WHAT'S HAPPENING AT ST. JOHN'S

Just to keep you updated about what's happening:

- 1. The gym pipe repair has been completed at a cost of \$4,850.
- 2. Gym Floor repair estimates obtained through the Archdiocese \$12,000 for the damage caused by the pipe leak. The Archdiocese is reviewing the proposal prior to approval.
- 3. The Convent had some plumbing issues which have been completed.
- 4. Painting of 2 rooms in the Convent has been completed.
- 5. The boiler leak which started in October and recurred again two days before Christmas required replacement of the tank. A temporary leak stoppage was put in place while awaiting a new tank. The delay in installation was a manufacturing/supply chain issue. The tank costs \$15,070 and was installed this week.

Why do Catholics fast from meat?

This ancient tradition stems, ultimately, from love. Friday is to Sunday what Lent is to Easter.

The Church has always celebrated each and every Sunday as a mini-Easter. In harmony with that, Fridays are meant to be days of penance as a reminder of the $_{\text{FRI:}}$ $_{\text{Gn 3:1-8/Ps 32:1-2, 5, 6, 7/Mk 7:31-37}}$ Passion which Jesus suffered for us on Good Friday.

The first and most important practice for Friday penance is that of abstaining from meat. While this is no longer obligatory outside of Lent, the U.S. bishops have nonetheless strongly recommended it, and stated that another act of piety or penance should be done in its place if we are unable to do the meat fast.

Why? Well

From the first century, the day of the crucifixion has been traditionally observed as a day of abstaining from flesh meat...to honor Christ who sacrificed his flesh on a Friday. —Catholic Source Book by Rev. Peter Klein

Furthermore, when the no-meat tradition first began, it appears that meat was special, a real treat, even celebratory—the Scriptures speak of "slaughtering the fattened calf" for a feast or celebration. Giving up meat was an important reminder that Christ suffered His Passion and death for us on a Friday. It was a way of loving and thanking Him, with this small gift of abstaining from something special.

Today, of course, meat isn't a rare commodity. It is easy to get, in many forms, and is sometimes even passed up for something more fancy, such as a fish delicacy.

This does not, however, mean that abstaining from meat on Fridays is pointless or not as helpful in our spiritual lives. The spirit of abstinence, the reason for a sacrifice on that day, remains just as important.

Most people still love meat, and the time and effort it takes to give up easy access to a quick meal (and the intention it takes to select a meatless one) is one more reason why it's a solid sacrifice.

St. Josephine Bakhita | February 8

The story of St. Josephine Bakhita (1869-1947) is a story that many people taken into slavery have experienced. Born in the Darfur region of Sudan, she was kidnapped at the age of 8 and sold into slavery many times. As she passed from owner to owner, she experienced the moral and physical humiliations associated with slavery. It was only at the age of 13 that her suffering was alleviated after she was bought for the Italian Consul in Sudan. It was here that she was fortunate to receive kindness, respect, and peace from her new master.

She was later handed over to the Canossian Sisters when she made the case that slavery had been outlawed in Italy for years. She was baptized and confirmed in the Catholic Church in 1890. where she took the name Josephine. She later entered the Institute of St. Magdalene of Canossa in 1893 and made her profession three years later. St. Josephine Bakhita's next 50 years were spent people through cooking, embroidery, and housekeeping. She was a source of encouragement and her constant smile won people's hearts, as did her humility and simplicity. Today she is known as the patron saint of victims of modern slavery and human trafficking. ©LPi
