My Dear Friends in Christ,

The financial statements presented here (<u>Good Shepherd Parish</u> – <u>Statement of Church Revenues and Expenses for the Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2022)</u> reflect our Parish's operating results for the prior fiscal year. They are based on the 14-page Diocesan Report that was submitted on August 31, 2022.

Here are some high-level summary points to consider while reviewing the information in the enclosed statements:

- Our collections revenues (Weekend, Holy Days, Christmas and Easter) were \$342,898, or 75% of the Parish's total revenues. Collections decreased 2% from last year.
- Fundraising & Other Income (e.g., Golf Outing, PPP Loan Forgiveness, Project & "Earmarked" donations Liturgy/Worship, etc.) accounted for 17% of total revenues.
- ➤ Our average weekly revenues were \$8,700 [collections were \$6,600 of that total] compared to average weekly expenses of \$9,800, resulting in approximately a \$57,000 decrease in our savings reserve for the year.
- > Salaries, Diocesan Assessment/Collections & Bishop's Appeal, Contracted Services, Utilities, and Repairs/Renovations were our largest expenses for the year, accounting for 71% of total expenses.
- > The capitalized expenditures were just under \$100,000 last year, which included roof repairs and rectory renovations for the offices, bathrooms, 2<sup>nd</sup> floor bedrooms, and laundry room.
- The \$535,000 loan from the Diocese for replacement of the church roof was paid in full in April, along with \$36,000 due to the diocese for the loan's interest. We were able to make this payment thanks to funds raised by the Capital Campaign and the rental income the Parish is receiving for the Holy Spirit School building. By paying off the Diocese Loan early, we were able to save the Parish at least \$50,000 of additional interest that would have been owed to the Diocese.
- To date, \$550,000 (just over 90% of our \$600,000 goal) has been pledged to the Capital Campaign and \$385,000 (70% of the amount pledged) has been received.

I cannot begin to express my gratitude to those of you that have pledged and contributed to the campaign. However, despite the roof being paid for, we are still in need of the remaining amounts that were pledged. In the near future, we will have to pay for the replacement of the Rectory roof, repairs to the furnace and air-conditioning, refurbishment of the church pews, and repairs/renovation to the church hall (including replacement of the doors). Given the work that is still required, there is a very real need for the completion of the Capital Campaign. We would also like to encourage the newer members of our Parish (that joined after the initial pledges) to consider pledging now — it's not too late to support.

As I start the fourth year of my assignment as Administrator of Good Shepherd Parish, these financial statements highlight our accomplishments in the past year as well as the challenges that lay ahead of us which we can overcome together as a parish community.

As we are distancing ourselves from the darkest days of the pandemic, we continue to resume church social events that are highlights of the year for many of us. This past year, we were able to hold our inaugural Golf outing, host the Church Picnic, and celebrate the 10-year anniversary of Good Shepherd Parish's formation. For the upcoming year, we look forward to once again having the International Dinner, Church Raffle, Festa, and Tricky Tray. Additionally, I'd like to make note of the following information (which is not included in the report to the Diocese) related to events that carry great significance to our Parish community. In the past year, there were: 15 Baptisms, 9 First Communions, 3 RCIA candidates confirmed, 2 marriages, and 24 funerals at our Parish.

I would like to thank all the members of the Finance Council for their hard work throughout the year — Carolina Chichester, Ben Salerno, Ricardo Ferri, Kareen Mann and Marc Groshen. I also want to offer a special thank you to Marie Acciani, who has resigned her role of business manager/bookkeeper after many years of serving the Parish Community. Finally, I would like to welcome Anna Krasowska who has joined the church staff and assumed the position of business manager/bookkeeper.

Per the Diocese, Cemetery Funds **CANNOT** be used for Church expenses and Church Funds **CANNOT** be used on Cemetery expenses.

\*Perpetual Care funds are to be used only for cemetery purposes. Funds are held in escrow and are to be used once there is no longer anyone available to care for the cemetery.
