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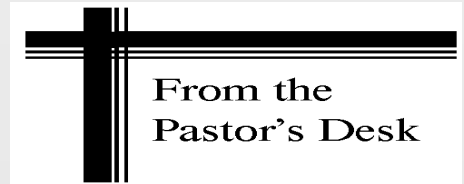

Game show and talk show host Regis Francis Xavier Philbin died July 25 at 88. Philbin was a Catholic, who attributed his success in show business to the lessons learned in Catholic schools. "I think it made a great difference. Solidified me....taught me an awful lot. Everything that I am right now I attribute to" Catholic education, Philbin said in a 2009 interview. What made a difference at Catholic schools, he told reporters in numerous interviews, was formation in virtue, and in faith.

Before joining the Navy, and eventually making his way to Hollywood, Philbin attended the University of Notre Dame, and before that the Catholic schools in the Bronx, where he grew up. Philbin was named in part for Jesuit missionary St. Francis Xavier. He got his first name for Regis High School in New York. He told the Wall Street Journal that "in the 1920s, my father was asked to leave Regis High School in Manhattan during his sophomore year. It was a Catholic school, and he had gotten into a fight with a priest or a brother. Years later, he was so sorry about what had happened that he and my mother named me Regis when I was born."

Philbin was an altar boy while attending his parish elementary school, and as a child had dreams of becoming a singer. He went to Notre Dame at his father's urging, after graduating from New York's Cardinal Hayes High School in 1949. After achieving success on television, Philbin became a regular benefactor to the Catholic schools in which he was educated, especially his high school. The host gave Cardinal Hayes High School \$500,000 for an auditorium renovation in 2000, and he supported students with scholarships to the school on an annual basis. Philbin also donated to Hayes his winnings from game shows: In 2012 he gave the school \$175,000 he won on "Are You Smarter than a Fifth-Grader" and in 2011 \$50,000 from an appearance on Celebrity Jeopardy. The school named its auditorium for Philbin in 2010. During a Mass and celebration honoring Philbin, New York's Cardinal Timothy Dolan called him "a man of faith, hope, and charity."

Philbin enjoyed a decades-long friendship with former Notre Dame football coach Lou Holtz, who was well-known for his deep Catholic faith. Philbin said that Holtz inspired him, and encouraged him to be a good role model for younger people. In an interview with the St. Anthony Messenger, Philbin said that he'd never felt hesitation to live his faith during his long career, even though, he said "there is a wide chasm between the media and religion, especially the Catholic religion I think, but that's just the way it is." Philbin added that despite his reputation for success, he'd encountered obstacles, losses, and failures. At a moment of challenge, he said "you've just got to do a little prayer and hope for the best. I think your religion strengthens you in that regard."

August 1-2: Understanding Relational Bullying

Relational bullying is unwarranted, persistent, unwelcome behavior in the form of criticism, isolation, or false allegations and rumors that damage the targeted person's relationships. Relational bullying includes social exclusion, gossip, and withholding friendship, and it can be devastating for children and teens. These behaviors are more subtle than traditional bullying, often happening out of sight or earshot of adults. But this bullying requires intervention and action. Talk to your children about these behaviors, especially if you notice them being left out of social activities and

