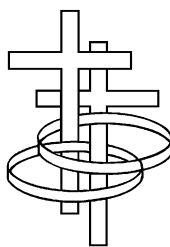

How to Become a Saint

It was Saint Peter who, after reflecting on this prophecy: "May another take his office." (Psalm 109:8b), directed the approximately 120 brothers to nominate someone to take Judas' place after he hanged himself after betraying Jesus. The only criterion was that the candidate had to have been with them throughout our Lord's earthly ministry. They proposed two men: Joseph, called Barsabbas, also known as Justus, and Matthias; after praying they drew lots which they took as the sign God has chosen Matthias. (The white smoke came centuries later; besides, this was not a papal election for Peter's replacement) Before the 1960's liturgical reforms of Vatican II, the Feast of Saint Matthias was February 24. It was moved to May 14. Why? The Acts of the Apostles (1:15-26) records show, after Christ's Ascension, the Apostles and others gathered with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, in the Upper Room where they had eaten the Last Supper. This was the Church's first novena, nine days of intense prayers, from the Ascension to the Coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. The Feast of St. Matthias now often falls during the time he was actually added to the college of Apostles!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**Pentecost**

The roots of today's "birthday of the Church" are in an ancient Jewish festival of springtime harvest, seven weeks after Passover. Now, seven weeks after Easter, our great fifty days of rejoicing come to an end. In the countries where the Church first came to life, this is a time of harvest, and the first fruits appear: apricots and lemons, cherries and strawberries. Even in our gardens, herbs are abundant and asparagus, that close relation of the Easter lily, comes fresh to our tables. The earth is laden with so much new life, and that has always been a sign to Christians of Easter's glory.

Pentecost means "fifty" and our fifty days of Easter joy are complete. This Sunday is a day to savor the glory of Easter once more: picnics and cookouts, walks by the water, time in the garden—are all ways of extending the feast. Notice the paschal candle today, still burning during Mass. Our Easter celebration now complete, the candle will soon be moved to a place near the baptismal font, and be lighted at baptisms and funerals as a silent witness to Christ's abiding presence.

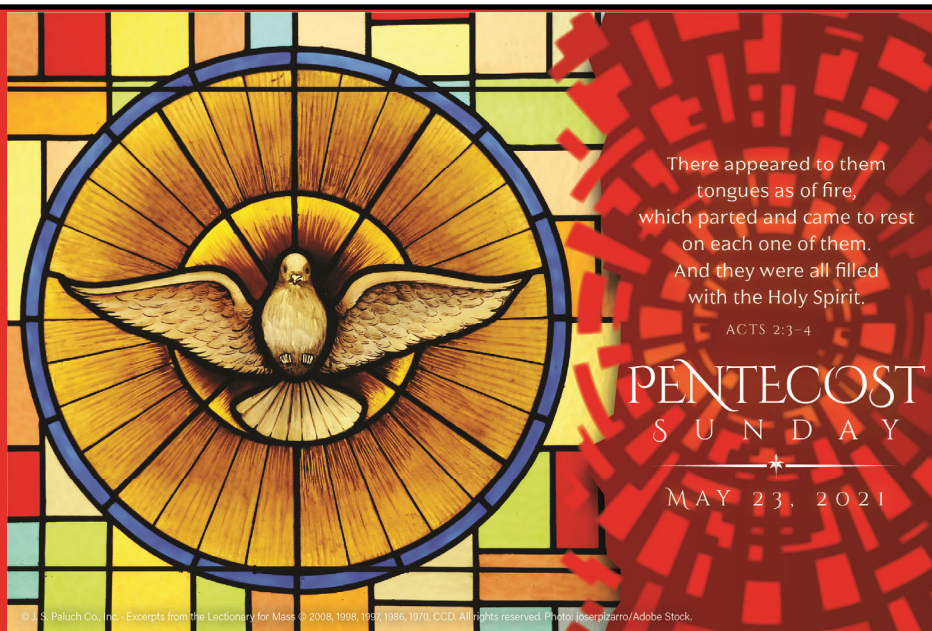

As followers of Jesus, we are called to direct our minds and hearts to Christ's love, turning away from all that is not of God in order to be more Christ-like in our daily lives. The more we invite the Holy Spirit to draw us close to God's heart, the more readily we will avoid sin and choose life, faith, and love. In the letter to the Galatians, we hear a list of things that those who live in the Spirit are to avoid. Things like immorality, hatred, jealousy, and selfishness. At first glance, we might think to ourselves, "of course I want to avoid those things," and yet, if we are honest with ourselves, we likely recognize some of those patterns in our lives. Upon further reflection, however, we also see that these negative behaviors pose temporary pleasure while the fruits of the Spirit—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control—lead to a life of deep and lasting fulfillment.

NOTHING WILL STAND IN THE WAY

The Jewish people who had gathered in Jerusalem for the festival of Pentecost came from every corner of the world.

SPIRITUAL EXCERPT

Sport at the Service of the Spirit

"Sport, properly directed, develops character, makes a man courageous, a generous loser, and a gracious victor; it refines the senses, gives intellectual penetration, and steels the will to endurance. It is not merely a physical development then. Sport, rightly understood, is an occupation of the whole man, and while perfecting the body as an instrument of the mind, it also makes the mind itself a more refined instrument for the search and communication of truth and helps man to achieve that end to which all others must be subservient, the service and praise of his Creator."

Pope Pius XII, "Sport at the Service of the Spirit"

They spoke many languages and yet were drawn to hear the message of Christ from the disciples who had just experienced the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. They were astonished by what they heard—not only the message, but the way in which it was conveyed, in their own language, and by the messengers, people whom they would have considered ordinary and unremarkable, rather than the acknowledged religious leaders of their time. We, too, are called to share the love and mercy of Christ through word and action, even when we feel small and insignificant. We need only to look at the witness and experience of those first disciples and all the saints who have preceded us to know that we are capable of much when we place our lives in God's hands. Nothing can stand in the way of the incredible love of God when we are filled with the power and presence of the Holy Spirit!
