### THANK YOU FROM THE ST. MARTIN'S CLOAK GUILD

We are eternally grateful for the support of the parish, and members of our community as we achieve our mission of providing financial and other assistance to those in need. Here are some of the things we've accomplished over the past 12 months:

- ♦ Helped a family from Kenya who is at the Children's Inn at NIH as the daughter is recovering from a life-saving bone marrow transplant. We provided funds so that they could buy winter coats in December, food from the food drive, and funds for summer clothes in April.
- ♦ Paid for summer camp for two school aged boys of a single mother, so that she can continue to work throughout the summer.

- ♦ Provided grocery gift cards to numerous people who have called the parish office in search of help with money from groceries.
- ♦ Paid past due utility bills for people who have fallen behind due to health or other circumstances.
- ♦ Executed quarterly Food Drives to benefit Bethesda Help, Catholic Charities, the McKenna Center and Sacred Heart parish. Our Lenten Drive collected over 1,500 lbs. of food, \$495 in grocery gift cards and \$470 in checks and cash.
- ♦ Delivered approximately 150 boxes of cereal to an apartment building providing permanent shelter to families and singles who were previously homeless through the Montgomery County Coalition for the Homeless.
- ♦ Helped a client move from their current locations to more appropriate housing.
- ♦ Paid for home furnishing for someone in need.
- ♦ Provided information on resources for organizations in the area.
- ♦ Provided frozen turkeys to several families for Thanksgiving.

As the needs in our community are growing, we are working hard to meet those needs and provide assistance and resources. We very are grateful for the support of the parish as we continue with our mission.