While used commonly for appropriate real-life touch, in today's increasingly virtual use, PAN is a good benchmark for online interactions. Communications should be Public, Appropriate, and Non-sexual. 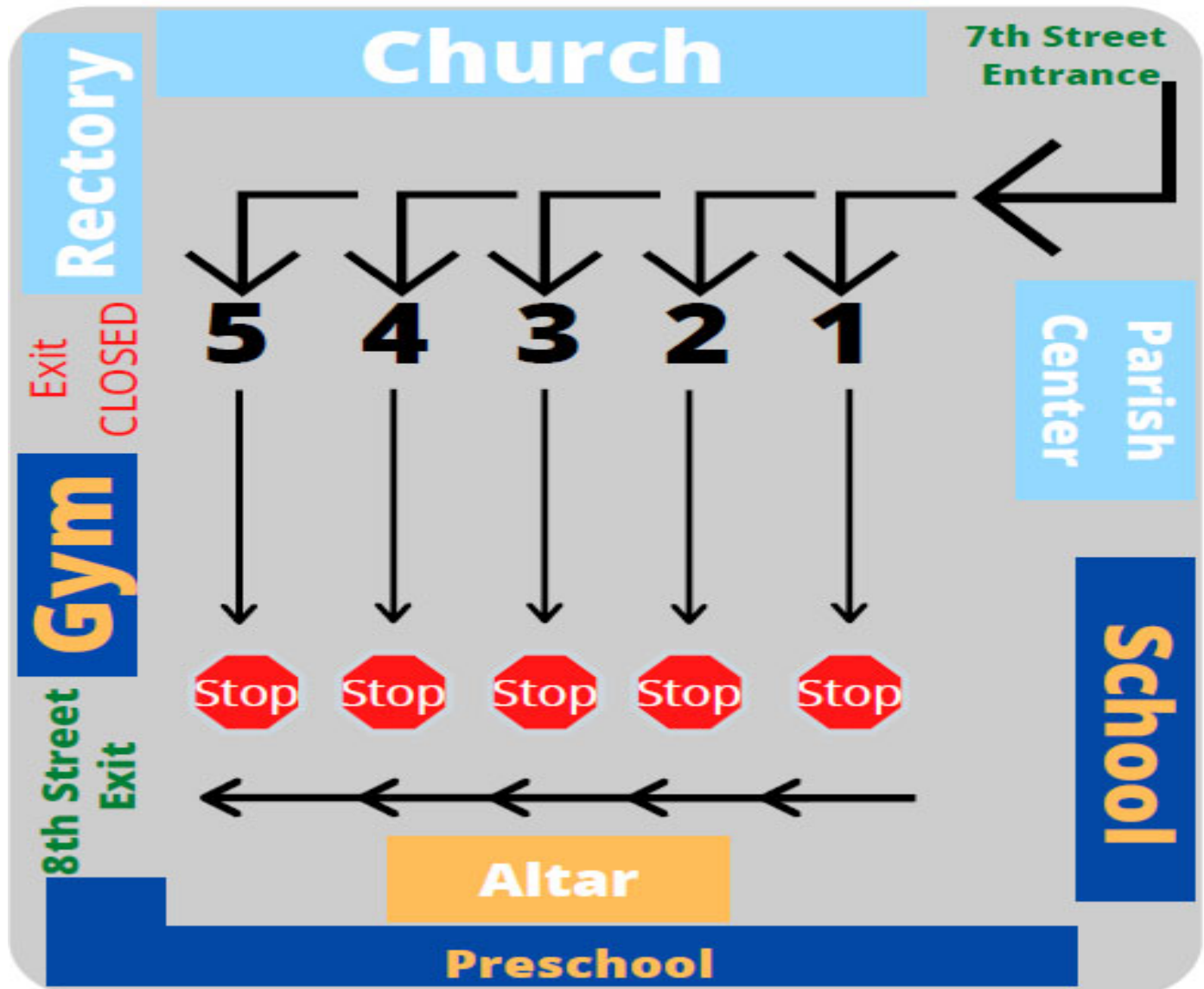

Outdoor Mass



Enter only from **7th Street**, choose one of five lines. Slowly drive all the way down to either the designated stopping point or within three feet of the vehicle in front of you. Place your vehicle in park, emergency brake engaged and turn engine off. **Outside seating** is available along the school breezeway.

During **Communion**, please exit your vehicle carefully and walk on the **right side** of your vehicle toward the altar, then return to your car. If you are seated in the breezeway, join line number 1 and then **return to your vehicle**, do not return to breezeway seating. **If you are unable to exit your vehicle for Communion, please have the driver put their left arm out the window and a Eucharistic Minister will come to you.**

When Mass has ended, please follow instructions from Ushers that will dismiss the lines of cars. **Exit toward 8th Street, right turn only.**

Why it is important to wear a mask?

Masks may help prevent people who have COVID-19 from spreading the virus to others. Wearing a mask will help protect people around you, including those at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19 and workers who frequently come into close contact with other people (e.g., in stores and restaurants).

