

Parish Information

We welcome you to the Good Shepherd Parish Community!

Please register at the Parish Office as soon as you are able to do so, and the staff will be happy to inform you about our parish and the opportunities we offer. Parish registration is required for religious education, celebration of all Sacraments and certification as a sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation. Regular Sunday worship with us indicates a practicing Catholic, not just parish registration. Attendance is necessary at weekend worship for the all sacraments and certification of sponsorship. Please notify the parish office of any changes in phone numbers, addresses, e-mail addresses or when leaving the parish.

We have hospitality Sunday, the first Sunday of the month. Please come and meet our Priest and fellow parishioners.

Baptism: All Baptisms are celebrated on the first Sunday of the month at 12noon. The preparation process should begin at least three months before the planned date of the Baptism. A Baptism Preparation Class is required for parents (godparents may attend if they wish). This class is offered on the fourth Sunday of each month at 9:45 AM. Please call the parish office to register. The date of the baptism is scheduled after attending the class. Parish membership and active worship is required for two months prior to preparation.

Religious Education: Provides faith filled instructions for Levels 1st through 8th. We have classes on two Saturdays a month from 8:45am to 11am. Special instructions are given for sacramental preparations.

Initiation of Adults and Older Children: This is an extended formation process for unbaptized or uncatechized adults or baptized Christians of other faith traditions who wish to become members of the Catholic Church, as well as for unbaptized or uncatechized school-aged children. Please contact the parish office for more information. Initiation is celebrated at the Easter Vigil after a formation period of one or two years.

Adult Confirmation: This is a program for persons over the age of 18 who have received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Eucharist, but who never completed their initiation with the Sacrament of Confirmation. The program is a 10-12 week program, with Confirmation being celebrated on the Solemnity of Pentecost. Please call the parish office for more details.

Matrimony: Couples wishing to marry in Good Shepherd Parish must be registered members of our parish. They are required to make initial arrangements at least one year in advance. Four sessions with the priest or deacon, as well as Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter take place during this year. Active worship for at least two months are required before a date may be scheduled.

Anointing of the Sick: Anyone who is seriously ill or unable to come to church for a length of time should contact the parish office to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick. Eucharistic Ministers bring Holy Communion to homebound parishioners every Sunday, and our priest will visit on the First Friday of each month. Please <u>call the parish office</u> to make arrangements. The Diocese of Metuchen provides Catholic priests to serve at all local hospitals.

My Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate Corpus Christi Sunday. This feast officially named The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is to be held by the Universal Church on the Thursday following Holy Trinity Sunday. Observing this feast we confess the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. In some countries, this feast is transferred to the nearest Sunday. There is a beautiful story behind this feast. The beginning of this feast dates back to the Middle Ages and is connected with a visionary nun and a Eucharistic miracle. A German priest was traveling to Rome and he stopped in Bolsena to celebrate Mass. While saying the consecration prayer he doubted Christ being actually present in the consecrated bread and wine. At the moment of his disbelief, blood began seeping from the consecrated host onto the altar and corporal. The priest immediately reported this miracle to the pope. Urban IV sent his delegates to investigate the miraculous event and ordered to bring the host and the bloodstained corporal to Orvieto, where he was at the moment. The relics remain there today. That Eucharistic miracle confirmed the vision that St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon in Belgium, a nun and mystic, had. Finally, in the 13th century the pope instituted the Corpus Christi Feast and soon it was observed by the Universal Church.

In the Gospel of St. John, chapter 6, Our Lord says:

"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him"

This teaching definitively says that the Holy Eucharist is not a symbol, but in fact the whole Jesus, Body and **Blood, Soul and Divinity**. In the same chapter we hear:

Then many of his disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" ... As a result of this, many [of] his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. If Jesus were speaking symbolically about eating his Flesh and drinking his Blood, He would have not let his disciples leave without giving them a further explanation. There are converts today who were led to the Catholic Church because of this passage.

