Truth and Love about Physician Assisted Suicide

This is a continuation of the bulletin announcements debunking PAS claims and offering Catholic Christian hope and wisdom. If you have questions, you are encouraged to speak to a priest about the personal and societal challenge of PAS. Catholic Church statements and video witnesses are available at www.usccb.org/toliveeachday.

4. Physician Assisted Suicide myth: There are some ways of living where the person would be better off dead. If they want that, we should facilitate that.

Truth: This is a quiet way of insulting and threatening millions of people living with disabilities. Every national disability rights organization in the USA (15 of them) has come out against physician assisted suicide legislation. Catholic compassion: If someone says they would be better off dead, tell them that is not true, their lives have meaning, and offer them help finding a counselor. If the person is living with disabilities, include and welcome them. If they are bound to bed and cannot communicate, bring community to them. Many people's lives are deeply enriched by relationships with friends and family with disabilities. All human beings are beloved in the eyes of God and we are called to be friends to each other.

5. Physician Assisted Suicide myth: Look, I'm dying anyway. Why not end the process before it gets even harder?

Truth: God has a purpose for your life. His son Jesus Christ died for you, to open to you a path to the Father. But you have been given a mission. God has rich possibilities for your life, even on your deathbed, that you do not know—but He does. Do not shut out the Lord's possibilities for your life. He will grace you in the difficulties and we will not abandon you. Dying is difficult, but it is also sacred ground. If you intentionally and with full knowledge end your life, you shut God out. Catholic compassion: Dying can be hard, but we can help. For centuries, the Christian faith has helped people die well. Request the sacramental of anointing of the sick early in the process for the grace of peace. Pray and request prayer. Forgive friends and family. Ask for help. We have millions of witnesses of people who have died well and with peace. We can't promise it won't be hard, but we can promise you will not be alone and God is with you.

6. Physician Assisted Suicide myth: Even if I wouldn't engage physician assisted suicide, it should be legal so to honor other people's decisions.

Truth: When we see people put themselves in great harm, we do everything we can to prevent it. Additionally, the legalization of PAS has an impact far beyond one person and his/her life. It impacts insurance decisions, conscience protections for doctors and pharmacists, and can cover up elder abuse. Catholic compassion: We can love others and not agree with their choices. It's always challenging. But it isn't as hard as living with being complicit in another person's death. Pray hard, tell people you are there for them, and be that bridge to dying well for another person.

7. Physician Assisted Suicide myth: People don't want to be burdens. We should let them go before that point.

Truth: Human beings are not burdens. They can only be considered as burdens if we define the human being by his or her abilities, or lack thereof. Circumstances may be burdensome, but people are not. Often, when people say they don't want to be a burden, they are scared, depressed, and want to hear back "You are not a burden." Offering them PAS just affirms a lie spoken in a challenged mental state. Catholic compassion: Human beings are never burdens, yet we are called to "bear one another's burdens." (Galatians 6:2) We will all face dying someday, and as part of the human family, we should help one another face and live through this process. Dying can come with heavy realities, and perhaps we can call those challenges burdens. But when we bear them together, love wins. The person is bigger than the disease, and never a burden. Let's remind each other of that in word and deed, and teach our children how to love.

PHÚCÂM: Mt5,17-37 (bàidài)

"Người xưa đã bảo như thế, còn Ta, Ta bảo các con thế này".

Tin Mừng Chúa Giêsu Kitô theo Thánh Matthêu.

Khi ấy, Chúa Giêsu phán cùng các môn đệ rằng: "Các con đừng tưởng Ta đến để huỷ bỏ lề luật hay các tiên tri; Ta không đến để huỷ bỏ, nhưng để kiện toàn. Vì Ta bảo thật các con: Cho dù trời đất có qua đi, thì một chấm, một phẩy trong bộ luật cũng không bỏ sót, cho đến khi mọi sự hoàn thành. Bởi vậy, ai huỷ bỏ một trong những điều luật nhỏ mọn nhất và dạy người khác làm như vậy, sẽ kể là người nhỏ nhất trong Nước Trời; trái lại, ai giữ và dạy người ta giữ những điều đó, sẽ được kể là người cao cả trong Nước Trời. Nếu các con không công chính hơn các luật sĩ và biệt phái, thì các con chẳng được vào Nước Trời đâu.

"Các con đã nghe dạy người xưa rằng: 'Không được giết người. Ai giết người, sẽ bị luận phạt nơi tòa án'. Còn Ta, Ta bảo các con: Bất cứ ai phản nộ với anh em mình, thì sẽ bị tòa án luận phạt. Ai bảo anh em là 'ngốc', thì bị phạt trước công nghị. Ai rửa anh em là 'khùng', thì sẽ bị vạ lửa địa ngục. Nếu người đang dâng của lễ nơi bàn thờ mà sức nhớ người anh em đang có điều bất bình với người, thì người hãy để của lễ lại trước bàn thờ, đi làm hoà với người anh em người trước đã, rồi hãy trở lại dâng của lễ. Hãy liệu làm hoà với kẻ thù ngay lúc còn đi dọc đường với nó, kẻo kẻ thù sẽ đưa người ra trước mặt quan toà, quan toà lại trao người cho tên lính canh và người sẽ bị tống ngục. Ta bảo thật các người biết: Người sẽ không thoát khỏi nơi ấy cho đến khi trả hết đồng bạc cuối cùng.

"Các con đã nghe nói với người xưa rằng: 'Chớ ngoại tình'. Còn Ta, Ta bảo các con: Hễ ai nhìn xem phụ nữ mà ước ao phạm tội với họ, thì đã ngoại tình với họ trong lòng rồi. Nếu con mắt phải của con nên dịp tội cho con, thì hãy móc nó mà ném xa con; vì thà mất một chi thể còn lợi hơn là toàn thân bị ném vào hỏa ngục. Và nếu tay phải con nên dịp tội cho con, thì hãy chặt mà ném nó xa con; vì thà mất một chi thể còn hơn là toàn thân bị ném vào hỏa ngục.

"Cũng có lời dạy rằng: 'Ai ly dị vợ mình, thì hãy trao cho vợ tờ ly dị'. Còn Ta, Ta bảo các con: Hễ ai ly dị vợ mình, trừ trường hợp tà dâm, thì làm có cho vợ ngoại tình; và ai cưới người vợ đã ly dị, cũng phạm tội ngoại tình.

"Các con cũng đã nghe có lời bảo người xưa rằng: 'Chớ thề gian, nhưng hãy giữ trọn lời mình thề với Chúa'. Còn Ta, Ta bảo các con: Đừng thề chi cả; đừng lấy trời mà thề, vì trời là ngai Thiên Chúa; đừng lấy đất mà thề, vì đất là bệ chân Người; đừng lấy Giêrusalem mà thề, vì là thành của Vua cao cả. cũng đừng chỉ đầu người mà thề, vì người không thể làm cho một sợi tóc ra trắng hay đen được. Nhưng lời nói của các con phải là: Có thì nói có, không thì nói không, thêm điều đặt chuyện là bởi ma quỷ mà ra". Đó là lời Chúa.

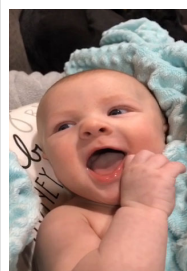

En verdad te digo que no saldrás de allí hasta que hayas pagado el último céntimo. Habéis oído que se dijo: “No cometerás adulterio”.

Pero yo os digo: todo el que mira a una mujer deseándola, ya ha cometido adulterio con ella en su corazón.

Si tu ojo derecho te induce a pecar, sácatelo y tíralo. Más te vale perder un miembro que ser echado entero en la “gehenna”.

Si tu mano derecha te induce a pecar, córtatela y tírala, porque más te vale perder un miembro que ir a parar entero a la “gehenna”.

Se dijo: “El que repudie a su mujer, que le dé acta de repudio”. Pero yo os digo que si uno repudia a su mujer —no hablo de unión ilegítima— la induce a cometer adulterio, y el que se casa con la repudiada comete adulterio.

También habéis oído que se dijo a los antiguos: “No jurarás en falso” y “Cumplirás tus juramentos al Señor”.

Pero yo os digo que no juréis en absoluto: ni por el cielo, que es el trono de Dios; ni por la tierra, que es estrado de sus pies; ni por Jerusalén, que es la ciudad del Gran Rey. Ni jures por tu cabeza, pues no puedes volver blanco o negro un solo cabello. Que vuestro hablar sea sí, sí, no, no. Lo que pasa de ahí viene del Maligno».

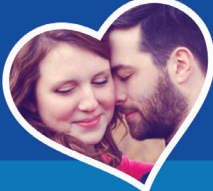
