

ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERN: ECOLOGICAL EDUCATION

We continue our reflections on the implementation of Laudato Si this week as we review the fifth goal, Ecological Education. The purpose of this learning is a mindful integration across the theology of creation, life and human dignity, and our role in fostering the common good. As stewards of God's creation, we are called to care for creation in loving and sustainable ways. St. Francis of Assisi and St. Hildegard of Bingen are known for their devotion to creation and seeing God's sanctity

in all of creation. They offered a contemplative and sacramental view of creation and lived lives imbued with the virtues of temperance and prudence. Laudato Si guides us that these virtues are needed today as we work for environmental efforts that preserve God's creation. Our young parishioners have come to us for guidance in the matter of integral ecology. As a parish community, we must work with them to honor God's creation. In an effort to create awareness and action, we ask you to consider your role in exploring implications for the parish and our parish school:

1. Watch the video message from Cardinal Gregory, who invites us to join in exercising stewardship over God's creation and take this opportunity to read the ADW's Laudato Si' Action Plan to gain greater understanding of the 7 markers. <https://adw.org/living-the-faith/social-concerns/laudato-si-action-plan>.