True disciples of Jesus believed this teaching. They may not have understood how it could be that they would eat His Flesh and drink His blood; but they didn't doubt that somehow it would happen. Indeed, it did happen at the Last Supper; and it has happened and continues to happen at every Mass. What a privilege it is to consume the Body and the Blood and the Soul and the Divinity of Christ. That is why it is so important to appreciate this Gift. All of us must prepare ourselves with prayer and good Confessions to receive our Lord.

Let us pray for those who do not know this Gift -- for those who think that the Eucharist is only a symbol of Jesus' presence. It is sad to say that some Catholics think this way. May they read slowly and prayerfully John 6 and then meditate on this truth. May they know the joy of having the real Presence in every tabernacle of every Catholic church throughout the world.

My friends what a gift that today on this Feast we are able to return to our Parish and receive HIM with longing into our

hearts and lives.



Part of our RCIA & Religious Ed program requirement is to carefully choose a Saint Name. Here are a few personal essays from our very own Candidates and Confirmation members:

The reason why I choose Saint Jude—he is the patron Saint of desperate cases and lost causes. I remember as a little girl my Nonny always used to pray to him, I never really knew the reason why until I went to get my communion. There was a time in my life where I was very ill with anorexia, my mother went through a lot with the situation with me and again se also prayed the Saint Jude to help me in the desperate case. I felt this overcome in my heart where I needed to get better and get stronger because this isn't the way to live with myself in pain and sorrow. I went through a rough time in high school with bullying and was very insecure with myself. I noticed I was changing again, and relapsing. In 2010, I lost the most precious woman in my life "Nonna" that really hit me in my heart. The following year I was graduation high school and knowing she will not be there was painful. I got worse in 2011 and I knew that I had my anorexia again. One day me and my family were at a car wash & my mother said to me "sweetie you're sick & you need help". I told my mom crying "Mommy I need to be admitted to the hospital, I want to get better" that was a big step for me for myself for those words to come out.

My Mother was proud of me, because I admitted I needed help to recover from this illness. After I year I fully recovered again from anorexia in 2013. I have not relapsed since and have been fully sober from my anorexia for 6 years now. I thank Saint Jude for helping me in those nightmare and scary times in the hospital. He was always with me every step of the way.

I only spoke a few time in front of others in a program that was going through anorexia & bulimia to help them to the right path in their recovery from healing his evil illness.

I was always a type of person to help and heal people in anyway I can. I never really knew the reason why until now. Saint Jude is the one that is in my soul and for that reason I choose him.



As for confirmation names I choose Mary. One of my favorite events in church as a kid was the May Crowing, the flowers and the Mass are always so beautiful, and the first prayer I ever learned was the Hail Mary. Mary is also considered, in may articles I read, the greatest of Saints, so go big or go home—lol!

I always considered Mary a very graceful person, dealing with her situation at the time in a way that was so accepting and so brave. She possesses many traits I would like to have more of. So picking her as my confirmation name is a way to remind myself to be better I my faith and be more like her even in small ways.



Intercessory prayer is the act of praying on behalf of others. All Christians are called to be Intercessory. All Christians have the Holy Spirit in their hearts and, just as Christ intercedes for us in accordance with God's will (Romans 8:26-27), we are to intercede for one another. Nothing is too small to request from our Lord, Jesus. Nothing is insignificant to him.

At the Good Shepherd Parish our Children have embarked on a mission of Intercessory Prayer by praying nightly at 9:00 pm. We have been conducting classes on Intercessory prayers so that our youth are prepared to be Intercessors. Weekly they are presented with the prayer requests from parishioners. We pray and then they go forth with their mission work.

Some of the benefits of the Intercessory Prayers:

- It increases God's Protection.
- It strengthens us to do what God is calling us to do.
- It removes feelings of aloneness.
- It builds our relationship with God and increases our faith.

Living God's Word


Some families always set an extra place at the table as a sign that guests are welcomed to share their
