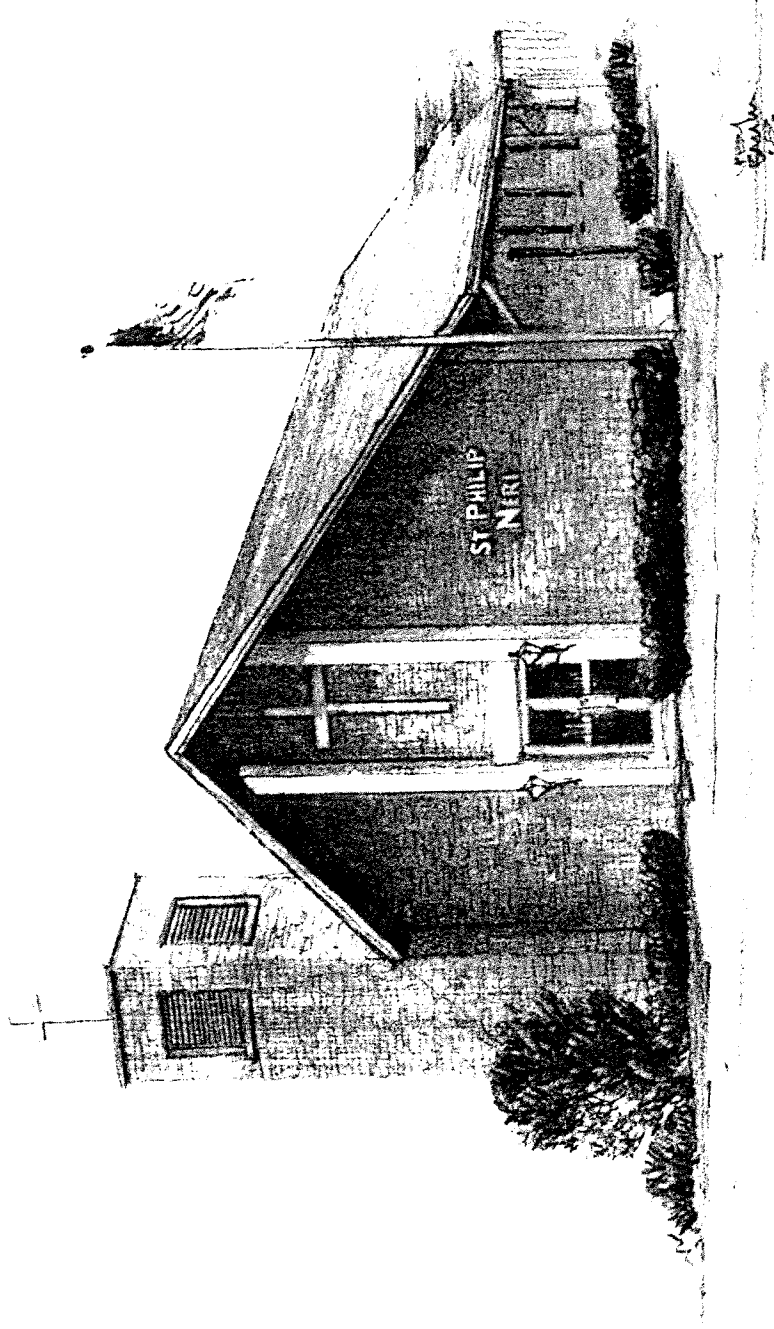

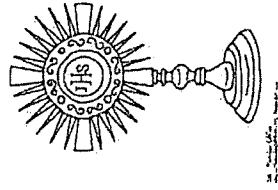

May God rebuke him we humbly pray, and thou O Prince of the Heavenly Hosts by the POWER OF GOD, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls.

Dear Friends,

I want to wish all of your families a blessed Thanksgiving. While we may not be able to celebrate with large gatherings this year, we still have much for which to be grateful, most especially the love of Jesus Christ in our lives. We will be offering Masses for Thanksgiving on Wednesday evening at Saint Philip Church at 6:00 p.m. and on Thursday mornings at Saint John Church at 8:10 a.m. Please come and give thanks for all of your blessings. If you are not able to be present physically, join us virtually.

This Sunday is the final Sunday of the Church's liturgical calendar. We conclude the year by celebrating the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Pope Pius XI instituted this solemnity in 1925. Put into context, this was a turbulent time in the world's history. Secularism was on the rise and dangerous dictatorships were emerging in Europe and beyond. Respect and reverence for Christ's authority was waning in the midst of the unrest during the first part of the 20th century. In response, this solemnity was established with the intent to reaffirm and refocus faith and respect for the kingship of Jesus. We need that more than ever today, as there are many things in this world attempting to distract us from Christ being our true King.

Pope Pius XI had this to say about the importance of the Solemnity of Christ the King: "If to Christ our Lord is given all power in heaven and on earth; if all men, purchased by his precious blood, are by a new right subjected to his dominion; if this power embraces all men, it must be clear that not one of our faculties is exempt from his empire. He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone. He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls, or to use the words of the Apostle Paul, as instruments of justice unto God." Those are some really good thoughts. Read that a few times!

This celebration should cause us to ask ourselves: Does Christ reign in our minds, our wills, our hearts, our bodies and our souls? Is He our true King? If so, then our lives should like His. We should be people of mercy, forgiveness, justice and peace.

It is appropriate that this final Sunday focus on the concept of Jesus as King, because the whole Church year is designed to make this happen in our lives. This is the goal of our Christian lives, for Jesus to reign in our lives. So, as we conclude this year and prepare for a new year, let us pray for the grace to make Jesus what He truly wants to be – our King.

Praised be Jesus Christ, now and forever.

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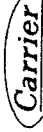

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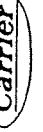
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
