Parish Information

We welcome you to the Good Shepherd Parish Community!

Please register at the Parish Office as soon as you are able to do so, and the staff will be happy to inform you about our parish and the opportunities we offer. Parish registration is required for religious education, celebration of all Sacraments and certification as a sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation. Regular Sunday worship with us indicates a practicing Catholic, not just parish registration. Attendance is necessary at weekend worship for the all sacraments and certification of sponsorship. Please notify the parish office of any changes in phone number, address, e-mail address or when leaving the parish.

We have hospitality Sunday, the first Sunday of the month. Please come and meet our Priest and fellow parishioners.

Baptism: All Baptisms are celebrated on the first Sunday of the month at **12noon**. The preparation process should begin at least three months before the planned date of the Baptism. A Baptism Preparation Class is required for parents (godparents may attend if they wish). This class is offered on the fourth Sunday of each month at **9:45 AM**. Please call the parish office to register. The date of the baptism is scheduled after attending the class. Parish membership and active worship is required for two months prior to preparation.

Religious Education

Provides faith filled instructions for Levels 1st through 8th. We have classes on two Saturdays a month from 8:45am to 11am. Special instructions for sacramental preparations.

Initiation of Adults and Older Children: This is an extended formation process for unbaptized or uncatechized adults or baptized Christians of other faith traditions who wish to become members of the Catholic Church, as well as for unbaptized or uncatechized school-aged children. Please contact the parish office for more information. Initiation is celebrated at the Easter Vigil after a formation period of one or two years.

Adult Confirmation: This is a program for persons over the age of 18 who have received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Eucharist, but who never completed their initiation with the Sacrament of Confirmation. The program is a 10-12 week program, with Confirmation being celebrated on the Solemnity of Pentecost. Please call the parish office for more details.

Matrimony: Couples wishing to marry in Good Shepherd Parish must be registered members of our parish. They are required to make initial arrangements at least one year in advance. Four sessions with the priest or deacon, as well as Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter take place during this year. Active worship for at least two months are required before a date may be scheduled.

Anointing of the Sick: Anyone who is seriously ill or unable to come to church for a length of time should contact the parish office to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick. Eucharistic Ministers bring Holy Communion to homebound parishioners every Sunday, and our priest will visit on the First Friday of each month. Please call the parish office to make arrangements. The Diocese of Metuchen provides Catholic priests to serve at all local hospitals.

My dear Friends,

I'm really amazed how fully and deeply we Catholics celebrate Christmas. In addition to our Advent weeks of preparation and anticipation, when we actually get to Christmas itself, we unpack the true significance of the Birth of Jesus in profound ways, beginning the following day.

On the 26th, we celebrate the feast of the martyrdom of St. Steven, the first martyr. Golly, following Jesus is serious business! On the 27th, we celebrate St. John, the author of the fourth Gospel, and the one who so elegantly described Jesus as the WORD that became flesh and dwelt among us. On the 28th, we honor the Holy Innocents — all those infants King Herod put to death in his efforts to maintain power when he heard about Jesus' birth.

Last weekend, we celebrated the Feast of the Holy Family, and this weekend is the Epiphany — all continuing to delve deeply into the reality and significance of Jesus Christ.

Epiphany means literally "to show" or "to reveal". The visit of the Magi reveal that the infant Jesus was truly the newborn King, the long-awaited Savior of all. Remember, the Magi were not Jewish, but were wisdom seekers from the East — and it was they who recognized in Jesus as the Christ.

Pope Francis wrote so clearly that everything we do as a religion is about revealing Jesus to our world, and assisting each person coming to know him personally:

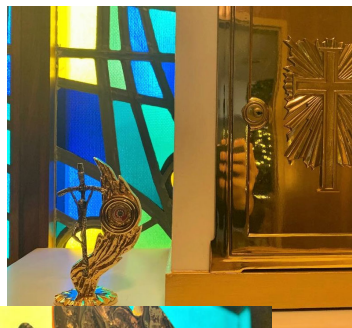
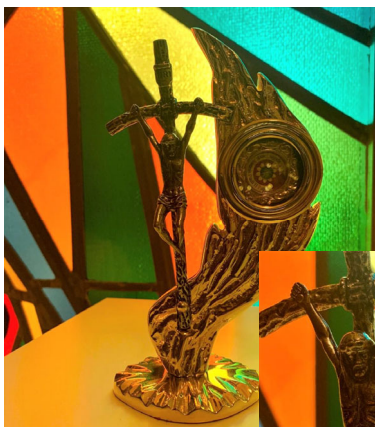
"Jesus is the fresh living water for which we thirst more than for anything else, which he alone can give and nothing else can replace; we lead all to see Him, perfect happiness, when nothing else can satisfy, we lead all to realize their most secret dreams, which no worldly power or pleasure can promise to fulfill!"

May this New Year 2020 draw each of us into an ever deeper relationship with Jesus, embracing of his vision for human existence!

Over two months ago on October 20, Fr. Jakub Debicki my good friend working as a missionary priest in Ukraine, brought from Abp. Mieczysław Mokrzycki (Lviv) who was a private secretary of JP II for many years, to our parish a first class relic of John Paul II. After all Masses we venerated it and many of you had an opportunity to receive a blessing and kissed it. After this celebration the relic waited for special case "reliquary" to be placed inside. **Finally we got it!!!**

It was custom made, and shipped from Ukraine. Many of you asked me where it will remain? Temporary it will stay in our Chapel inside the Rectory until it will be displayed permanently in the Church on the wall together with the Chasuble whom JP II wore once when he celebrated Mass during his visit. We are so grateful having these two signs of the Holy Pope among us. This relic will be available for private prayers. Visit the Chapel any time during our office business hours Monday thru Friday 9am to 4pm. Please take advantage of this unique presence of JP II among us. I'm so grateful to Catherine and Anthony Paone for their generosity and support getting this relic & Chasuble to our Parish Community.

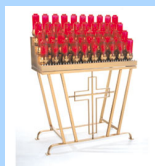

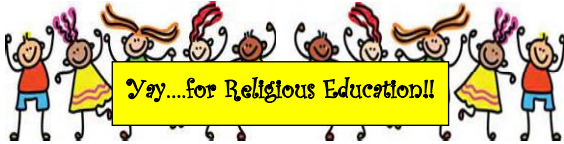
For the first time ever!!! We will be offering Religious Education to Kindergarteners beginning the September 2020-21 school year.

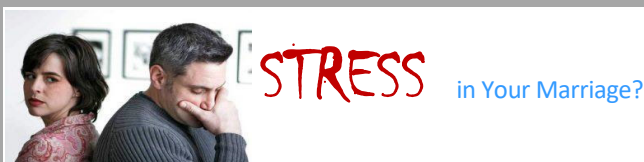
Some of the benefits of the Intercessory Prayers:

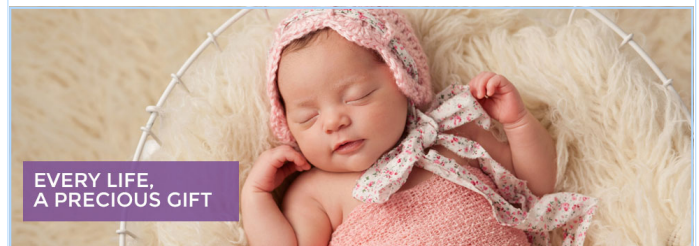
