Reflecting on Sunday's Readings

Introduction: The humanness of the disciples should bring us great consolation, while the magnanimity of Jesus should bring us great hope. The disciples were so human like us yet ended up so godly due to Christ's grace.

In this week's Gospel reading we are reminded that the path of discipleship is a process of growth, and not a plateau of godliness that is once and for all achieved. Rather than getting discouraged when our sinful humanity is revealed we must remind ourselves that we are a work in progress, and that as we are brought closer to the Light, defects are more easily seen. So often, consciousness of our sin is an indication that we are drawing closer to Christ. The disciples had been with Jesus for some time, in the very presence of the Son of God, yet James and John's, selfish desire for grandeur and position had not been eliminated from their lives. Nor were the sinful response of pride and resentment by the other ten disciples. They too were in the process of growth and hadn't "arrived," even though they were Jesus' twelve handpicked disciples.

Jesus' question to James and John shows his magnanimity as did his example of servanthood. "Can you drink this cup," Jesus asked. In their ignorance and perhaps arrogance they replied, "We are able." Rather than resent their ignorance and arrogance Jesus informs them that they would be included in his salvific process. Replying Jesus says, so to speak, when I am hanging there drinking the dregs of humanity's sins and redeeming all people with the fiery baptism of the cross, you will be there, represented by me. Jesus' great generosity and nobleness of spirit overlooked their foolishness and sin to include these still flawed disciples in his work of salvation.

For followers of Christ who also remain so flawed and foolish, Jesus gives hope in this account of his dealings with James and John. For his grace is not extended only to the non-existent deserving and perfect of this world,

but also, to all who are the flawed and foolish who choose to believe and trust in the cup of salvation that Jesus consumed on our behalf.

"Stumbling our way toward home, we worry to ourselves about the unworthiness of our love, only to discover that it has already been attended to. It was taken care of in that representative moment, that vicarious moment, in which he cried out, 'Father into your hands I commend my spirit,' and so saying he handed over to the Father all that he had assumed in the womb of Mary.

"...To fret about the quality of our love is to miss the point. Yes, we examine ourselves, confess our failing and pray for grace to offer the best. But it will never be good enough, unless with all its flaws it is handed over and taken up into his love for the Father." *

This is the hope of salvation; that we who are so human can be received and accepted by God. Isaiah prophesied of this amazing love and this saving transaction where, in exchange for the suffering of Jesus we would be made righteous. What hope is present in this prophesy; "he shall see the fruit of the travail of his soul and be satisfied"? Jesus satisfies God's demand of justice for us. "The righteous one, my servant, [shall] make many to be accounted righteous—and he shall bear their iniquities." What a glorious exchange. This is the hope of salvation upon which we must fasten our eyes and anchor our thoughts. For as we come to approach and love Jesus, the glorious Light of the World, our sins, and flaws will become even more apparent in his light. If we look inward for some reassuring hint of self-righteousness we will shrink back in fear. But if we focus on Jesus our high priest and the glorious exchange, he procured for us we will then be able to draw near to Christ's throne "with confidence," seeing only our Savior.

Reflexionemos Sobre las lecturas del domingo

Introducción: La humanidad de los discípulos debería brindarnos un gran consuelo, mientras que la magnanimidad de Jesús debería brindarnos una gran esperanza. Los discípulos eran tan humanos como nosotros. Sin embargo, por la gracia de Cristo, acabaron estando muy cerca de Dios.

En la lectura del Evangelio de esta semana se nos recuerda que el camino del discipulado es un proceso de crecimiento y no una especie de meseta de espiritualidad que se alcanza una sola una vez. En lugar de desanimarnos cuando se manifiesta nuestra humanidad pecaminosa, debemos recordar que somos una obra en curso y que, a medida que nos acercamos a la Luz, los defectos se ven más fácilmente. Muchas veces, tener conciencia de nuestro pecado es una indicación de que nos estamos acercando a Cristo. Aunque los discípulos habían estado con Jesús durante algún tiempo —en la propia presencia del Hijo de Dios— el deseo egoísta de alcanzar grandeza y posición no se había eliminado en la vida de Santiago y de Juan ni tampoco el sentimiento pecaminoso de orgullo y resentimiento que manifestaron los otros diez discípulos. Ellos también estaban en proceso de crecimiento y no habían “llegado”, aunque fueran los doce discípulos elegidos por Jesús.

La pregunta que Jesús les hizo a Santiago y Juan es muestra de su magnanimidad, así como de su ejemplo de servicio. “¿Podrán beber de este cáliz?”, les preguntó Jesús. Tal vez por su ignorancia o en un gesto de arrogancia ellos afirmaron: “Podemos”. En lugar de resentirse por motivo de su ignorancia y arrogancia, Jesús les informa que serán partícipes de su proceso salvífico. En respuesta —por así decirlo— Jesús les dice que cuando él esté colgado, bebiendo las heces de los pecados de la humanidad y redimiendo a todos los hombres con el bautismo de fuego de la cruz, ellos estarán allí, representados por él. Por su gran generosidad y nobleza de espíritu, Jesús pasó por alto la insensatez y el pecado de los discípulos, todavía defectuosos, al incluirlos en su obra de salvación.

