## Parish Information

### We welcome you to the Good Shepherd Parish Community!

Please register at the Parish Office as soon as you are able to do so, and the staff will be happy to inform you about our parish and the opportunities we offer. Parish registration is required for religious education, celebration of all Sacraments and certification as a sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation. Regular Sunday worship with us indicates a practicing Catholic, not just parish registration. Attendance is necessary at weekend worship for the all sacraments and certification of sponsorship. Please notify the parish office of any changes in phone numbers, addresses, e-mail addresses or when leaving the parish.

**Baptism:** All Baptisms are celebrated on the first Sunday of the month at **12noon**. The preparation process should begin at least three months before the planned date of the Baptism. A Baptism Preparation Class is required for parents (godparents may attend if they wish). This class is offered on the fourth Sunday of each month at **9:45 AM**. Please call the parish office to register. The date of the baptism is scheduled after attending the class. Parish membership and active worship is required for two months prior to preparation.

**Religious Education:** We provide faith filled instructions for Levels 1st through 8th. There are times, due to Covid-19 we must implement virtual instruction, otherwise our program is offered in person. Special instructions are given for sacramental preparations.

**Initiation of Adults and Older Children:** This is an extended formation process for unbaptized or uncatechized adults or baptized Christians of other faith traditions who wish to become members of the Catholic Church, as well as for unbaptized or uncatechized school-aged children. Please contact the parish office for more information. Initiation is celebrated at the Easter Vigil after a formation period of one or two years.

**Adult Confirmation:** This is a program for persons over the age of 18 who have received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Eucharist, but who never completed their initiation with the Sacrament of Confirmation. The program is a 10-12 week program, with Confirmation being celebrated on the Solemnity of Pentecost. Please call the parish office for more details.

**Matrimony:** Couples wishing to marry in Good Shepherd Parish must be registered members of our parish. They are required to make initial arrangements at least one year in advance. Four sessions with the priest or deacon, as well as Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter take place during this year. Active worship for at least two months are required before a date may be scheduled.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Anyone who is seriously ill or unable to come to church for a length of time should contact the parish office to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick. Eucharistic Ministers bring Holy Communion to homebound parishioners every Sunday, and our priest will visit on the First Friday of each month. Please call the parish office to make arrangements. The Diocese of Metuchen provides Catholic priests to serve at all local hospitals.

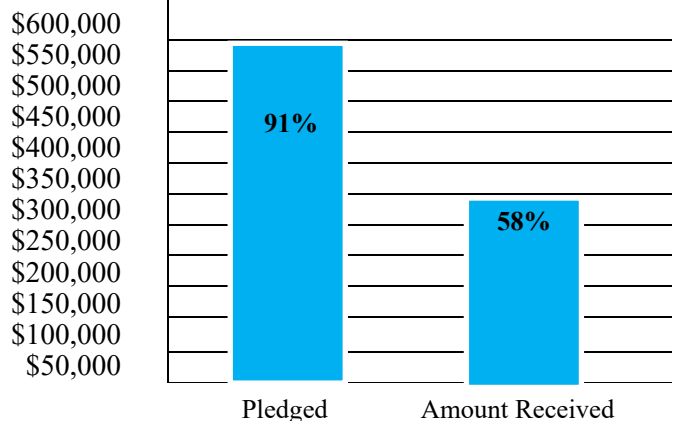

My Dear Friends,

**The webster dictionary defines a secretary as:** one employed to handle correspondence and manage routine and detail work for a superior.

**Our Diocese defines a “Parish Secretary” in addition to the above:** a primary point of contact for parishioners and visitors who come to the parish office. Who is pleasant, welcoming and applies appropriate etiquette when answering the telephone and to those who come in-person. They must be driven by the Catholic faith and willing to fulfill the vision and mission of this Parish.

**The Good Shepherd Parish defines a Parish Secretary as all of the above and adds:**  
*Juggler-a person who adroitly balances several activities.*

Our Parish Secretary Maria C. Arcelay does just that! This June 1, 2022 she will celebrate 10 years as our Parish Secretary, 8 years as Cemetery Coordinator, 9 years as a PCL (Director for Religious Education, 5 years Vacation Bible School), 6 Years as a Facilitator for Protecting God’s Children (instruction and prevention of how to prevent Sexual child/elderly adult abuse), 6 years Background Coordinator, Website Administrator, Youth Group Volunteer, Pastoral Council Member, Eucharistic Minister & Lector.

Through my short time here I can see why she was given a panel interview for a volunteer position with Fr. Mike, Deacon Sam and the Secretary at that time Gloria McArdle. I know just what they envisioned, a very capable, compassionate, sincere person who would endure and take on the roll as our Parish Secretary.

Though these last few years have been very difficult for all of us. Maria, in the beginning of Covid worked from home and volunteered to have the phones switched to her cell so you would always have a means to contact us. Most times, she answered your calls 7 days a week, from 7am to 7pm at night. At the same time, she ran our Religious Ed. Program through Zoom. With 10 classes she sat in on each Zoom session along with each class Catechist according to Diocesan requirement. Then spent several hours corresponding with Parents and Catechist to eventually post the homework information on our website. Maria personally created “RCIA for Children” within our Religious Education Program, which happens to be the only program in this area.

With that being said, I’m sure most of you are already aware that this year she has decided to step down as the PCL. I know this was a hard decision for her as she loves working with you and your children so much. As Maria has said “*this will allow me to be better at everything else.*” I hope you’ll join me in congratulating her for all her years of service to our Religious Ed Program and her 10-year Anniversary as our Parish Secretary.

I hope you will join me in welcoming Margaret Russo who will step in Maria’s place this fall, I will have more information about her in our next bulletin.

# The Sixth Sunday of Easter

## First Reading

[Acts 15:1-2, 22-29](#)

Some who had come down from Judea were instructing the brothers, "Unless you are circumcised according to the Mosaic practice, you cannot be saved." Because there arose no little dissension and debate by Paul and Barnabas with them, it was decided that Paul, Barnabas, and some of the others should go up to Jerusalem to the apostles and elders about this question.

The apostles and elders, in agreement with the whole church, decided to choose representatives and to send them to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas. The ones chosen were Judas, who was called Barsabbas, and Silas, leaders among the brothers. This is the letter delivered by them:

"The apostles and the elders, your brothers, to the brothers in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia of Gentile origin: greetings. Since we have heard that some of our number who went out without any mandate from us have upset you with their teachings and disturbed your peace of mind, we have with one accord decided to choose representatives and to send them to you along with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. So we are sending Judas and Silas who will also convey this same message by word of mouth: 'It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities, namely, to abstain from meat sacrificed to idols, from blood, from meats of strangled animals, and from unlawful marriage. If you keep free of these, you will be doing what is right. Farewell.'"

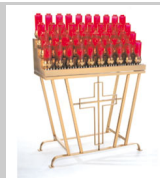
## Gospel

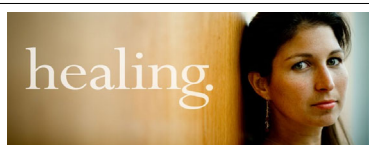
