READING I: Is 6:1-2A, 3-8


"The year that king Uzziah

### **PSALM RESPONSE: Ps 138**

This expression of thanks for a particular favor will be proclaimed before all creation: the angels and those assembled in the temple. The first Hebrew term, translated as "faithfulness" is often rendered as "steadfast love". God's commitment is unswerving and enduring. One can see why the two terms occur here as a pair: to emphasize the utter reliability of God as one who answers prayer.

READING II: 1 COR 15:1-11
Having taught the Corinthians that they should live in unity, despite their diversity, Paul now summarizes his teaching about Jesus. He also mentions his own call to ministry, often referred to as his conversion.
