
## OUR LADY OF MT. CARMEL FEAST DAY JULY 16

#### PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM 2017-2018 REGISTRATION

Registration is open for K-6<sup>th</sup> grade PREP classes next fall; forms are available from the PREP office or on the website at www.stmax.org/PREP. 1<sup>st</sup> grade is required preparation for the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist.

VISITING MISSIONARY FROM THE MISSION DIOCESE OF PATHANAMTHITTA-KERALA, INDIA

The Diocese of Panthanamthitta is just 7

years old, sharing the Gospel of Our Lord to the 45,000 faithful as living in the county. Their primary goal is reviving and consolidating the spiritual renewal through prayer groups formed for men, women and youth. There are 100 mission churches that give special emphasis to forming basic Christian communities.

At present, there are 108 priests, including those who are retired and those studying abroad. There are only 60 priests in active ministry, but there are 57 seminarians studying at various locations. The Diocese does not have a dependable source of income to provide for the salary of the priests, missionaries, catechists as well as meeting the basic needs of the seminarians such as food, medical insurance, study materials, tuition, etc.

They give great priority to serving the poorest of the poor, especially through self-help groups of women helping them strengthen cultural and social situations to help eradicate poverty. There is also assistance for organic farming, raising poultry and goats as well as growing trees for environmental protection. They also provide care for those with special needs such as autism, dyslexia, physical and mental challenges, as well as senior citizen women who, without children, are most desperate. They also provide food baskets, medicine and clothing through the St. Vincent DePaul Society.

The Bishop from the Diocese will be visiting St. Max the weekend of July 29-30. Please prayerfully consider a generous offering to help them continue the work they have started.