Masks are most likely to reduce the spread of COVID-19 when they are widely used by people in public settings.

The spread of COVID-19 can be reduced when masks are used along with other preventive measures, including social distancing, frequent handwashing, and cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces.

What is social distancing?

Social distancing, also called "physical distancing," means keeping a safe space between yourself and other people who are not from your household.

To practice social or physical distancing, stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from other people who are not from your household in both indoor and outdoor spaces.

Social distancing should be practiced in combination with other everyday preventive actions to reduce the spread of COVID-19, including wearing masks, avoiding touching your face with unwashed hands, and frequently washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

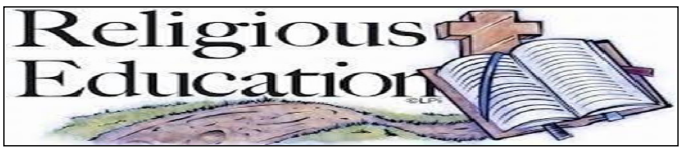

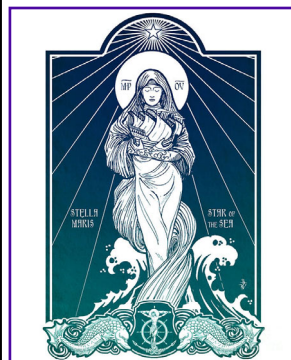

Mary Star of the Sea Elementary teachers and staff have continued to work hard all summer, preparing for both distance learning and being on campus. While it is our prayer to be back in classrooms at the start of the school year, due to the Governor's decision for all California schools to continue distance learning, we must return to our *Class2Cloud Online Education Program* when school begins August 24. When we do get clearance to return, our families will be offered 3 options: Return to Campus full day, Return to Campus for the morning and Class2Cloud in the afternoon, or continue fully in our Class2Cloud program. These options are given because we understand the variety of needs our families have and want to ensure that everyone comes back safely and confidently while continuing to receive a Catholic education regardless of their location.

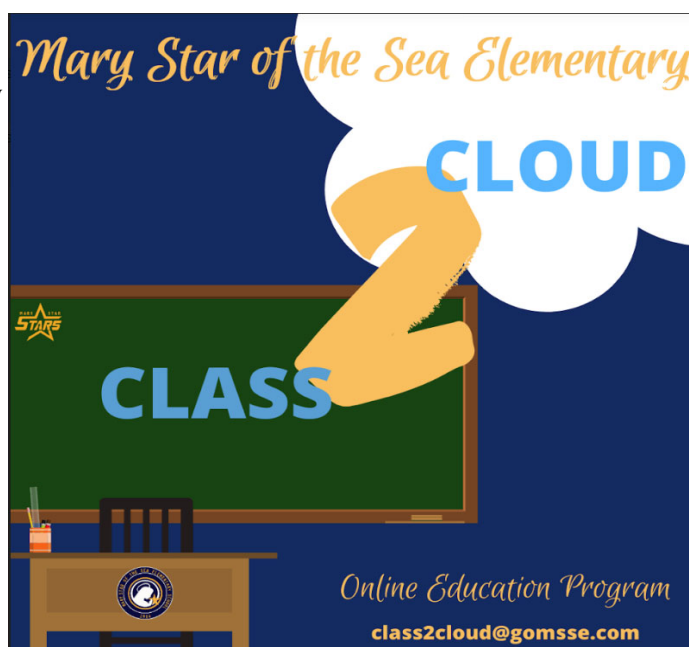
Our dedicated teachers have committed themselves to continuing to provide an education that delivers rigorous curriculum, engaging learning activities and holds high expectations for students, in order to help them achieve their academic goals. This year we will have a new Reading and Writing curriculum for grades K-5 and new Math for grades 3-5. Our distance learning is not like that of public schools in many ways, primarily in the time students spend learning with their teachers and classmates online. Classes are being taught throughout each school day by the teachers, students are working collaboratively online and assignments are being graded with the same critical eye they would receive in the classroom. Our school continues to strive, not only to give students the academic education they deserve, but also continue to build community, keep traditions, and bring the memorable parts of school to our students online.

We are always looking forward to growing our MSSE Family.
