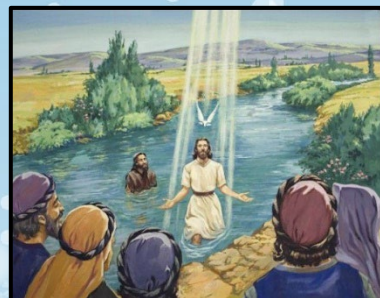

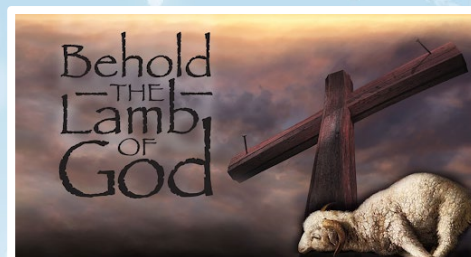
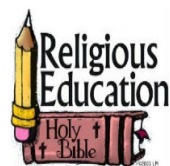

Return to Offering the Cup at Mass

In the next few weeks we will return to offering the Cup at Mass.

Receiving the consecrated wine along with the consecrated bread is a fuller sign of participation in the Eucharist.



However, it is the same Jesus present in both the consecrated bread and wine. It is not like 50% of Jesus is in the bread and 50% is in the wine. Jesus is present under the appearance of both bread and wine. If you receive only bread you do not receive "less Jesus". If you receive bread and wine you do not receive "more Jesus".

Every needs to make their own decisions about their health condition. Covid has not disappeared. It is still around in its variants. It is not as strong as it was a few years ago. But for some people it could have very serious effects. They should be more cautious.

Of course if one is feeling ill, "love of neighbor" should motivate one to not receive from the cup out of consideration of those behind you in the line.

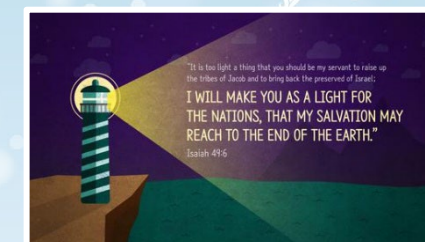

Reflection on the Baptism of the Lord

The Baptism of Jesus is a good time for us to reflect on our own baptisms when:

We were touched by the saving mystery of Jesus' **dying** and **rising**; we died to sin that we might live for Christ.

We became **children** of the Father, **temples** of the Spirit, & **followers** of Jesus the Son.

We became part of God's New Covenant Family: the **Church**.

We entered into the **State of Grace** and became heirs of heaven (*provided we remain in the State of Grace*). We received a share in the great work of Christ to build up his **Kingdom** until he returns.

We received a share in the **Priesthood** of Christ as his holy people, a share in the **Kingship** of Christ as people of his Kingdom, & a share in the **Prophetic** ministry of Christ as witnesses to God's Truth.

John said that Jesus came to baptize us with the Holy Spirit, which he did at our **Baptism** and **Confirmation**.

Jesus has poured out the Holy Spirit upon you!

- Do you obey the promptings and inspirations of the Holy Spirit?
- Do you strive for holiness in your life?
