *Instruction on the Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery* (Eucharisticum mysterium)

3. WHO MAY RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION?

Through Baptism and our shared faith in the Gospel of Jesus Christ, we become members of the visible Church, under the apostolic authority of the pope and bishops. The celebration of the Eucharist expresses and enacts this communion in Christ. With few exceptions, only those who are members of the catholic Church may receive Holy Communion at a Catholic Eucharistic liturgy. Being baptized and sharing in the Church's faith are, therefore, conditions for full participation in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, which culminates in the reception of Holy Communion. (see CIC, c 844 § 1; CCEO, c. 671 §1) The Acts of the Apostles tells us that the first Christians "devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers" (Acts 2:42). By its very nature the Eucharist is the fulfillment to which our shared life in union with Christ tends—it fortifies our common faith, nurtures the communal bond of love, and increases our holiness within the one body of Christ. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "The Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life.'" (CCC, no. 1324 II Vatican Council *Lumen Gentium*, 11)





El Miércoles 18 de Febrero comenzamos la Cuaresma con la imposición de Cenizas.

La imposición de las cenizas nos recuerda que nuestra vida en la tierra es pasajera y que nuestra vida definitiva se encuentra en el Cielo.

La Cuaresma comienza con el miércoles de Ceniza y es un tiempo de oración, penitencia y ayuno. Cuarenta días que la Iglesia marca para la conversión del corazón.

Antiguamente los judíos acostumbraban cubrirse de ceniza cuando hacían algún sacrificio y los ninivitas también usaban la ceniza como signo de su deseo de conversión de su mala vida a una vida con Dios.

En los primeros siglos de la Iglesia, las personas que querían recibir el Sacramento de la Reconciliación el Jueves Santo, se ponían ceniza en la cabeza y se presentaban ante la comunidad vestidos con un "hábito penitencial". Esto representaba su voluntad de convertirse.

En el año 384 d.C., la Cuaresma adquirió un sentido penitencial para todos los cristianos y desde el siglo XI, la Iglesia de Roma acostumbra poner las cenizas al iniciar los 40 días de penitencia y conversión.

La imposición de ceniza es una costumbre que nos recuerda que algún día vamos a morir y que nuestro cuerpo se va a convertir en polvo. Nos enseña que todo lo material que tengamos aquí se acaba. En cambio, todo el bien que tengamos en nuestra alma nos lo vamos a llevar a la eternidad. Al final de nuestra vida, sólo nos llevaremos aquello que hayamos hecho por Dios y por nuestros hermanos los hombres.

Cuando el sacerdote nos pone la ceniza, debemos tener una actitud de querer mejorar, de querer tener amistad con Dios. La ceniza se le impone a los niños y a los adultos.


