## RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The Falling Action and the Field

In my freshman year of high school, I was fairly miserable at identifying the five essential elements of plot (exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution).

To this day, the only reason I remember anything about them at all is because my English teacher used episodes of Scooby Doo to illustrate the different elements. Falling action vs. climax is where I got tripped up, the two are similar, and only discernible if you examine them relative to each other.

Every Scooby Doo episode has a big dramatic sequence (the climax) where the ghost/monster/zombie chases The Gang through the haunted mansion. The falling action is what comes immediately after: searching for her glasses that she lost during the chase, Velma bumps into a pulley wheel disguised behind a tapestry and realizes the ghost/monster/zombie is actually the janitor in a costume, hooked up to an elaborate cable system jerry-rigged throughout the mansion. Meddling kids. I confused the two because, to me, they are both equally dramatic: the chase and the fallout.

It occurs to me that, if you look at the course of salvation history, we are living in the falling action, not the climax. Take the parable of the treasure in the field: we have found the treasure. But we haven't yet bought the field. I often make the mistake of thinking I am still lost in the climax, searching for the truth. But I know exactly where the truth is.

What I need to be concerned with is this: am I doing what I need to do to buy the field?

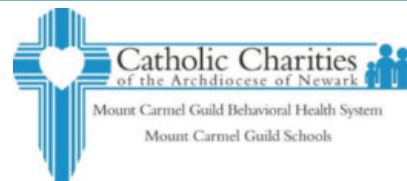
## ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK PILGRIMAGE

## St. Peregrine Laziosi Novena Prayed Every First Friday of the Month After 9:00am Mass



All are invited to join us in the church every First Friday following 9:00 a.m. Mass for devotional prayers to St. Peregrine. Peregrine Laziosi was born of a wealthy family at Forli, Italy, in 1260. As a youth he was active in politics as a member of the anti-papal party. During one uprising, which the Pope sent St. Philip Benizi to mediate, Philip was struck in the face by Peregrine. When Philip offered the other cheek, Peregrine was so overcome that he repented and converted to Catholicism. Following the instructions of the Virgin

Mary received in a vision, Peregrine went to Siena and joined the Servites. He had a reputation for fervent preaching and being a good confessor. When he was afflicted with cancer of the foot and amputation had been decided upon, he spent the night before the operation, in prayer. The following morning he was completely cured. This miracle caused his reputation to become widespread. He died in 1345 at the age of eighty-five, and he was canonized in 1726. St. Peregrine relic will also be available for a special blessing.

### What is a "votive" Mass?

- What does a priest often do if there is no feast day?
- It doesn't directly correspond to the liturgical calendar like other Masses do.
- It encourages devotion to the saints and mysteries of the Church.

#### What is a "votive" Mass and why is it so important?

A votive Mass is a type of Mass to honor Our Lord, Our Lady, a saint, or a mystery of the Faith at other times besides their assigned feast days. A priest can celebrate a votive Mass on any weekday during Ordinary Time where there is an optional memorial or no other feast.

There are certain days of the week that are traditionally devoted to a specific mystery or saint. For instance, Our Lady is honored on Saturdays, St. Joseph on Wednesdays, and the Trinity on Mondays. The Church uses votive Masses to honor her greatest saints and mysteries and encourage the faithful's devotion to them.

Some parishes also have particular devotions and special patrons and want to celebrate them outside of the regular feast days. With votive Masses, this is possible.

The liturgy is rich with meaning and contains the greatest Mystery of all: Jesus Christ becoming present in the Eucharist. It is important to understand the different ways the Mass can be celebrated and to take advantage of the numerous devotions and traditions the Church has to offer.

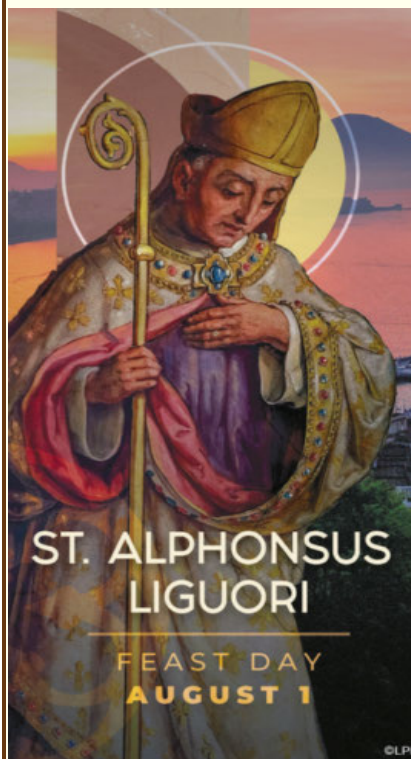

## St. Alphonsus Liguori | August 1



Saint Alphonsus was born into a well-respected family in 1696, in Marianella, in the Kingdom of Naples. He received an exceptional education through private tutors and was conferred degrees in civil and canon law at 16. He practiced law for 8 years before he turned to the Church. He was ordained a priest in 1726.

Saint Alphonsus traveled for 26 years in Kingdom of Naples preaching. His style of ministry was called "mission among the people," he and a group of priests or lay brothers would go to rural areas, staying

for a time to teach, preach, and pray with the people there.

Saint Alphonsus was a brilliant preacher, he was able to connect with ordinary people and his teaching and sermons were marked by his compassion. In a time of restrictive Church rule, where fear of God was truly fear, Saint Alphonsus taught about God's redeeming love. He also had a special devotion to Mary, praying to her for intercession and including devotions to her in his teaching. He wrote extensively, more than 100 books which have been through thousands of editions. His books are still available today and have been translated into more than 60 languages.

In 1762 Saint Alphonsus was made a bishop by Pope Clement XIII, however, he was eventually allowed to resign his post because of his ill health. He was paralyzed for a time from rheumatic fever in 1775, and had rheumatism so severe it was deforming, bending his head so far forward that his chin rested on his chest.

He died peacefully at the age of 90 in 1787. He was canonized in 1839 by Pope Gregory XVI, and in 1871 he was named a doctor of the church by Pope Pius IX. In 1950 he was declared patron of moral theologians by Pope Pius XII.
