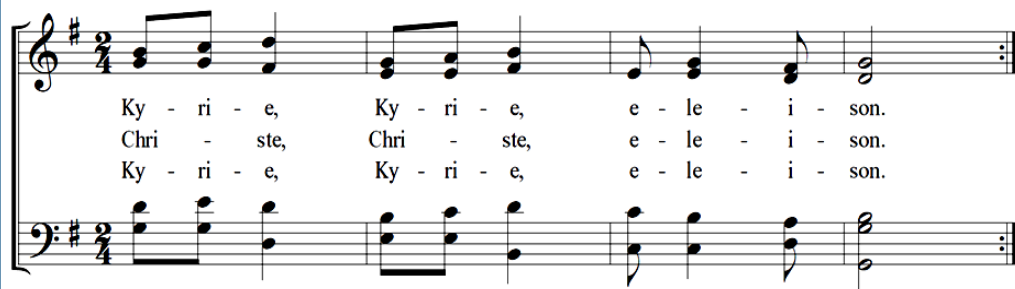

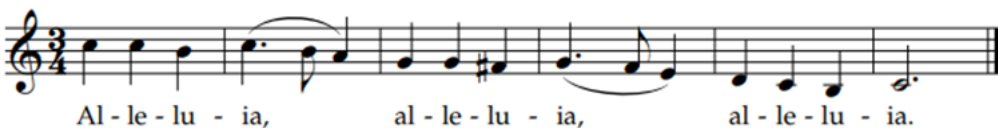

TUITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2022-23

The deadline for new families to apply for the 2022 – 2023 school year is Friday, February 18. The Archdiocesan Tuition Assistance Program is available for students in grades PreK-12 who are applying to or currently enrolled in Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Washington. All tuition assistance obtained through the Archdiocese is based on demonstrated financial need. Financial need must be demonstrated each year to qualify. Families apply each year to receive tuition assistance. Applying for tuition assistance has no bearing on whether a student is admitted to a school. Applications are available each year beginning in October and are due in December for tuition assistance for the following school year. TADS financial aid and assessment manages the process on behalf of Archdiocese of Washington Catholic schools. Please note that you only need to complete one form for all children in a family, whether elementary school students or high school students, even if seeking tuition assistance for children attending different schools. collection basket. When a check is mailed, the IRS considers the U.S. Mail postmark to be the delivery date [see IRS Publication 526 and U.S. Treasury Regulation 1-170A-1(b)]. Contributions for the 2021 calendar year must have a U.S. Mail postmark dated no later than December 31, 2021. The date on the check has no consequence. For example, if we receive a check dated December 31, 2021 with a U.S. Mail postmark of January 2, 2022, the contribution will be credited to the 2022 calendar year. Contributions by credit card or bank debit through Faith Direct are deductible in the year you make the charge. Contributions by stock delivered electronically through a financial services firm are considered to be made when the stock is delivered to our broker.

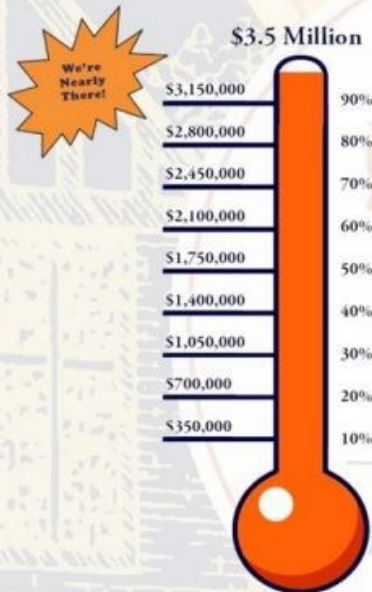

PROJECT UPDATES

CHILDREN:

The Storm Water Management Concept and Forest Conservation Exceptions have been approved by Montgomery County. This is the first phase of a 2 phase permitting process, the second phase consisting of submitting Sediment Control/Stormwater and Building permits with engineering designs, which is happening the week of November 8. It is anticipated that final permits will be issued in late 2021/early 2022 with a commencement of construction in early spring of 2022!

CHURCH:

Legacy Gifts for 8 Stained Glass Windows have been received. The Guardian Angel Window for the Family Room has been completed. The dedication of The Guardian Window took place on the weekend of November 14, 2021.

COMMUNITY:
