Chaplet of Divine Mercy Most Days at 2:00 pm EWTN on Cable is Channel 80 On the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima we commemorate the first apparition of our Lady to the three poor Shepherd children; Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta. She first appeared on May 13th, 1917 and appeared to them on the 13th of each month for six consecutive months. In context of historical events, these apparitions occurred around the conclusion of the First World War, when the world seemed to be in a terrible state and there was no peace.

In her apparitions, Our Lady requested the three shepherd children to pray for three intentions; for world peace, for the conversion of sinners, and particularly for the conversion of Russia. And in order that the children may effectively obtain the fruitful fulfillment of these three goals she entrusted to them the prayer of the Most Holy Rosary. She told them, "Say the Rosary every day, to bring peace to the world and an end to the war." This request should serve us as a reminder of two things: first, of how powerful the Rosary is and second, on the importance of praying for the conversion of sinners.

Now it wasn't that they didn't know how to or didn't pray the Rosary. They would have often prayed the Rosary their own short and quick way, many times saying the first two words of the Hail Mary. But Our Lady wanted them to draw more fruit from the Rosary, to pray the Rosary with greater zeal. The Rosary is both a vocal and mental prayer, as we say the Our Fathers and Hail Marys, we meditate on the Mystery of Christ and Mary. And because it is the contemplation of mysteries, we can always draw more out of the Rosary. It only seems like a repetitive vocal prayer when we don't pray it by the side of Mary and with the Heart of Mary. Saint Louis de Montfort says, "No prayer is more meritorious for the soul and more glorious for Jesus and Mary than a well recited Rosary."

Our Lady of Fatima, by entrusting the three shepherd children with the task of praying for world peace and for the Conversion of Sinners, this was her invitation to them, and us, to partake of the mission of Christ, the mission of the universal church. As incorporated members of Christ Mystical body we partake of the same mission of Christ, and this is always something good to consider as we pray the Rosary. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "Through Baptism we...become members of Christ, [and] are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission." And just as Christ's mission was to call sinners back to Himself so is our mission too, to pray for the return of all sinners back to the love and mercy of the Father. We may not have such an active apostolate as teaching Catechism, visiting the sick or having oratory, but the prayer of the Rosary and daily Adoration is our apostolate, and it is probably the best apostolate. It is like the apostolates of monks and contemplatives who pray for sinners but never see the fruits of their prayers. They will see the fruits of their prayers in heaven.

When a sinner commits a sin, he does not only offend God, but the church as well. And so that first call to conversion does not only belong to God, but to the Church. Just as Christ is the Good Shepherd who goes out in search for the Lost Sheep, so should we, the Church and members of Christ body, do likewise. Through pray we should go out in search for the Lost Sheep. Let us ask our Blessed Mother, Our Lady of Fatima for the grace to always treasure the Rosary and to always pray for the conversion of sinners. God Bless.
