Immaculate Conception

Question:

I've heard people call Jesus' conception by the Holy Spirit being "immaculately conceived." Is that what the Immaculate Conception is?

Answer:

While these two events are often confused, they are not the same thing. We celebrated the conception of Jesus on March 25th, the feast of the Annunciation. While that was surely miraculous, it isn't what we refer to as the "immaculate conception." The Immaculate Conception is Mary's conception, and we typically celebrate it on December 8th. If the 8th happens to be a Sunday, the Church moves the feast to December 9th. It is a holy day of obligation. Why does the Church consider it so important to celebrate?

Mary's conception is immaculate because she was conceived without original sin. The angel Gabriel acknowledges this when he hails Mary as "full of grace" (Luke 1:28). Scripture scholars identify several theological ideas that confirm this. In the Old Testament, the sacred, pristine Ark of the Covenant held the presence of God. The presence of God is now held within a new "arc" — the womb of Mary. Genesis 3 also prophesies of a woman who would oppose the devil and whose child would crush the devil's head. Christ is the "New Adam." This passage sets up Mary, then, as the "New Eve." Jesus and Mary are the beginnings of a new creation, one we all can participate in through the grace of our baptism. After all, God's love is more "original" than our sin! ©LPi

Gifts can be dropped off at the Collection boxes in the Church at Broad Avenue and Harrison Street entrances at the weekend masses through December 10th. They can also be dropped off at the Faith Formation Office at the Rectory (235 Harrison Street) during the week through December 8th.

Godparent [Sponsor] Requirements

Canon [Church] law states a godparent [sponsor] must:

- Be a Baptized and confirmed Roman Catholic who attends weekly Mass and receives Eucharist
- ♦ Be at least 16 years of age
- Not be one of the parents
- Lead a moral life in keeping with Church teaching, and be a good Catholic role model.
- ♦ If married, be married according to Church law
- Be a registered member of their own current parish from which they must obtain an eligibility certificate; we can only give eligibility certificates to those registered in our parish!

Since only one Roman Catholic godparent is required, a baptized member of another Christian church [but not a Roman Catholic] may serve as a Christian Witness. Since godparents renew their baptismal promises during the Rite of Baptism, a non-baptized person cannot serve in this role.

ADVENT

Advent is about hope, hope in the Lord. The virtue of hope is that undying confidence, that in spite of our success or failure in life, our sanctity or sinfulness, our virtues or unconquered vices, Emmanuel has not left us. Jesus still abides with us and within us. Advent assures us that God, who created everything out of nothing, and before whom we shall be responsible for what we "have done and have failed to do," will sustain us in life. Advent reminds us that God is our only anchor, our only hope.

When is the best time to get an annulment?

Although there is no "best" time for starting an annulment, it is important to know that the final annulment decree will not be issued until the divorce is finalized. You are free to begin the annulment proceedings at the same time as the divorce proceedings. Waiting to begin the annulment after obtaining the divorce may mean being revisited by painful memories and feelings. This may move you to not proceed with the annulment. It may prove wise to begin the annulment process at the same time as the divorce process
