Top 10 Pro -Life Quotes:

- 1. "It is a poverty that a "child must die", So that you may live as you wish." Mother Teresa
- 2. "The Gospel of Life is not for believers alone: it is for everyone. The issue of life and its defense and promotion is not a concern of the Christian alone. Although faith provides special light and strength, this question arises in every human conscience which seeks the truth and which cares about the future of humanity. Life certainly has a sacred and religious value, but in no way is that value a concern only of believers. The value at stake is one which every human being can grasp by the light of reason; thus it necessarily concerns everyone." Pope John Paul II
- 3. "I feel that the greatest destroyer of peace today is abortion, because it is a war against the child, a direct killing of the innocent child, murder by the mother herself. And if we accept that a mother can kill even her own child, how can we tell other people not to kill one another? ... For example, in Leviticus 25, there is a commandment to desist from working the fields during the seventh year.

This is not an extended vacation for me, but a period designated for rest and personal development/continuing education. I will be visiting family and friends in the Philippines for the month of February and when I come back in March, I will immediately start my program/studies in spirituality in Tucson, Arizona until May. I will be back in the parish in June. Please pray for me on my sabbatical as I would pray for all of you in my masses.

Talk to your children about the fine line between obedience and protection

Children learn from an early age that adults are figures of authority — teachers, police officers, bus drivers, babysitters. We need our children to listen to the people who are in charge of them, but this message must be communicated so that children know it's okay to stick up for themselves too. Adult predators may try to use their authority to gain control over their victims. Children should know that when it comes to private parts, secrets, and things that seem dangerous or wrong, they shouldn't worry about disobeying the adult in charge, and instead talk to a trusted adult or a parent. MSHS Phase II of Building Project Begins...



The Building Commission of the Archdiocese of L.A. has approved Mary Star of the Sea High School to continue Phase II of our new building project! We have completed our conceptual design. The new building will include a chapel, a large meeting room, six additional classrooms, six offices, a senior lunch area, and additional parking. Currently groundbreaking is slated to take place between 12 and 20 months from December 2018.

The budget for Phase II will be approximately \$9 million. Through the generosity of the Shea Foundation

(\$4 million) and the Dan Murphy Foundation and several individual gifts and pledges the school has approximately \$6 million funded toward this project. In addition to Phase II, we are proud to announce that over the past year we have begun the installation of the football/soccer field, which includes grading, irrigation, sod, and the installation of scoreboards for both the football/soccer and softball fields.