Para aquellos seguidores de Cristo que también siguen siendo tan defectuosos y necios como Santiago y Juan, Jesús les da esperanza en este relato de su trato con ellos. Su gracia no se extiende sólo a los inexistentes

merecedores y perfectos de este mundo, sino también, a todos los defectuosos y necios que eligen creer y confiar en la copa de salvación que Jesús consumió en nuestro nombre.

“Cuando tratamos de encontrar nuestro camino y tropezamos, nos preocupamos por la indignidad de nuestro amor y por fin nos percatamos de que ya ha sido atendido. Fue atendido en ese momento representativo, en ese momento vicario, en el que Jesús gritó: ‘Padre, en tus manos encomiendo mi espíritu’, y así dijo que le entregaba al Padre todo lo que había asumido en el vientre de María.

“...Preocuparse por la calidad de nuestro amor es no entender la cuestión. Sí, nos examinamos a nosotros mismos, confesamos nuestros fallos y pedimos la gracia de ofrecer lo mejor. Pero nunca será lo suficientemente bueno, a menos que con todos sus defectos sea entregado y asumido en su amor por el Padre.”*

Esta es la esperanza de la salvación: que nosotros, aunque seamos tan humanos, podamos ser recibidos y aceptados por Dios. Isaías profetizó este amor sorprendente y esta transacción salvadora en la que, a cambio del sufrimiento de Jesús, seríamos hechos justos. ¿Qué esperanza está presente en la siguiente profecía: “por las fatigas de su alma, verá la luz y se saciará”? Jesús satisface la demanda de justicia de Dios para nosotros. “Con sus sufrimientos justificará mi siervo a muchos, cargando con las iniquidades de ellos.” ¡Qué intercambio tan glorioso! Esta es la esperanza de salvación en la que debemos fijar nuestros ojos y anclar nuestros pensamientos. Porque a medida que nos acercamos y amamos a Jesús —la gloriosa Luz del Mundo— nuestros pecados y defectos se harán aún más evidentes a su luz. Si miráramos hacia adentro buscando algún indicio tranquilizador de justicia propia, nos encogeríamos de miedo. Pero si nos centramos en Jesús —nuestro sumo sacerdote— y en el glorioso intercambio que nos procuró, podremos acercarnos al trono de Cristo “con confianza”, viendo sólo a nuestro Salvador.

REQUISITOS PARA EL BAUTIZO

1. El niño tiene que ser menos de 7 años para ser bautizado con los siguientes requisitos, si tiene 7 años o más puede ser bautizado a través del proceso de RCIA – llame a la parroquia
2. Llamar por lo menos tres meses antes de la fecha que piensan bautizar para registrarse.
3. Estar registrados como miembros de la parroquia, si no está registrado, por favor de registrarse.
4. Llenar una aplicación por cada niño, traerla el día de la clase junto el certificado de nacimiento del niño.
5. Asistir por los menos a 8 Misas durante los dos primeros meses antes de tomar la clase, y anotar la fecha y el comentario en el reverso de esta hoja, de lo que se habló en misa o del Evangelio.
6. Tomar la una clase Pre-Bautismal. **Favor de no traer niños a la clase.**
7. Los padrinos que pertenecen a esta parroquia deberán llevar el mismo proceso. Si los Padrinos pertenecen a otra parroquia deberán presentar un documento que certifique que han recibido clases pre-bautismales, si están casados, deben de presentar comprobante de matrimonio por la Iglesia, y si son solteros deben de ser mayores

de 16 años y Católicos practicantes.

8. Pueden recoger las aplicaciones en la entrada de la iglesia y traerlas llenas junto con el certificado de nacimiento de su hijo(a).

Sacred Heart School is so lucky to have such wonderful teachers and staff. Our wonderful **Art, Music and PE teacher**, Ms. Alissa Larson, is not only a wonderful teacher, but is incredibly talented in the arts as well. She has been in musical theater most of her life and studied in NYC at the Institute for American Musical Theater. Ms. Alissa is what's known as a "triple threat" in the theater. She can sing, dance and act. Well, it turns out that Ms. Alissa is actually a quadruple threat. She is an amazing artist! She

has been working on a 6 ft. by 4 ft. mural at her house for the past four months. She is using acrylic on plywood. She calls this mural a "fantasy land". She works on her mural every day and says she's not done yet... Way to go, Ms. Alissa!



Jesus Alvarez is our wonderful custodian. This man does everything and is beloved by everyone. He has worked at Sacred Heart School for over 20 years. Jesus has 4 other children. His oldest, Jasmine, is a teacher, his son Glen is a nurse, his daughter Emily is a nurse, and his daughter Rosie is a teacher. All 5 of his kids are SHCS graduates! Fall has come to Pre-K! Mrs. Lloyd made Fall/Halloween playdough and dyed rice for our rice table. We'll be learning to write the letter "Bb" and identifying it in different words. This week, it's "All About Me" We'll make My "Me" Book, an (almost) self-portrait sized pictures of ourselves, and The Long and Short of Me- comparing lengths.



In Mrs. Wright's 4th grade math class, the students are learning place value and starting to learn about rounding. The fifth graders are learning about volume with formulas. Did you know that the formula for volume is $V=L \times W \times H$? In social studies, they are studying the earthtime lines and geography. They are going to be making "salt maps" which are **3D maps of landforms**. Sounds like a great project!
