## Parish Information

# *We welcome you to the Good Shepherd Parish Community!*

Please register at the Parish Office as soon as you are able to do so, and the staff will be happy to inform you about our parish and the opportunities we offer. Parish registration is required for religious education, celebration of all Sacraments and certification as a sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation. Regular Sunday worship with us indicates a practicing Catholic, not just parish registration. Attendance is necessary at weekend worship for the all sacraments and certification of sponsorship. Please notify the parish office of any changes in phone numbers, addresses, e-mail addresses or when leaving the parish.

**Baptism:** All Baptisms are celebrated on the first Sunday of the month at **12noon**. The preparation process should begin at least three months before the planned date of the Baptism. A Baptism Preparation Class is required for parents (godparents may attend if they wish). This class is offered on the fourth Sunday of each month at **9:45 AM**. Please call the parish office to register. The date of the baptism is scheduled after attending the class. Parish membership and active worship is required for two months prior to preparation.

**Religious Education:** We provide faith filled instructions for Levels 1st through 8th. There are times, due to Covid-19 we must implement virtual instruction, otherwise our program is offered in person. Special instructions are given for sacramental preparations.

**Initiation of Adults and Older Children:** This is an extended formation process for unbaptized or uncatechized adults or baptized Christians of other faith traditions who wish to become members of the Catholic Church, as well as for unbaptized or uncatechized school-aged children. Please contact the parish office for more information. Initiation is celebrated at the Easter Vigil after a formation period of one or two years.

**Adult Confirmation:** This is a program for persons over the age of 18 who have received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Eucharist, but who never completed their initiation with the Sacrament of Confirmation. The program is a 10-12 week program, with Confirmation being celebrated on the Solemnity of Pentecost. Please call the parish office for more details.

**Matrimony:** Couples wishing to marry in Good Shepherd Parish must be registered members of our parish. They are required to make initial arrangements at least one year in advance. Four sessions with the priest or deacon, as well as Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter take place during this year. Active worship for at least two months are required before a date may be scheduled.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Anyone who is seriously ill or unable to come to church for a length of time should contact the parish office to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick. Eucharistic Ministers bring Holy Communion to homebound parishioners every Sunday, and our priest will visit on the First Friday of each month. Please call the parish office to make arrangements. The Diocese of Metuchen provides Catholic priests to serve at all local hospitals.



My Dear Friends,

On the first day of the week, the third day of His Passion, Jesus Christ rose from the dead. Today is His day! Many great historical figures have led exemplary lives, taught wise doctrines, and even died for the truth. But **only one** has risen again.

Among the vast array of humanity's greatest heroes, **only** about Jesus Christ can we say: "He rose again on the third day, in fulfillment of the scriptures." This is the fullness of Easter Sunday - the irreversible victory of the Resurrection. The tomb is empty. The stone is overturned. The shadow of the cross is dispelled by the bright morning light of a new creation. Christ's apparent failure has blossomed into victory, just like the seed that disappears under the ground only to rise up again in fresh, new growth.

Only the reality of the Resurrection can explain the reality of the history of the Church: a few weak, non-influential, and uneducated fishermen from Galilee, frightened out of their wits when Jesus was arrested and executed, suddenly become world travelers, phenomenally successful preachers, and valiant martyrs. And the Church they spread continues to spread after they died, holding fast to the exact same doctrine they preached, century after century, in nation after nation.

As we follow Christ, He leads us up to the hill of Calvary, where we die to ourselves in the painful surrender to God's Will - our own Good Fridays. But that death, in fact, gives God's grace room to work in our lives so that we sprout new shoots of wisdom, virtue, and happiness - our own Easter Sundays.

So, let's not just enjoy Easter, let it change our lives. After all, Christ's Resurrection is not just a nice idea; it is the power of eternal life at work in us. Almost every one of us made an effort to live Lent in a special way. Why not do something special in the Easter season? We are given six weeks of Lent of Prayer, Penance and Charity. But we are given eight weeks of the joyous season of Easter! Perhaps as we open our hearts we can do something "beautiful for God."

I would like to extend words of sincere welcome to our brother Stacy who, through the process of RCIA, entered into full communion with the Catholic Church and those who will complete their Sacraments of Initiation. I pray that your faith will grow ever stronger in the Easter Mystery, so together with all the faithful proclaim the truth that "He is Risen" by the way you will live your lives.

On behalf of Deacons Sam and Mickey and the entire parish staff, to all our parishioners, friends and guests who pray with us this Easter Sunday, I would like to wish all of you a blessed and holy Easter! May the gift of Easter renew your faith in the Risen Lord. May the grace of Resurrected Jesus fill your hearts with His peace.
