August 27, 2023

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isn't it a bit weird that Catholics call the Pope "papa," father? This Sunday provides us with essential Scriptural background on the papacy, the petrine office. Jesus gives Peter the "keys to the kingdom of heaven," after witnessing to the special grace Peter has to know Jesus' true identity. Many have pointed out that the "keys" refer back to the figure of Eliakim, King David's prime minister. True enough. But notice this is not mere authority or power. It's a family relationship. The Lord says to Eliakim, "He shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem" (Isaiah 22:21). David's prime minister was a spiritual *father* to the family of Israel. Peter, and his successors, will be spiritual fathers in the family of the Church.

This means we have a serious obligation to not only recognize the Pope's authority, but also to love him with the affection of children for their papa. We should never speak about him with disrespect or rancor. We should listen to him with trusting hearts, and ignore the slander thrown at him in various media. When we show the world we are loving and obedient to our Holy Papa, perhaps they'll see more clearly that the Church is indeed God's beloved family. ~ Father John Muir ©LPi

IMPORTANT FRUITS

KIWI: Tiny but mighty. This is a good source of potassium, magnesium, vitamin E & fiber. Its vitamin C content is twice that of an orange.

WATERMELON: Coolest thirst quencher. Composed of 92% water, it is also packed with a giant dose of glutathione, which helps boost our immune system. They are also a key source of lycopene * the cancer fighting oxidant. Other nutrients found in watermelon are vitamin C and Potassium.

GUAVA & PAPAYA: Top awards for vitamin C. They are the clear winners for their high vitamin C content. Guava is also rich in fiber, which helps prevent constipation. Papaya is rich in carotene; this is good for your eyes.

Why do white petals fall from the ceiling of St. Mary Major every year?

A beautiful legend surrounds the founding of one of the most important churches in the world.

St. Mary Major, or, in Italian, Santa Maria Maggiore, is one of the four major, or papal, basilicas. These are all found in Rome and include St. Peter's, St. John Lateran, and St. Paul Outside the Walls.

St. Mary Major is sometimes called St. Mary of the Snows or Our Lady of the Snows. Its alternate titles trace their origin to the incredible legend of its founding in the 4th century, which tells of the Roman patrician John and his wife who were without heirs. They prayed to Our Lady to show them how they might use their riches for her honor. Our Lady then designated the place of the Basilica through a snowfall on the crest of the Esquiline Hill—a miraculous occurrence, since it was summer! Both John and Pope Liberius received visions informing them of the event and, upon finding the snowfall, the Holy Father marked out the place of the future church. Hence another of its titles: the Liberian Basilica.

The current structure was dedicated by Sixtus III on the 5th of August, 434. Built during the time directly after the Council of Ephesus, which confirmed Our Lady's title as Theotokos, the God-bearer, the Basilica stands as a monument to the Church's ancient and undying devotion to the Mother of God. Every year on the feast of its dedication, a "snowfall" of white petals is released from the ceiling of the Basilica during Mass to commemorate its founding. In addition to its magnificent 5th century mosaics, the Basilica also houses a far greater treasure. A relic of Our Lord's crib is kept under the high altar: several slats of wood in which He rested the night of His Nativity. This crypt is also the final resting place of the great St. Jerome, who translated the Bible into Latin and spent his last days in Bethlehem.

St. Mary Major also contains the miraculous Marian icon Salus Populi Romani which, according to legend, was painted from life by St. Luke, using wood from the table of the Holy Family. Its title translates to "Health (or Salvation) of the Roman People," and it has been venerated by popes and pilgrims for centuries.

The striking beauty of Marian imagery serves as a powerful reminder to seek her motherly intercession. Whether it depicts a certain devotion or simply the overwhelming beauty of Mary's serene countenance, Marian art is a powerful tool for prayer and meditation. This beautiful antique white rendition of Michelangelo's Pieta shows Our Blessed Mother tenderly cradling her Son, Our Lord, after His death on the cross.

CONVALIDATION

Were you married civilly by a mayor or justice of the peace and would now like to be married in the Catholic Church? See Fr. Bryan for more details and to see if your marriage can be regularized with the Church.

Godparent [Sponsor] Requirements

Canon [Church] law states a godparent [sponsor] must:

- Be a Baptized and confirmed Roman Catholic who attends weekly Mass and receives Eucharist
- Be at least 16 years of age
- Not be one of the parents
- Lead a moral life in keeping with Church teaching, and be a good Catholic role model
- If married, be married according to Church law
- Be a registered member of their own current parish from which they must obtain an eligibility certificate; we can only give eligibility certificates to those registered in our parish!

Since only one Roman Catholic godparent is required, a baptized member of another Christian church [but not a Roman Catholic] may serve as a Christian Witness. Since godparents renew their baptismal promises during the Rite of Baptism, a non-baptized person cannot serve in this role.

What is the Saint Monica Club?

If you're suffering the pain of a child leaving the Faith, you might feel very alone. But you're not.

A mother sits beside an open window, the morning sun streaming in as it always does and falling warmly on the gentle wrinkles of her folded hands. She closes her eyes and prays for her son. She misses him. He has long since grown up and moved away, but he had always been her little boy, hiding behind the doorposts and filling the hallways with his mischievous laughter.

She is a devout Christian and has done her best to raise her son in the Faith. But he left home to study in a big city, fell under bad influences, and is now leading a life of egregious sin. She thinks about him all the time and prays for him just as often, but it doesn't look like he is coming back to the Faith any time soon.

To many mothers, this story sounds all too familiar.

Well, that mother was St. Monica...her son was St. Augustine...and their story took place 1,600 years ago. If you're a mother praying for a prodigal child, you aren't the first, and you're certainly not alone.

St. Monica has become synonymous with persistent, unflinching prayer for fallen-away family members. Her "club"—as Maggie Green calls it in her book *Saint Monica Club*—includes all devoted mothers who have ever experienced the pain of seeing a child leave the Faith and who have prayed without ceasing for their return.

In this book, Maggie Green (herself a member of "the club") discusses how to stay constant in prayer, how to talk to fallen-away children and relatives, and how to hold fast to the virtue of hope when things look really bleak.

Yes, St. Augustine did return to the Faith. It took a while, but it happened. Not only did he convert; he became one of the greatest Fathers of the Church and one of her most prolific and influential teachers.

Don't give up hope. Your tears and prayers are all known to God, and St. Monica is always interceding for the mothers in her club. Draw renewed strength from the wisdom and experience of a fellow club-member and keep fighting the good fight for your child.


