

Ave + Maria!

This week has been dedicated to prayer for Christian Unity, so I wanted to reflect on Our Lord's desire for His disciples to be one with Him and united to each other. I would like to reflect on the relationship between Christ's coming in the flesh and His prayer for unity as well as the effect of the Incarnation on Missionary activity.

The Word Was Made Flesh That We Might Be One

The Second Vatican Council said: "The Son of God... worked with human hands, he thought with a human mind. He acted with a human will, and with a human heart he loved. Born of the Virgin Mary, he has truly been made one of us, like to us in all things except sin" (Gaudium et Spes, n. 22).

Pope Benedict XVI encouraged us to "recover our wonder at the mystery [of the Incarnation], to let ourselves be enveloped by the grandeur of this event: God, the true God, Creator of all, walked our roads as a man, entering human time to communicate his own life to us (cf. 1 Jn 1:1-4). And he did not do so with the splendor of a sovereign who dominates the world with his power, but with the humility of a child."

Christ's prayer reflects the reality of his mission and desire to bring all of His disciples into the one flock. The mystery of the incarnation is full of unitive aspects. The union of the human and divine natures in the one person of Christ being chief among them. The Constitutions of the Institute of the Incarnate Word (IVE) tell us, "The center of our life must be Jesus Christ, true God and true man, who unites both natures in his one, unique, divine person; for in truth we profess that the Word became flesh (Jn 1:14)."

Saint John Paul II helps us to understand the unitive aspect of the Incarnation on a personal level in His encyclical letter *Redemptor Hominis*, "Human nature, by the very fact that it was assumed, not absorbed, in him, has been raised in us also to a dignity beyond compare. For, by his Incarnation, He, the son of God, in a certain way united himself with each man.' The Church therefore sees its fundamental task in enabling that union to be brought about and renewed continually. The Church wishes to serve this single end: that each person may be able to find Christ, in order that Christ may walk with each person the path of life."

And so, our task as disciples of Christ is to bring others into contact with Jesus Christ, planting the seed that they might be encouraged to enter freely into the mysteries of the Incarnation and Redemption.

In considering other recent writings of the Magisterium, we can find further motivation for our missionary labors. Shortly before the opening of the Second Vatican Council, Pope Saint John XXIII invited the Church to "reflect on [the] union of heaven and earth, which is the purpose of the Incarnation and Redemption", and he went on to affirm that the aim of the Council itself was to spread ever wider the beneficent impact of the Incarnation and Redemption on all spheres of life.

We must work to extend the Kingdom of Christ into every corner of the world, always remembering the profound gift of God and vocation of man; which is union with God in Eternal Life. Recalling what St. John Chrysostom said, "God's own Son was made the son of man, that he might make the sons of men the sons of God."

In our missionary work we will see some who are in need of spiritual guidance, while others may need both material and spiritual aid. Working with the poor must never be devoid of Christ, "Man does not live on bread alone."

Pope Francis made it clear that the world wants social work, but not a God Incarnate, "the truth, that is the revelation of Jesus, [the] presence of Jesus Incarnate. That is the point". If it is forgotten, there will always be a strong temptation "to do good things without the scandal of the Incarnate Word, without the scandal of the Cross." The world will permit us to "do all the social work we like, [as] people say: 'how good the Church is, what good social work the Church does!'. But if we say we do this because those people are the flesh of Christ, it gives rise to a scandal."

The IVE Directory of Spirituality reminds us, "Since the Word became man without ceasing to be God, we must learn how to be in the world "without being of the world." We must go into the world in order to convert it and not to imitate it; to enter cultures not to convert ourselves into these cultures, but to heal them and to elevate them with the strength of the Gospel, doing as Christ did: "The Son took away the devil's nature, assumed human nature, and conferred the divine nature."

Let us ask Our Lady, Mother of the Incarnate Word, for the grace and assistance necessary to bring Christ to all that His prayer will be answered and all might be made one.



Evangelio Mt 4, 12-23

Al enterarse Jesús de que Juan había sido arrestado, se retiró a Galilea, y dejando el pueblo de Nazaret, se fue a vivir a Cafarnaúm, junto al lago, en territorio de Zabulón y Neftalí, para que así se cumpliera lo que había anunciado el profeta Isaías:

Tierra de Zabulón y Neftalí, camino del mar, al otro lado del Jordán, Galilea de los paganos. El pueblo que habitaba en tinieblas vio una gran luz. Sobre los que vivían en tierra de sombras una luz resplandeció.

Desde entonces comenzó Jesús a predicar, diciendo: “Conviértanse, porque ya está cerca el Reino de los cielos”.

Una vez que Jesús caminaba por la ribera del mar de Galilea, vio a dos hermanos, Simón, llamado después Pedro, y Andrés, los cuales estaban echando las redes al mar, porque eran pescadores. Jesús les dijo: “Sígueme y los haré pescadores de hombres”. Ellos inmediatamente dejaron las redes y lo siguieron. Pasando más adelante, vio a otros dos hermanos, Santiago y Juan, hijos de Zebedeo, que estaban con su padre en la barca, remendando las redes, y los llamó también. Ellos, dejando enseguida la barca y a su padre, lo siguieron.

Andaba por toda Galilea, enseñando en las sinagogas y proclamando la buena nueva del Reino de Dios y curando a la gente de toda enfermedad y dolencia.
