

**LIFTING OF THE DISPENSATION FROM HOLY MASS**

The dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Day Mass obligation has been lifted beginning last weekend, Saturday, June 26, 2021, and Sunday, June 27, 2021, as recently announced by Cardinal Gregory and the Bishops of the Province of Baltimore. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus, another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. **NEW GUIDELINES FOR ATTENDING MASS**

As of May 28th, many of the COVID-19 restrictions formerly put in the place by the county had been lifted. This also means that changes to some of the practices we have followed at church in the past year has also been updated. Below is a summary of said changes. ◆ **Hand Sanitizers**

will remain available at all entrances to church as well as the baptismal font.

◆ **Masks**

Fully vaccinated individuals will not be required to wear masks for Mass. It is recommended that non-vaccinated individuals continue to wear masks. Priests and Extraordinary (Eucharistic) Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their hands and wear masks when distributing Holy Communion.

◆ **Seating**

Two sections of pews will continue to have the ribbons on every other row to maintain the 6-foot distancing that has been practiced in the past year. All other pews will be available for seating with the recommendation that members of different households maintain a 3-foot distance.

◆ **Holy Water**

The baptismal font will be filled with blessed water again and a sanitizer dispenser will be available at the font.

◆ **Holy Communion**

Hosts will be distributed but the distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended until further notice.

**FOOD DRIVE REPORT**

The St. Martin's Cloak Guild reports of a fruitful food drive that was held on Saturday, June 26th at our St. Jane de Chantal parish grounds. A total of 1,643.2 lbs. of food were collected from 65 vehicles between 9:30 am - 12:00 pm, along with \$375 worth of grocery gift cards, and \$165 in monetary donations. The food collected was allocated as follows: 406 lbs. to Sacred Heart Church; 580.5 lbs. to Bethesda Help; and 656.7 lbs. to Catholic Charities. On behalf of our pastor, Fr. Samuel Giese, the St. Martin's Cloak Guild, and our food collection recipients (Sacred Heart Parish, Bethesda Help and Catholic Charities), we would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude and appreciation for all those who donated, and to all who have volunteered their time in service for those who are most in need in our communities. 

### PROJECT UPDATES

#### CHILDREN:

Storm Water Management Concept and Forest Conservation Exceptions have been submitted to Montgomery County and are presently under review. This is the first phase of a 2 phase permitting process, the second phase consisting of full submission of all engineering designs, which are in preparation. It is anticipated that final permits will be issued in late 2021/early 2022 with a commencement of construction in early spring of 2022!

#### CHURCH:

Legacy Gifts for 8 Stained Glass Windows have been received. The Guardian Angel Window for the Family Room has been mounted and is approximately 50% complete, with an anticipated installation by the end of 2021.

#### COMMUNITY:

After a Year of COVID restriction, the parish choirs are being reorganized and preliminary plans have been completed for the construction of the Choir Room and renovation of the kitchen and Caulfield Hall.
