## THE INCORRUPTIBLES

The incorruption of certain saints' bodies is a remarkable phenomenon. Preserved bodies found in countries around the world can be divided into three classifications: 1) The deliberately preserved, 2) the accidentally preserved, and 3) *the incorruptibles*. Specimens of the accidentally or naturally preserved were found before Egyptian Pharaoh times, when the art of embalming originated, producing for the first time the deliberately treated mummies which have survived for as many as three thousand years. *The incorruptibles*, however, have existed only since early Christian days. Their preservations since that time have challenged the opinions of skeptics and contradicted and defied the laws of nature, all to the dismay of many examining physicians and the admiration of succeeding generations. The more carefully we consider the preservation of *the incorruptible*, the more baffling does the subject become, for their conservation seems to be neither dependent on the manner of burial, nor on the temperature or place of interment. Nor were they adversely affected by extended delays between the time of death and their burials, by moisture in the tombs, by rough handling, by frequent transferences, by covering with quicklime, or by their proximity to decaying corpses. The greater majority were never embalmed or treated in any manner, yet most were found life like, flexible, and sweetly scented, many years after death, in sharp contrast to the specimens of the other two classifications above, who without exception were found stiff, discolored, and skeletal. The mystery of their preservations is further compounded by the observance of blood and clear oils - which have proceeded from a number of these holy relics - a phenomenon which again, needless to say, was never recorded with regard to the deliberately or accidentally preserved.

Fifty-six years following the death of **ST. CATHERINE LABOURE** (1806-1876), her body was found perfectly white and natural looking, even though her triple coffin had been affected in various ways by excessive moisture. The body of **ST. CATHERINE OF SIENA** (1347-1380), also endured abuses from dampness, but was found unaffected after it had been placed in a cemetery where Bl. Raymond of Capua found that "it was much exposed to the rain." Her burial garments were said to have suffered severely from dampness.

**ST. BERNADETTE SOUBIROUS** (1844-1879), The body was first exhumed thirty years after her death. On September 22, 1909, in the presence of representatives appointed by the postulaters of the cause, two doctors, and the sisters of the community, the coffin was removed by workmen from the place where it had been entombed thirty years before. On opening the lid, they discerned, no odor and the virginal body lay exposed, completely victorious over the laws of nature. *The aforementioned saints are only a fraction of the many saints venerated by the Catholic Church whose bodies are incorrupt.* Catholics are privileged, indeed, not only to have these unique relics, but also to be able to look upon the very faces of these religious paragons who fought a good fight, who finished the course of life in a most edifying manner, and who kept and practiced the Faith to a heroic degree.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Christopher Columbus felt called by God to discover new lands and bring them to the Catholic Faith. The literal meaning of the name "Christopher" is "Christ-bearer." (Christo, from the Greek word Christos meaning "Christ" and -pher, from the Greek word pherein, to "carry"). From his youth, Columbus felt that his name would be prophetic.

After his discovery of the New World in 1492, returning to Spain, Columbus encountered a fearful storm on his departure from San Salvador (which means Holy Savior). Praying to Our Lady to save his fleet, a request that was indeed granted to him, he promised to make a pilgrimage to Guadalupe, her great shrine in Spain, after he arrived home.

On his second journey to the New World, he named a beautiful Caribbean island Santa Maria De Guadalupe (Holy Mary of Guadalupe), now known by its French name Guadeloupe. Thirty-eight years later, the apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary to an Aztec Indian named Juan Diego graced the Americas. This miraculous event was responsible for the mass conversion of Mexico to the True Faith.

The name of Columbus' little fleet form a sentence that prophesied the miraculous image of Our Lady on Juan Diego's cloak. In Spanish, *La Nina, Santa Maria, se Pinta*, means, *The girl, Holy Mary, painted herself*.

### Back in Columbus's day,

#### did people think the earth was flat?

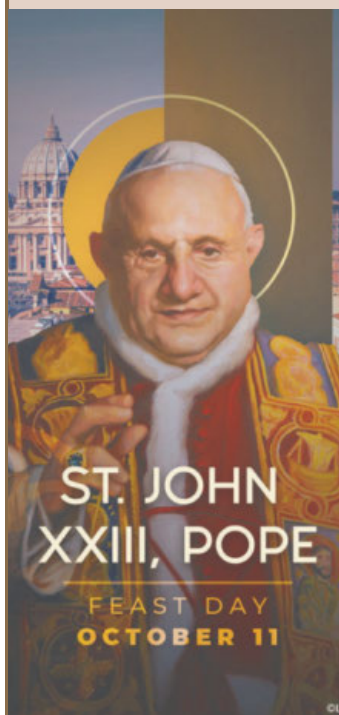
**Let's set the record straight on this common misconception.** No educated person believed the earth was flat in 1492, when "Columbus sailed the ocean blue." As Dr. Michael Foley explains in his delightful work [\*The Politically Incorrect Guide to Christianity\*](#): "...the truth is that no educated Westerner or sailor at the time thought such a thing; the only point of contention was the size of the earth's circumference, which Columbus had vastly underestimated. The crown's geographers advised Queen Isabella against backing Columbus's voyage not because they were superstitious ignoramuses but because they had calculated that Columbus could not reach China in the manner he proposed (and they were right)." In fact, it's the Catholic Church that has been the greatest supporter of the sciences throughout history, and such institutions as the Vatican Observatory—Rome's center for astronomical research—stand as living testaments to her love for exploring God's marvelous creation. Many names you will doubtless recognize have been both happy members of the Catholic Church and brilliant scientists: people like Copernicus, Albert the Great, and Louis Pasteur.

### Saint John XXIII, Pope | October 11



Saint John XIII was born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli on November 25, 1881, in a small village in Italy. He was ordained in 1904 and later earned a doctorate in canon law. During World War I he served as a stretcher-bearer and chaplain for the Italian army. Beginning in 1925 he served as a Vatican diplomat, first in Bulgaria, then in Greece and Turkey. From 1935 through the Second World War he helped save thousands of Jewish people. In 1944 he was named papal nuncio to France. He was named cardinal and appointed patriarch of Venice in 1953. A quiet pastoral life passing into retirement, however, was not in God's plan for the saint.

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was elected Pope in 1958 and took the name John. His papacy was short, but full of action. He transformed the Vatican, calling for openness, a spirit of ecumenism, and the setting aside of politics. He called the Second Vatican Council in the fall of 1962, the first meeting of its kind in almost a century, setting the agenda to work for the spiritual regeneration of the Church. His efforts changed the face of the Catholic Church. At the same time worked diligently and publicly to ease tensions during the Cuban missile crisis, pleading with leaders for the end of the Cold War.

Saint John XXIII's kindness, sense of pastoral care, and works of reconciliation and peacemaking made him beloved not only to Catholics but to people around the world. He died on June 3, 1963. He was beatified in 2000 by St. John Paul II, and canonized by Pope Francis in 2014. ©LPI

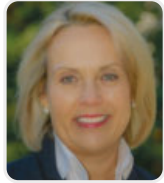
