Parish Information

We welcome you to the Good Shepherd Parish Community!

Please register at the Parish Office as soon as you are able to do so, and the staff will be happy to inform you about our parish and the opportunities we offer. Parish registration is required for religious education, celebration of all Sacraments and certification as a sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation. Regular Sunday worship with us indicates a practicing Catholic, not just parish registration. Attendance is necessary at weekend worship for the all sacraments and certification of sponsorship. Please notify the parish office of any changes in phone numbers, addresses, e-mail addresses or when leaving the parish.

Baptism: All Baptisms are celebrated on the first Sunday of the month at 12noon. The preparation process should begin at least three months before the planned date of the Baptism. A Baptism Preparation Class is required for parents (godparents may attend if they wish). This class is offered on the fourth Sunday of each month at 9:45 AM. Please call the parish office to register. The date of the baptism is scheduled after attending the class. Parish membership and active worship is required for two months prior to preparation.

Religious Education: We provide faith filled instructions for Levels 1st through 8th. There are times, due to Covid-19 we must implement virtual instruction, otherwise our program is offered in person. Special instructions are given for sacramental prepara-

Initiation of Adults and Older Children: This is an extended formation process for unbaptized or uncatechized adults or baptized Christians of other faith traditions who wish to become members of the Catholic Church, as well as for unbaptized or uncatechized school-aged children. Please contact the parish office for more information. Initiation is celebrated at the Easter Vigil after a formation period of one or two years.

Adult Confirmation: This is a program for persons over the age of 18 who have received the Sacraments of Baptism and First Eucharist, but who never completed their initiation with the Sacrament of Confirmation. The program is a 10-12 week program, with Confirmation being celebrated on the Solemnity of Pentecost. Please call the parish office for more details.

Matrimony: Couples wishing to marry in Good Shepherd Parish must be registered members of our parish. They are required to make initial arrangements at least one year in advance. Four sessions with the priest or deacon, as well as Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter take place during this year. Active worship for at least two months are required before a date may be scheduled.

Anointing of the Sick: Anyone who is seriously ill or unable to come to church for a length of time should contact the parish office to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick. Eucharistic Ministers bring Holy Communion to homebound parishioners every Sunday, and our priest will visit on the First Friday of each month. Please call the parish office to make arrangements. The Diocese of Metuchen provides Catholic priests to serve at all local hospitals.


Contributions to the parish can be made in one of the following ways:

Congratulations, Deacon Sam

Deacon Sam was ordained for the Diocese of Metuchen on June 13, 1998. In 2000, Deacon Sam transferred to Holy Spirit Church, and has continued to work here at Good Shepherd since that time.

At the diocesan level, Sam was the Director in the Office of the Diaconate for many years. During his tenure as director, he moved the academic formation program to the Immaculate Conception Seminary at

Seton Hall University. He served as a member of the Synod Preparatory Commission and chaired the Synod Consultation & Planning Committee. He has also served as Associate Director of Formation for the Diaconate Class of 2007 and is a member of the Diaconate Personnel Board. He has been a member of the Future Staffing of Parishes Commission.

In 2013, Deacon Sam founded the "Deacon's Table", a program in which he was assisted by our Deacons Mickey Coppola and Ed Rodes. Included in the support group were a close group of other local deacons and their wives. They served dinners to the needy and anyone who wished to come to the hall first at Holy Spirit and then at Good Shepherd Parish. They provided meals on Wednesday evenings in all kinds of weather until 2018. It was once calculated that they served about 11,000 wholesome Italian meals complete with salad, coffee and dessert. It often served as the only source of comfort and socialization for many of this community.

Sam holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Seton Hall University and a Certificate in Diaconal Ministry from St. Elizabeth College. He retired from Merck & Co., Inc, after 31 years of service in the year 2000. He was a director in the Information Technology organization. He resides with his wife of 56 years, Sarah, in Edison and has three adult children, Annette, Andrea, and Anthony, along with five grandchildren, Alyssa, Cara, Michael, Sara, and Alexandra.

The Parish community of Good Shepherd is lucky to have Deacon Sam with us. Much good luck in the future, Deacon Sam. Congratulations on your 25th Anniversary of Ordination to the Diaconate.

What do you know? Is it OK to leave Mass after communion?

No. It's really not. Because it's not just about us. It's not OK to leave Thanksgiving dinner at Grandma's early because it's not just about eating good food, seeing the relatives once a year, and letting them see how big (or thin or old or pretty) you've become. It's about family, loving, and being loved even if—especially if—you and they are not perfect. It's about tradition, hearing the old stories and the new ones and adding yours; it's about recalling the past while the present surrounds you and the future lurks nearby. It's not OK to leave until the dessert and coffee and maybe an after-dinner drink because it's not just about you; it's about all of you as a family. So you stay until it's over, and you say goodbye with hugs and kisses and leave with a renewed understanding of what being part of this family means.

The Mass and Thanksgiving dinner have much in common, but the Mass is so much more. It is our celebration of the paschal mystery, the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ for the salvation of the world. We gather as God's family, the church, holy and imperfect, to hear again the story of how God has loved us and pursued us throughout history to this very day. In praying for the whole church and its needs, for the whole world, for those who suffer and those who die, we learn that we are to be mindful of them and to serve them. As we offer our thanks and praise for all God has done for us and given us, we come to recognize God's greatest gift to us, Jesus Christ, who feeds and strengthens us in the form of bread and wine, the body and blood he gave for the life of the world.

The Mass not only celebrates our faith, it teaches us what we believe and how we are to live. That is why we can't leave Mass after communion. Because communion is not just about us and our salvation. It's about the salvation of the world. In celebrating and receiving the Eucharist, "We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your resurrection until you come again." Who are we professing our faith to? Not just to ourselves but to the world. We become part of the story of how much God loves all people and wants them to know God through Christ.

If we leave Mass before the dismissal, we miss out on celebrating and being taught why we celebrate the Eucharist in the first place. We are fed and strengthened on the body and blood of Christ not only for ourselves but also for all those he gave his life for. We are dismissed from Mass not because it's over, but because we have work to do. We are to go to the world to proclaim Christ. And so we stay to the end of Mass to be blessed and commissioned: "Go and announce the gospel of the Lord." "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life."
