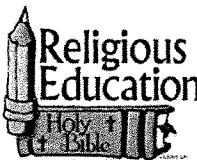

### “Showing up” for Prayer (and Praying Well)

I’ll never forget when a priest on the formation staff at St Meinrad told me the most important part of prayer: “the most important part of prayer is showing up.” Just to be there is the most important part. How true that is...more than any method, technique, approach, or strategy, if we don’t “show up” we don’t avail ourselves to the graces that God wants to give us!

At the same time, I think this axiom of prayer could be dangerous if it’s the only one we operate from. It has been for me at times. This most important part of “showing up” does not mean that we don’t also focus on praying well. When we show up for prayer—for example in Eucharistic adoration— we should feel good that we have shown up. But once we’ve shown up, we’re invited to dig in and strive to do the work of praying well. This work looks like listening. God speaks to us when we pray. True story. I recently learned a pattern for prayer that I found to be especially helpful to help me move from “good job to showing up” to “now do a good job of listening.” It goes like this:

- 1.) Mind of a Physician—What wound or brokenness am I carrying? Or...what needs healing in family/team/workplace/parish? Where does this wound stem from? Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal this to you!
- 2.) Mind of the Enemy—How is Satan trying to prevent me from having my wounds healed? Satan wants to exacerbate, attack, or amplify our wounds. He wants to destroy us. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal this to you!
- 3.) Mind of a General—How does God want to work...and work through you...to find healing/bring healing to others in spite of the enemy’s plans? How does God want you to outmaneuver Satan to encounter his grace, love, and mercy? Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal this to you!

It’s been fruitful for me, I hope it will be fruitful for you as well. The Holy Spirit has much to reveal to us. The Father does not leave us to traverse this battlefield alone.

Dear Friends,

The Church has declared October to be the month of the Holy Rosary. On October 7<sup>th</sup>, we celebrated the memorial of Mary, Queen of the Holy Rosary. Pope St. Pius V established this feast day on the anniversary of the victory at Lepanto, which took place on October 7, 1571. The Christians were going up against what seemed to be an impossible task, so the pope asked everyone to pray the Rosary. Miraculously, the Christian fleet won the victory against the enemy. The victory was attributed to the Virgin Mary whose intercession was invoked through the recitation of the Holy Rosary.

There is great power and peace in praying the Holy Rosary. Is this part of your devotional life? I know from talking to many people that the Rosary used to be part of daily family life. Many folks would pray the Rosary following dinner in the evening. Recently, a young family was telling me that they do this once a week. They ask each of their children to help lead one of the mysteries of the Rosary. The parents were amazed at how much the children enjoyed the prayer together. What a wonderful gift to a family!

I was researching a little about the devotion to the Holy Rosary and I found these great quotes:  
*Among all the devotions approved by the Church none has been so favored by so many miracles as the devotion of the Most Holy Rosary. Give me an army saying the Rosary and I will conquer the world.- Blessed Pope Pius IX*

*The Rosary is the 'weapon' for these times. -Saint Padre Pio*

*The Rosary is the most beautiful and the most rich in graces of all prayers; it is the prayer that touches most the Heart of the Mother of God...and if you wish peace to reign in your homes, recite the family Rosary. -Pope Saint Pius X*

May this month of October be a time for us to grow in our devotion to Mary, the Mother of our Lord, and our spiritual mother. Saint Bernard taught us in the Memorare to pray, *“Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help or sought thy intercession was left unaided.” This is what we believe. Mary is always interceding for us. She won’t leave us unaided!*
