FASTING

Are Catholics still required to fast prior to reception of Holy Communion? The General Rule is that Catholics **should fast for one hour** from solid food and beverages, with the exception of water, before going to Holy Communion. The period of fast is reduced for those who are sick, in the hospital, advanced in age and for those caring for them.

Why did Zacchaeus climb the sycamore tree? The tax collector took part in a living parable.

Being short is sometimes a real inconvenience. Zacchaeus, at least, felt plagued as he stretched up on to his toes—craned his neck—and squinted his eyes—anything to try to see through or around the crowd. Nothing worked. He was too short to see much. This was terrible! He must see the Miracle Man who brought healing and peace wherever He went! The crowd was too thick, though, and everyone—it seemed—was head and shoulders above Zacchaeus. No one would move for him; besides, they looked at him and growled, “Dirty tax-collector...”

There was only one thing to be done.

Zacchaeus left the crowd surrounding the Man called Jesus and ran ahead to where a sycamore spread its branches out over the road. He climbed up and shim-mied out on a limb, perched precariously—but now he could see Jesus clearly.

The significance of this small man’s action is huge. Zacchaeus was a publican, despised by the Jews because he exacted taxes from them and grew rich on their money. Yet Zacchaeus, the sinner, climbed a tree to see Jesus—a tree! What does that tree remind you of? That’s right, the Tree of the Cross—the Tree that lifts us up to supernatural heights, to Christ Himself.

Zacchaeus, of course, could not know this as he hung in the sycamore. He was busy trying not to fall from the branches in surprise and joy because Jesus looked up at him and said, “Zacchaeus, make haste and come down; for this day I must abide in thy house.”

Thanks to a tree—or should we say, the Tree—Christ had found a home in Zacchaeus’s newly-converted heart.

Which spiritual book was St. Thérèse’s favorite?

“It’s such a widely-read spiritual work, it’s second only to the Bible. You’ve probably guessed which work we’re talking about. It’s ***The Imitation of Christ*** by Thomas à Kempis.

Thomas published his book in the 15th century. Before long, the book was widely popular. Readers were astonished and inspired by the profound spiritual truths and guides it contained. The Imitation of Christ became the favorite of many saints, religious and laity alike.

A few centuries later St. Thérèse said of it, “It was the only book which helped me for I had not as yet discovered the treasures which are hidden in Sacred Scriptures. I carried this little book around with me at all times.”

A Young St. Thérèse

St. Thérèse knew *The Imitation of Christ* so well that, even as a young girl, she could recite any random page from it upon command.



The Imitation of Christ is a guide into the interior life. It gives us the tools necessary for drawing closer to God, defining what the interior life is, how to attain it, and why it is necessary for every Christian. For example, it tells us how to turn worldliness into godliness—the first step upon which everything else depends.

The book is divided into four parts: 1) Useful admonitions for a spiritual life; 2) Admonitions concerning spiritual things; 3) Interior consolation; and 4) the Blessed Sacrament. Each part educates, exhorts, and admonishes the reader, offering meditations and practical actions.

St. Thérèse would agree with another great and holy saint: St. Thomas More. CONFIRMATION SPONSOR

Question: What are the requirements for being a confirmation sponsor?

Answer: Although many dioceses have specific requirements for who can be a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Code of Canon Law identifies certain requirements that are true for all dioceses and parishes. First, the sponsor should be chosen by the one to be confirmed (or, in some cases, by the parents or even the pastor). Second, a sponsor must be at least sixteen years old (unless the local bishop has chosen another age, or a special exception has been made). Third, the sponsor must be a Catholic who has been confirmed and who has already received the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Beyond this, they must lead "a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on." Fourth, they can have no sort of canonical penalty or impediment. Finally, they cannot be either the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (See *Canons 893, §1 and 874, §1*). In some cultures, it is customary for one of the confirmand's godparents to act as sponsor, although this is not required by Church law. To learn about the requirements for your parish or diocese, you can consult your pastor or your parish or diocesan director of religious education or the diocese's office liturgy and worship. ©LPi

PSALM RESPONSE QUESTION

People have inquired, "Why does the cantor sing all the songs from the podium, but sings the Psalm response from the pulpit?" Since the Book of Psalms is part of Sacred Scripture, they are Canonical, "the words of God." Since the pulpit is reserved for reading the Word of God (Sacred Scripture), the cantor sings the Psalms from the pulpit. All other songs are sung from the podium.
