

READING I: Ex 16:2-4, 12-15

God provides bread and meat for the grumbling Israelites so that they will not return to the "fleshpots" of Egypt but will fulfill the divine plan.

The first part of John's commentary on the feeding of the five thousand: Jesus invites the people to "look beyond the bread you eat" and see the divine action and the arrival of the kingdom of God. Jesus identifies himself as the bread of life.


