COVID-19 Protocol for Reopening Parish Halls in the Archdiocese of Kingston

I'm pleased to announce that on Thursday of this week, we were notified by the Archdiocese of Kingston that our Parish Hall may be reopening to the public with certain restrictions.

Permitted Uses as outlined by the Archdiocese:

The following uses of the parish hall are permitted:

Meetings of the parish staff

Meetings of parish committees (e.g. Parish Pastoral Council)

Meetings of parish ministry groups (e.g. bible study, RCIA)

Meetings of other parish groups (e.g. CWL, K of C, SSVP)

Other groups that were using the parish hall prior to the pandemic (e.g. AA)

Blood donor clinics

Some parishes offered exercise classes prior to the pandemic. If so, such classes are permitted if your area is in Phase Three of reopening, but with the added measure that the physical distance requirement is increased to a minimum of three meters (10 feet).

Private events (e.g. wedding receptions, showers, funeral luncheons) are not permitted.

New activities are not permitted to start in the parish hall at this time unless approved by the Chancery.

In concert with the provincial guidelines and local health officials, parish halls will reopen to the public in those regions that moved to Phase Three and where the protocols can be fol-





lowed. Our region has moved to Phase Three a number of weeks ago. This protocol will be reviewed regularly to determine when expanded parish hall uses can be permitted.

All regulations with respect to physical distancing and all precautions with respect to personal sanitation and cleaning of the parish hall are in effect. Physical distancing requires the established norm of two meters (six feet) until further notice. The maximum number of persons permitted to gather in the hall will be determined based on the planned layout of the hall for the event. The setup of the room must permit enough room for attendees to enter, exit, and move about, while maintaining physical distancing requirements, before, during, and after the gathering.

Committees, groups, and special event coordinators wishing to organize a gathering in any part of our Parish Hall are asked to please contact Al MacEachern (Tel: 613-913-2104 or Email: allen.maceachern1@gmail.com) to schedule the meeting or events as well as to schedule training for those who will be accountable and responsible. Approval of your proposed setup as well as training regarding the covid-19 protocol in our Parish Hall (which includes the necessary sanitization after the event) is mandatory. At this time the diocese has not given permission for food or beverages to be served in our Parish Halls.

Given that our Halls can be opened to the public, this is good news as we can start exploring the possibilities of gathering for these essential meetings and sessions for the good of the life of our parish.
